

Frail-Appearing Medical Officer Is On His Job

 EDMONTON, Alberta, Mar. 3—A frail medical officer along the Alcan Highway went to his commanding officer's aid. "Unless these men get some fresh meat in one week I am going to make a personal report to the surgeon-general."

The meat came through. Many men in the 30th and 40th Divs I visited, in hitch-hiking 1,000 miles on the new road, have somehow got the idea that they are "dependable" that they are to be liquidated for the sake of the road.

I had ample opportunity to talk with officers of the Northwest Service Command at Whitehorse. I could see that this was not true. They want the men to be comfortable and they want them to have fun.

But this job is a whole of an operation, and you can't do anything at once. Yet some of the men, feeling the onslaught of

the long, northern winter, get pretty bitter.

Contractors for the Public Roads Administration, who have to keep their men on a voluntary basis, manage to get through everything they want.

One of the most lavish and one of the most frugal meals I have had in my life were taken within 20 miles on the Alcan road. The first was taken at a contractor's camp, the second at the Army's.

Mr. W. Jones, who is under contract for a number of Army jobs, said the chief worry of his Seattle office, next to getting and keeping men, was buying food. But they seem to know how. At two of his general mess tables where I dined there was soup, unlimited servings of one or more meats, three or more vegetables, two kinds of dessert, a multitude of condiments and sauces, and as much coffee as you could drink.

Up here, the mere appearance of a civilian is an invitation to dinner, and seldom is a charge made.

At many of the less developed camps, you have to stand in line with a messkit in 30 below weather waiting for a split hand-out. If you try to get back to your tent with your food it practically freezes. You soon learn to

duck into some spare tent, where there's a seat, or if you must have it hot you just stand on the spot and eat it with your fingers.

One phenomenon of the food is the exceptionally good bread. Army bakers make it and put it out, immediately. The in-steady freezing preserves its fresh qualities, and when thawed it's just like "mother's bread."

Lapse of vitamin pills supplies. Also, for emergencies, each camp has small cans called Ration A and Ration B. One is corned beef, hash and the other largely sugar and chocolate concentrates. I sampled them and they are not unpalatable.

Whether food is served with a little flourish or just thrown at you depends on the individual company officer. I have seen the tents of two officers which were as far apart in livability as the worst slum of New York and a room in the best hotel.

On the shore of Lake Munchie I had business with a lieutenant who was doing his road work doggedly and well, but whose tent was several degrees below a car's thermometer below the cave man lived.

Rangers Play Big Part In Keeping Tunisian Stands

WITH AMERICAN RANGERS ON THE CENTRAL TUNISIAN FRONT, Feb. 27 (Delayed) (AP)—American Rangers played an important role in the battle to keep the Germans off the key mountain ridges guarding the road leading from Tunis to the Allied base at Tebessa, Algeria.

Thrown into a defensive position, the Rangers crouched in mountain-side foxholes by day as shells landed around them and snaked out on the plain at night to spy on the enemy and wreck concealed defenses.

Concealed on the slope, the Rangers kept the Germans guessing about their defenses. One morning an Italian staff car drove within short range of their hidden 37-mm. guns. The Rangers drilled a hole through the car, killing a major, two lieutenants and the driver. A brown puppy was in the car but escaped harm. The dog is now attached to the Rangers kitchen truck.

Other Italian cars and trucks came along later and met the same fate, some of their occupants falling prisoners to the Rangers. The captured Italians said they had been told Tebessa was in the Axis hands and were en route to visit friends there.

A single British night raid of 1,000 bombers over the Rhineland costs close to 14 million dollars, the largest single item being the cost of the planes lost.

Manufacture of New Patterns of Wood Furniture to Cease

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23, (AP)—The War Production Board today prohibited the manufacture of new patterns of wood furniture beginning March 15 and ordered a two-thirds reduction in the number of existing patterns on July 1.

The same order imposed limitations on the use of iron and steel for manufacture of wood furniture, and WPB estimated this would result in an annual saving of about 22,000 tons of those materials.

Beginning July 1, the order limits manufacturers of wood furniture to 35 percent of the patterns offered during September 1941 or 24 patterns, whichever ever is greater.

The metal restrictions permit the use of iron and steel only for certain essential parts, principally joining hardware. These restrictions become effective immediately, and during the period ending June 30 amount to a reduction of approximately 30 percent compared with use in 1941. During subsequent quarters, total cost value of these materials must not exceed 12 1/2 percent of the 1941 total cost value.
