Improved SR46 West Promised This Year

Preliminary plans for the straightening and repaving of State Road 46 west from Interstate 4 to the Wekiva River, a distance of 3.1 miles, will begin immediately, C. A. Broadbent, Fifth District engineer for the State Road Department, said today.

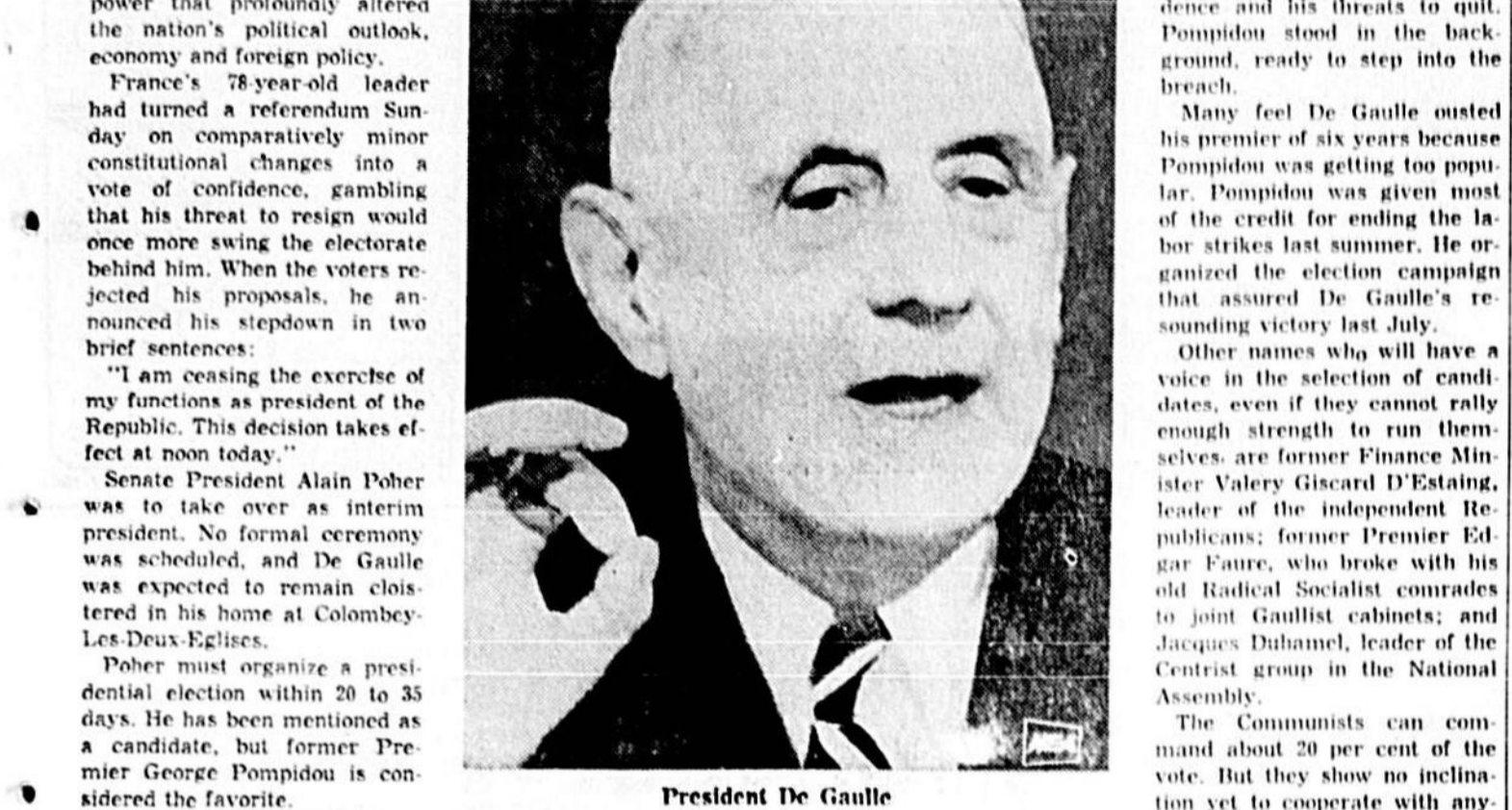

Makes Threat Good, Quits DeGaulle Gambles, Loses

PARIS (AP) — Charles de Gaulle steps down today as president of France, ending more than 10 turbulent years of power that profoundly altered the nation's political outlook, economy and foreign policy.



President De Gaulle

France's 78-year-old leader had turned a referendum Sunday on a comparatively minor constitutional change into a vote of confidence, gambling that his threat to resign would force more voters to the polls.

De Gaulle is the last of the great leaders of World War II to step out. A World War I veteran, he led a colonial when the second war broke out and rose to general before the German occupation of France. He led the Free French Forces, his wartime battles with President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Winston Churchill were legendary.

De Gaulle headed the provisional government in liberated France from 1944 to 1946, then quit for the first time and dropped out for 12 years. He re-emerged as premier, called back in 1956 by an uprising of the military and right-wing settlers in Algeria.

De Gaulle's political career was marked by a series of gambles. He pushed through a new constitution setting up the Fifth Republic with a strong president and downgrading the National Assembly that held authority in the Fourth Republic.

De Gaulle conducted a 10-year campaign to eliminate U.S. domination of Europe. He attacked the special privileges of the dollar and the British pound as international reserve currencies, and carried on extensive purchases of U.S. dollars.

Couple Charged With Baby Sale

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)—A young Florida State University researcher and his former wife, seven or eight months pregnant, have been charged with attempting to sell their unborn baby.

"Apparently they were strapped for funds and, of course, there was the divorce," said a spokesman for the Florida Bureau of Law Enforcement (FBLE).

The two were identified as Teddy Tollett, 23, an FSU statistician, and his 25-year-old ex-wife, Nancy Ruth Tollett, an unemploy cosmetologist.

Authorities also charged the two with the sale and delivery of drugs to the Leon County Jail, where Tollett ended a 60-day sentence March 16 after he was convicted of sale and possession of marijuana.

'Protest' Different At St. Leo's

ST. LEO, Fla. (AP)—It was a routine commencement exercise on campus but the confrontation a mile down the road from St. Leo's College was to say the least, different.

The format had been used before: 100 heavily armed officers formed a human wall to block 212 marching anti-war protesters.

Tenseness developed as the marchers, assembled from several peace groups at West-Central Florida colleges, decided how far they should go in protesting Defense Secretary Melvin Laird's presence at St. Leo's.

Both sides were hurled at the waiting officers. The eyes of one trooper went hard as a protestor loudly and obscenely said what he would like to do to all police men.

"I know how you feel," said a cool demonstrator to the trooper. "I wish someone would shoot that bigmouth up too."

It was that kind of demonstration.

After two hours of round-table talk—mostly of the cliché variety—it ended. Both sides said they had won.

The force headed by Sheriff Basil Gaines of Pasco County had kept the demonstrators off campus, allowing Laird to speak and to receive an honorary degree without disturbance.

And the marcher's co-leader, Robert Pasternack of the University of South Florida, used a police loudspeaker to tell his colleagues: "We've proved our point."

Forest Service In Variety Of Jobs

During the dry season they are on call four nights out of eight, meaning that they are on call 96 hours a time. "If the build-up index (of dryness) hits 60 or more, you get a 'red alert,'" says Ranger J. R. Hoff. "We sometimes work six to eight days in a row." With this job, an understanding wife is a necessity. Helping with the fire-fighting jobs are the area's municipal fire departments. Their mutual assistance agreement helps both groups—the PFS gets extra manpower when needed, and in turn they lease second-hand brush trucks to the departments to use in their city brush fires as well. There are six brush trucks out on loan agreements within Seminole County.

Artman recalled one fire up in the northwest corner of the county, far from any well-populated areas. PFS crew members were fighting the fire alone when out of the underbrush crashed members of the Lake Mary Volunteer Fire Dept., offering their help.

And at a recent fire near Winter Park, just over the line in Orange County, there were five Seminole County fire departments assisting. "In a lot of cases," maintains Artman, "it would take a heck of a lot more time and do a lot more damage if we didn't have mutual assistance." But the "mutual assistance" they need most of all comes only from an informed—and careful—public.

Accident Cost High

LONDON (AP) — Industrial and road accidents cost Britain 800 million pounds (\$1.2 billion) a year — or 10,000 pounds (\$14,000) a minute, according to latest figures.

"Five million working days are lost each year through industrial disputes, but we lose 24 million days as a result of accidents," said former attorney-general Lord Shawcross.

He was launching a 250,000-pound (\$400,000) appeal to aid research by a medical commission on accident prevention during the next 10 years.

Japan Goes For Color

TOKYO (AP) — There were 191,206 more color television sets in use in Japan in January 1969 than the previous month, the government-operated Japan Broadcasting Corp. (NHK) announced.

NHK said at the end of January they have taken their equipment home with them in the evening, then stay within hearing distance of their home phone until they leave for work the next morning. No viewings out, no visits with friends across town are possible.

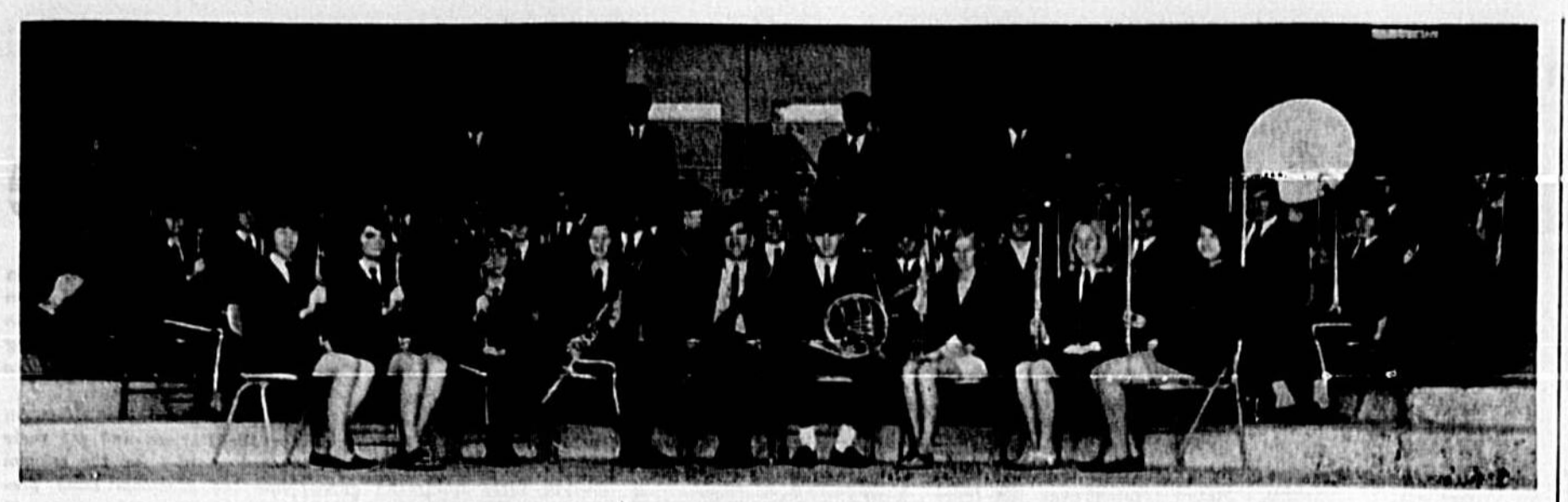
Eight-Inch Snow Blankets Duluth

Students Fight FSU Fire

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Sweating students juggled tons of equipment and priceless records from Florida State University's Westcott Hall Sunday as fire ravaged the top floor of the aging administration building.
"We can't keep them out," said an exasperated fireman. Men in shorts and football jerseys highballed down the steps with file cabinets, folders and books as flames crackled overhead.
Coeds in bell-bottom pants and Bermudas formed a fire brigade and, huffing and puffing, passed the salvage to a distant spot on Westcott lawn.
"We got magnificent help from the students," said acting President J. Stanley Marshall, who has seen angry student protests in recent months in front of the same building.
"A couple of people started going in," said Brewster Banks, 16, of Tampa, "and then everybody said we'd go in and help."
A fireman punched through a third-story window with an ax and dropped typewriters and other office equipment to a last tarpaulin held by students below.
"This was the true student body: the kind of students you can always count on," said Gov. Claude Kirk, who watched the fire with his step-daughter Adriana.
A university spokesman said some of the records saved from fire and water damage dated to the opening of the school in 1837. Also rescued were irreplaceable student grade transcripts, he said.
Cause of the fire had not been determined Sunday. Officials said they could make no loss estimate.

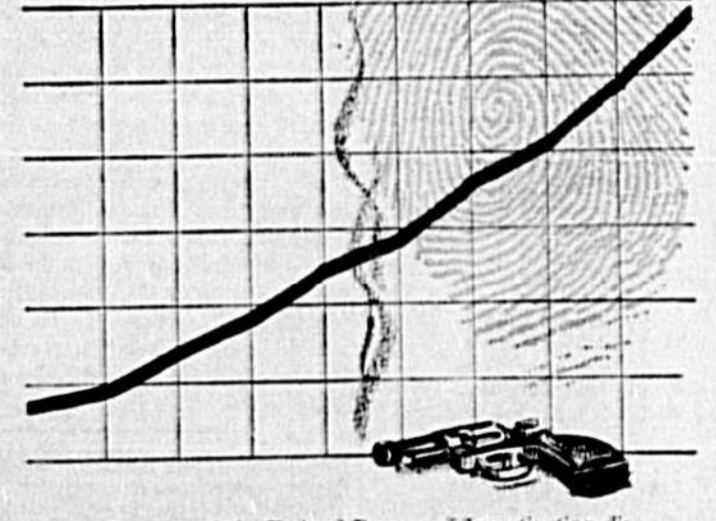

Casino Closed

CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) — The state told the lavish Circus Circus casino in Las Vegas Thursday it must close by April 30.
The five-member Nevada Gaming Commission voted unanimously in refusing to extend the casino's temporary gambling license, questioning the loans and other financial dealings of the owners.

Rains Bypass Flooded Area

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS People who live along the Mississippi River in Illinois and Iowa breathed a sigh of relief when predicted heavy rains and high winds bypassed the area. The light rain that fell on a number of flood-stricken communities Sunday produced little rise in the swollen Mississippi, but heavy downpours elsewhere did cause a sharp upward climb in the Missouri River. Several dikes broke Sunday, endangering some areas, but they were quickly mended. At Fulton, Ill., the water tunneled under Illinois Highway 6, causing a two-mile dike protecting Fulton and nearby communities. Fifty volunteer teams were sent to the scene with a dozen truckloads of sand bags. Dick Fleischman, spokesman for the Army engineers, said the quick action by volunteers kept the river from washing away the highway and flooding East Fulton. The engineers said the Mississippi was cresting along at 86-mile stretch from Sabula, Iowa, and Savannah, Ill., southwest to Muscatine, Iowa. The river was flowing under the Centennial Bridge in Davenport, Iowa, at 23,760 cubic feet per second—nearly 10 times its normal rate—the Scott County civil defense department reported. At St. Louis, the river, two feet below flood stage Sunday, was expected to fall during the next two days, then rise because of the cresting Missouri.

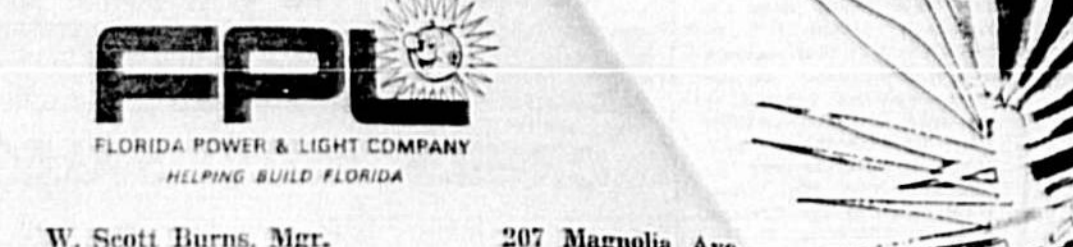
Pope Names 33 New Cardinals

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope Paul VI created 33 new cardinals today, giving younger men and seven more nations a place in the highest council of the Roman Catholic Church. The Pope had named the 33 prelates on March 26. Today, 33 members of the Sacred College of Cardinals met in secret conclave with the Pope and gave their approval to his choices. The meeting in the conclave hall of the Apostolic Palace, first of three ceremonies this week, lasted only 16 minutes. It expanded the Sacred College to 131 members, the largest number

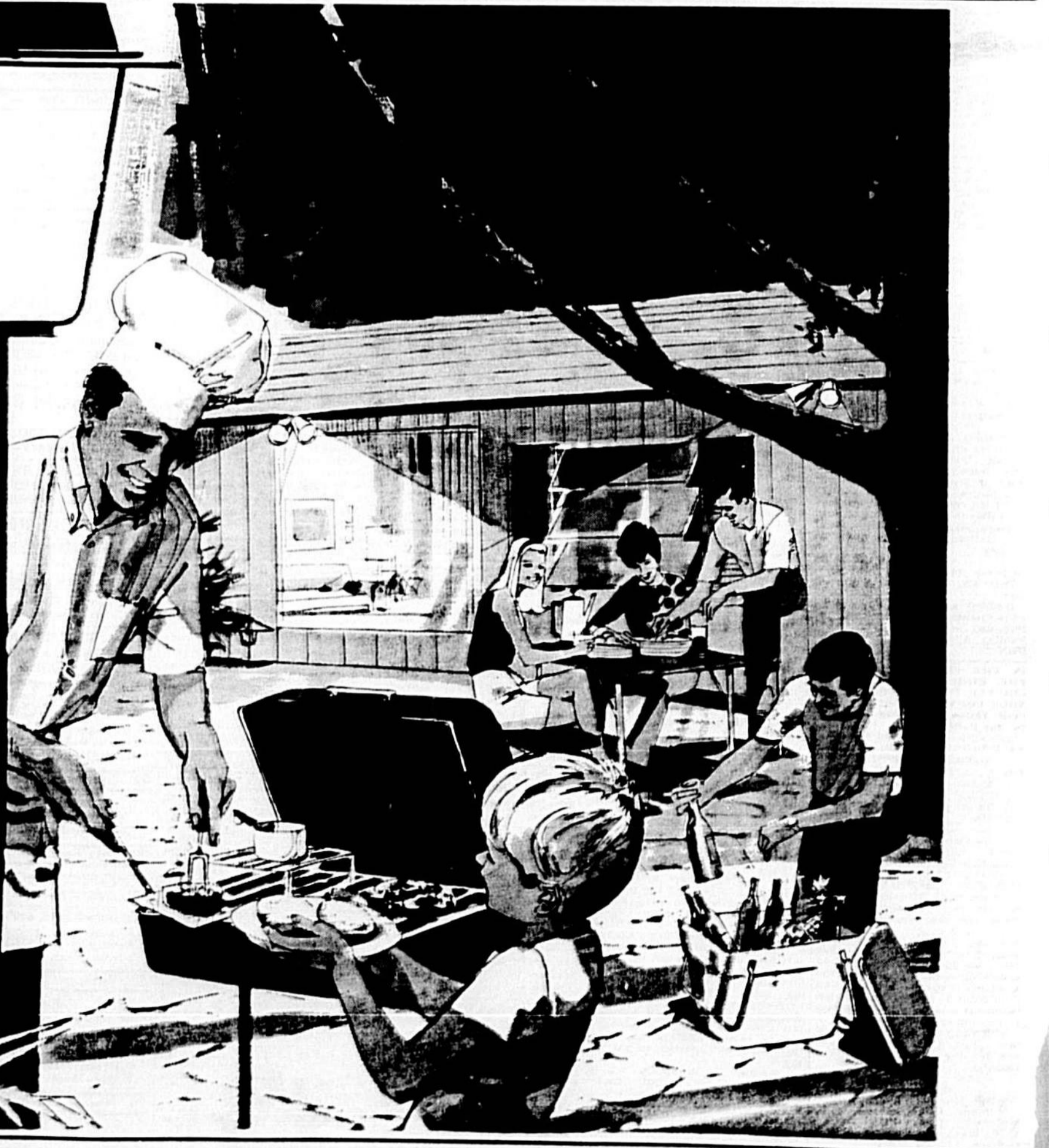
in history, and increased the number of nations represented from 26 to 46. Among the others are eight Spaniards, two Brazilians, a Canadian, a Mexican and the first cardinal to be named from Korea, Guatemala, Madagascar and New Zealand.
