Why We Want J. M. CHAFFER For Justice Of Peace

As there appears to be a question in the mind of the voters in regard to the Justice of the Peace District in what is now District No. 4 and we have been asked to explain the situation, we take this opportunity to place the situation as it stands today before those who do not understand it.

Justice of the Peace District No. 4 as it was established comprised Commissioners District No. 3 and included the Southwestern portion of Seminole county, including therein the precincts Lake Mary, Longwood, Altamonte Springs and the recently established precinct of Forest City.

At the regular July meeting of the County Commissioners 27, Justice of the Peace District No. 1 comprising Sanford and vicinity was abolished and the same was attached and is now included in Justice of the Peace District No. 4.

The citizens of the original District No. 4 realize that they are justly entitled to this office for the reason of convenience and its influence in this section and cannot see why they should be deprived of it, as they would be in the event that one of the four candidates living in Sanford should be elected, as the office would be established there, automatically abolishing District No. 4.

We did not solicit in any way or manner the addition of what was known as District No. 1 to District No. 4, and should the Citizens of Sanford and vicinity believe that a Justice of the Peace in Sanford is necessary they can have the former District No. 1 re-established.

The County Judge's Office in Sanford has jurisdiction in all matters that come before a Justice of the Peace and the removal of the office to Sanford would give it the two offices and deprive the South-west portion of the county of the office of the Justice of the Peace.

We feel that all fair minded voters of the two Sanford precincts, Lake Monroe and Paola will readily see that we are reasonable in this matter.

A SUMMARY OF SOME OF THE THINGS ACCOMPLISHED DURING HIS TERM OF OFFICE AS GOVERNOR:

REORGANIZATION OF STATE ROAD DEPARTMENT
The State Road Department was created ten years before he became Governor. He reorganized the Department and put in capable, efficient men who believed with him that the people wanted service and as a result in the three years he has served there has been built more than a thousand miles of hard-surfaced roads, from 18 to 22 feet wide on a 30-foot road bed. There is under construction or contracted for 1,400 miles more of standard road. There has also been built 37,000 feet of bridges mostly concrete and steel.

REDUCTION OF STATE TAXES

When he became governor, the people of Florida paid 10% mills for the purpose of running the State Government. He has reduced that State Tax to 7½ mills, more than one-third. The public often confuses the United States Government, city and county taxes with the State tax. The Governor is not responsible for the taxes of any city, county or the Federal Government, yet those who want to do him an injustice try to charge him with the amount of all these when they know full well he has nothing to do with any save the State Tax, which he has reduced by one-third.

FREE SCHOOL BOOKS

Free school books have been provided upon his recommendation to the Legislature, and the State of Florida now gives school books to every boy and girl, from the first to the sixth grade, inclusive; something that no other Governor has ever done. This measure was not intended to help the rich, only the unfortunates who cannot provide books, and it certainly has done no harm to those who can afford them.

INCREASED CONFEDERATE PENSIONS

During his administration the pension of the Old Confederate Soldier and his widow was increased from \$25 to \$40 per month.

CHANGING CORPORATION LAWS

He has changed the manner of getting charters by corporations. This change has brought us thousands of dollars annually, which we did not receive before. In 1924, the last year the old law was in effect, the State of Florida received \$398,633.93 for issuing charters. He got the old law repealed and a new one substituted, and in 1925, the first year the new law was in effect, Florida received more than \$1,400,000 by this one act. Since the new law has been enforced, it has put more than \$3,000,000 in the Treasury of Florida without hurting anyone.

HANDLING OF STATE FUNDS

His 1927 message recommended a law requiring everyone to turn the State's money promptly into the Treasury. This act alone will save the people more than \$60,000 a year which the State has been losing in interest on account of those who had State funds holding the money out, letting the banks use it and not turning it over promptly to the Treasury where it belongs.

PAYMENT OF STATE DEBT

When he came into office he found that the State was in debt. For 56 years the State had owed \$601,567 and no Governor had ever paid it. In October, 1926, his administration paid this amount and got the State out of debt. Now Florida does not owe a penny to anyone and has two million dollars more in the Treasury than when he went into office. There is only one other State in the nation like Florida, free from debt.

The affairs of the present administration of the County Court show **EXTRAVAGANCE, INEFFICIENCY** and a **LOSS** to the taxpayers of Seminole County who have to pay for the expenses attached to the original trying (or, when remanded for re-trying) of criminal cases when same are reversed.

The records show that it will cost approximately \$60.00 to re-try a Criminal case in County Court.

The present incumbent, according to the Records of Seminole County, has been **REVERSED** in 75 per cent of the Criminal cases appealed from his Court and is shown to be only 25 per cent efficient, by virtue of the appeal cases, in the handling of all Criminal matters that originally come before him. When Criminal cases are reversed on appeal to the higher court, all costs of trial in the lower court is paid out of the fine and forfeiture fund. In determining Judicial Qualifications, it is necessary to calculate the percentage of cases affirmed or reversed on appeal.

The Criminal cases appealed to the Circuit Court from the present incumbent's administration, in accordance with the rulings of the Higher Court, show a loss to the county in fines, labor and court costs of approximately \$4,000.00. The greatest loss, however, is the irreparable injury to the public by virtue of these existing conditions.

SAMUEL A. B. WILKINSON was born March 25th, 1894. Left an orphan at the age of seven, he worked his way through grammar school, high school and seven years of college. He graduated from the University of Florida in 1916 with the Degree of Bachelor of Laws. Two years later, after continued study at the University, he received the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Education. STEPS ARE TAKEN FOR FACILITATING TRADE CONDITION

Studies Are Made Looking To Preparations of Regulation Governing Liberalized Rediscout Rate of Bankers

WASHINGTON, June 2.—Another step has been taken by the government to facilitate the easier operation of the country's business and financial system. Studies were made by the federal reserve board looking to preparation of regulations to govern operation of the liberalized rediscout privileges of member banks, provided in the Sheppard-McFadden Amendment to the reserve act.

Experts said that the amendment would mean much to business. It will enable producers of all staple commodities to obtain prompt payment for goods by presentation of bills of lading in shipments, accompanied by drafts, at the federal reserve member bank. Under the law the drafts may be discounted by the member banks, and then become eligible paper for rediscout at the reserve bank, subject to regulations prepared by the board.

Under the old law this privilege was extended only to a restricted class of agricultural commodities, even cotton seed, flour, bran, canned food products and other finished goods being excluded. While demand for liberalization of the discount privilege was raised by Southern agricultural interests, experts said that producers in all sections of the country will reap the benefit.

Apparently drafts accompanied by bills of lading representing shipments of steel, lumber, canned goods, and other commodities, as well as a long list of other staple commodities, both raw and manufactured, are eligible for discount at the member banks.

Secretary of Treasury Mellon and Governor Roy A. Young of the reserve board feel that the broadening of the rediscout privilege will react beneficially both to the member banks and commerce generally.

Some time will be required before the board issues its regulations. The law provides that bills of lading or other shipping documents conveying title to products which are "non-perishable, readily marketable, agricultural and staple" obtain the rediscout privilege and become "eligible paper."

The law provides further that the maturity of drafts of bills of exchange shall not exceed 90 days from the date of the shipment. In discounting these bills reserve banks may compute the interest to be deducted on the basis of the estimated life of each bill and "adjust the discount after payment to conform with the actual life there."

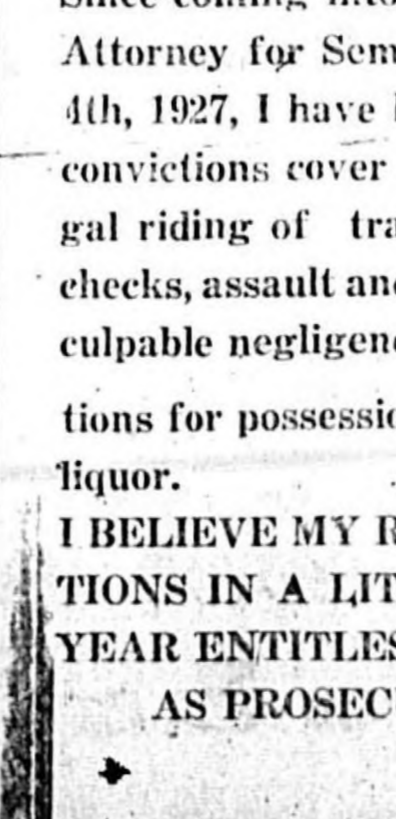
