

### Cardinals Storm To Victory; Now Hold 3-1 Game Lead Over Yankees In World Series

YANKEE STADIUM, New York, Oct. 5, (AP)—The raging Redbirds from St. Louis stormed to victory over the once proud New York Yankees again Sunday, 3 to 0, in the wildest and most furious installment of the world series and thereby made it possible for the Cardinals to clinch the championship today.

It was a stupendous struggle between speed and power for the greatest crowd in world series history, 69,902, and for the third straight game speed was supreme. The Redbirds ran and got the Yankees rally highlighted by deficit of three games to one. The pitching of both teams fell to pieces and the Cardinals, after apparently taking complete charge

of the contest with a six-run uprising in the fourth frame, were tied in the sixth by a five-run Yankee rally highlighted by Charley (King Kong) Keller's second homer of the series with two aboard.

But the Cardinals impressed the huge crowd, 779 more than Saturday's record turnout, with their will to win as they clawed back to capture this game just as they had battled to triumph last Thursday when another mighty home run by Keller temporarily tied the score of the second game.

What proved to be the deciding inning and were partly a gift by the untried Yanks and partly the result of the Cards' ability to take advantage of every opening.

Atley Donald, who had been summoned to relieve rookie Hank Borowy with none out in the fourth, four runs already across and two on base, made himself the victim today. He gave two successive walks at the start of the seventh.

The first was to Enos (Country) Slaughter and the second to Stan Musial. With the count on Musial 3 and 2, Slaughter set sail for second and Catcher Bill Dickey, not knowing whether the next pitch was a ball or strike, made a wild throw to second that allowed Slaughter to go on to third.

Walker Cooper singled him home sending Donald to the showers and bringing Ernie Bonham in. Johnny Hopp sacrificed, Whitey Kurrusky was walked intentionally to load the bases, and a long fly by Martin Marion brought Cooper home.

### Celery Feds Lose To Winter Garden Friday Night, 7-0

Pared by Ty Youngblood, fast stepping Winter Garden left half-back, the Red Devils slipped over a touchdown early in the first period of the game here Friday night and downed a desperately fighting squad of Sanford-Celery 7 to 0.

A forty yard gain was made by Youngblood, who ran back a punt and then, following alternate short gains by Youngblood, Fox Coell Clark, fullback, Dave Tubbs plunged six yards over for a score. Gerald Crawford kicked for the extra point.

In the second quarter the Celery Feds began to threaten when Bill Fleming ripped hole in the Winter Garden line with an 18 yard gain, followed shortly after by a 10 yard plunge, and alternate short gains by Wolff. The half, however, ended without a score.

Again in the third quarter it was Fleming who ripped off a gain of 20 yards around right end again the loyal Seminole High School fans rose cheering as Wolff threatened to get loose around left end. However, the Red Devils then made a firm stand and Celery Fed hopes again faded, flaring up briefly when quarterback Warren Daniels intercepted a Winter Garden pass.

It looked like another possible score for Winter Garden when in the fourth quarter Eugene Jankiewicz kicked a nifty 50 yard punt too close to the Sanford goal line for comfort. However, Bill Fleming again rose to the occasion, and reeled off a gain of 11 yards, followed by a 13 yard dash, and followed with another 13 yard plunge through the worried Red Devils. Then came late in the game when a pass by Ray Fox met nothing but empty space and the ball rolled 48 yards backward before Sanford recovered. That broke the spell, and nothing of further importance occurred during the night end by Johns of Winter Garden.

single by relief pitcher lefty Max Lanier, who was awarded credit for the victory by the official scorers.

Mort Cooper, the big, grinning right-hander who had won 21 games this season for the National league, but who was the loser in the opening game of the series made an attempt to salvage his reputation Sunday. Instead he had it marred down even more.

He was thrown for a one-run loss in the first inning when Red Rolfe doubled and Roy Cullenbine singled, but he seemed capable of holding the 0 to 1 lead furnished him in Cooper fourth when the Cardinals came to bat 11 times with the first six of them scoring.

This explosion was set off by Musial, who led off with safe but that incited the Yankees to an angry protest around Umpire George Magerkuth. Walker Cooper followed with another single that staked between Borowy's legs and Hopp watted out a walk to load the bases.

After that things happened fast and loose. Kurovski smashed a ground single through Rolfe for two runs and the blond sliver-rookie on the mound yielded to pressure. Mopping his brow, he walked Marion on four pitches to load the bases and Mort Cooper brought in another pair of runs with a single to right.

Donald made his appearance at this point and forced Jimmy Brown to fly out. But Terry Moore smashed a single to center on the first pitch for run and after Slaughter had forced Moore, Musial on his second turn at bat doubled the sixth run across. By making two hits in one inning he tied a world series record held by several players. Walker Cooper finally grounded out to end the inning.

There probably was no one in the big, closely-packed stadium who thought Cooper would have any real trouble after that and he set down the Yanks in order in the next two chapters.

But little Phil Rizzuto, who made three hits during the proceedings, opened the sixth stanza with a slashing single to left. Rolfe walked, but Cooper was allowed to remain until Cullenbine singled. Rizzuto home, DiMaggio popped out and Keller hammered his high, arching homer into the lower right-field stands.

This caused Manager Billy Southworth to bring in Harry Gumbert, who appeared as reliever in the first game of the series.

Kurovski made a wild throw on a grounder by Joe Gordon and after Dickey had been thrown out on a fine play by Brown, Garza Priddy looped a double into right field for the tying run. Lefty Howie Pollet, who replaced Gumbert made Donald ground out.

Since the Cardinals came back snorting with two runs in the next inning, under ordinary baseball procedure Pollet would have received credit for the triumph by pitching to only one man, because he was removed for a pinchhitter, unsuccessfully, before the Yanks came to bat again.

But Lanier took charge from the seventh on, holding the Yanks helpless on two singles, and hit in St. Louis' final run so the score decided he should have credit for the outcome.

Both pilots came up to what may be the final game here tomorrow with pitching choices. Manager Joe McCarthy of the Yanks said he would start Red Ruffing, the 28-year-old veteran. Southworth gave the assignment for what he hopes will be the clincher to Jean Johnny Beasley, the rookie right-hander who won the second game.

If the Yankees should win tomorrow, the rivalry would leave tomorrow night for St. Louis where the sixth game would be played on Wednesday and the seventh, if necessary, on Friday.

## Three Nazi Divisions Held Off By Stalingrad Defenders In City Workers' Settlement

### Russians Say German Attacks Are Led By Swarms Of Dive Bombers And Tanks

MOSCOW, Oct. 6. (AP)—Stalingrad's defenders held today against three Nazi divisions in a battle for a workers' settlement and the Reds continued to stab at the German left flank. Swarms of dive bombers and 100 tanks headed the Nazi attacks trying to force the salient.

German prisoners reported that there is further delay. German losses in the last 24 hours were huge, the Reds said, and Nazi soldiers are demoralized. Several German batteries and 80 trucks loaded with troops were blown to pieces by Russian artillery and mortar in the day's fighting around the city. The Russian offensive in the Nikolayev sector, 25 miles north-west of Stalingrad, continued to make headway, the midnight communiqué reported, and another 277 Germans and seven tanks were destroyed there, while Soviet positions were "improved."

Newspapers in the terrific fight around Stalingrad were the Germans conceded any gains to the northwest suburbs had been reported in the Soviet Monday noon communiqué, but first dispatches said the city's defenders, responding to a warning that the fate of all modern Russia might be in their hands, were retreating more fiercely than ever. Twelve assaults by a Nazi sapper army estimated at 500,000 men were beaten back in one day (presumably Sunday), reports from the front revealed.

### Supreme Court Puts Off Nazi Saboteur Trial

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6. (AP)—With the chair of former Justice Byrne, a black leather coat, the Supreme Court opened a new term Monday but deferred at least until next Monday its eagerly awaited opinion in the case of the U-boat Nazi saboteur.

The remaining eight justices, in uniformly good health after the long summer recess, were late in including Justice Murphy, who served as a lieutenant-colonel with the Army during the summer. For that reason Murphy disqualifies himself in the case of the saboteur, who were tried by fellow Army officers.

The court denied the Nazis' petition for a writ of habeas corpus at a special term during the summer. They then were convicted by a military commission and six were electrocuted. The court's opinion may constitute a clarification of the President's war-time powers in view of the issues raised by the defense counsel.

Chief Justice Stone officially announced Byrne's resignation at the opening of the court, wishing him, on behalf of himself and the other justices, "all success in his new and arduous undertaking" as a special term during the summer. This broadcast from Scandinavia reaching the Swiss press yesterday said rumors that a proclamation creating a "great Germany" to include Holland, Denmark and Norway, is to be supported soon were circulating in Scandinavia, chiefly in German circles.

It was stressed that such reports were merely "the category of rumors" and were being heard most persistently in Norway. Stockholm dispatches said that informed opinion in Sweden was that the reports "must not be given too much weight," but it was recalled that Adolf Hitler in his latest speech declared no sovereign state would survive the war.

The reports, it was believed here, may account for the feeling of unrest which Scandinavian dispatches say now exist in Denmark.



### American Soldiers Pride Themselves As Good Marksmen

CAMP LEE, Va., Oct. 6. (WW)—The American soldier prides himself on being the finest rifle marksman in the world, and his careful training has paid dividends on the world's battlefield ever since Bunker Hill.

New America needs riflemen again. Lieutenant Jerome Roth and Sergeant James Monteperto of Camp Lee's 81st Quartermaster Training Regiment agreed something was also needed to supply quickly the training Americans hadn't received in two decades of peace.

They went to work and produced this whizbang. It's an ingenious device which simply and accurately tests a soldier's sighting, aiming and trigger squeeze, the all-important basis of marksmanship.

The soldier sights along his rifle until the sights are properly aligned with the far target. The instructor then adjusts the small movable target, mounted on the base-board, until the small pointer is perfectly aligned with the bull's-eye on the target.

The instructor then throws the gun off the target and orders the soldier to put the gun "on the target" again. The pointer instantly indicates whether the soldier is sighting perfectly — and the kind of errors he makes.

### Blandish Men Are "Tandem" Dancers

CAMP BLANDING, Oct. 6. (Social)—Tandem dancing has solved the problem of too few girls for too many soldiers at Camp Blanding's Service Club dances.

Ingenuous soldiers devised the method whereby one girl dances with at least six men in the course of a jitterbug number, something possible because all jitterbugs know essentially the same steps whether they come from the north, south, east or west.






