



But even more courageous and persistent has been the dogged determination of the Chinese to stand up under everything the Japs could offer. offer,

Until Pearl Harbor, until the battles of Malaya and Luzon had been fought, we in this country had the idea the Japanese were weak and ipeffectual because they could not conquer the Chinese after more than four years of fighting. Now we have a better appreciation of Japanese fighting qualities, as well as of Chinese resistance which despite little or no equipment has nevertheless prevailed.
