Sanford's Centennial Celebration
When a person reaches the age of a hundred years, when a chair becomes an antique with the stamp of a century on it, when old wine and old love have added to their luster a hundred winters and a hundred summers, it means something. And when a city, whether it be situated on the upper banks of the St. Johns, or the plains of the Far West, has its hundredth anniversary, it is an event worth celebrating.

And as the Sabie Harrison Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution are preparing to celebrate the birth of Sanford upon an occasion known as Founder's Day which long will commemorate that fateful day in 1837 when on February 8 Captain Charles Melton, leading a gallant band of American soldiers, fell in battle on the shores of Lake Monroe.

Here the Americans, having won the day, pitched camp and later erected a small fort which they called Fort Mellon in honor of their fallen leader. This fort survived for many years and after the war was over became the center of a thriving little trading community known as Mellonville.

It was not until General Sanford came here nearly fifty years later that the center of the town shifted from the foot of Mellonville Avenue to the approximate location of the old Sanford House, and the name of the town was changed to Sanford.

But firmly fixed in the minds of the oldest inhabitants are the docks and warehouses which used to be on the lakefront near Fort Mellon long before First Street and Park Avenue had ever made their appearance.

And so it is entirely fitting and proper that Sanford should remember this date of February 8, 1837, and that suitable ceremonies should mark its observance. In the fact that Sanford had its beginnings in an event of one hundred years ago, we should all take pride. And that the town has survived the vicissitudes of a century full of trials and tribulations, speaks well for the pioneers who bravely bore the burdens of its struggles.

The Herald congratulates the D. A. R. on its fine work in seeking to preserve the historical background of our city and bespeaks for the various committees in charge of Founder's Day the wholehearted co-operation of all our citizenry in making it an outstanding success.

A Drivers' License Law
Statistics show that a considerable part of the accidents pertaining to motor vehicle traffic can be avoided by the enactment of a suitable drivers' license law.

The standard law which will come up for consideration before a number of state legislatures during the next few months provides for taking away the licenses of those who are not mentally or morally equipped to drive an automobile with safety or who, under its enforcement, are found later to be incompetent as drivers.

Some of the chief advantages of the law are:
1. Its effect has been in states where it has been tried to reduce accidents and injuries and save lives.
2. It puts a premium on competence and skill in driving and provides an effective means for removing the incompetent or dangerous drivers from the road.
3. It removes the menace of the person who is too lazy or too ignorant to learn the necessary English or become familiar with traffic rules, regulations and safety precautions.

4. It provides the police authorities with a check-up in case of accident and a permanent record of each holder of a license.
5. It assists in a scientific study of the causes of accidents, whether attributable to mechanical failure, engineering defects in streets and roads or human negligence or carelessness.
6. It promotes an orderly, statewide control of motor transportation and the uniform supervision of vehicle operators.
7. It is an effective method of educating all drivers on the basic precepts of driving and the fundamental laws of the highway.
