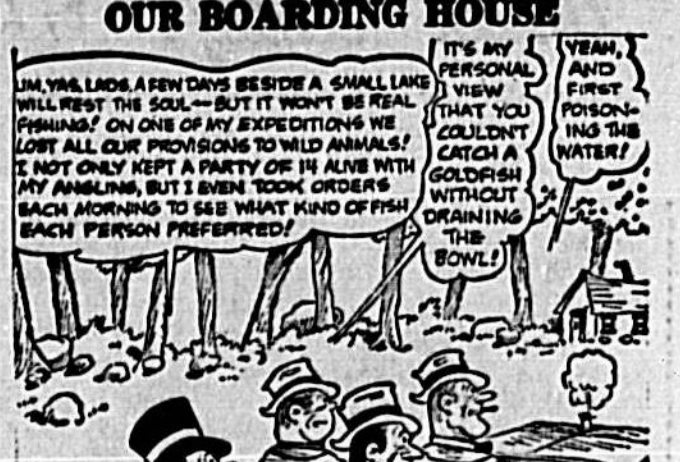

City Bans 'Dirty' Joke Book

A magazine distributor from Orlando today promised "100 per cent co-operation" in removing from Sanford newsstands a magazine which the city finds objectionable.

The offer followed Tuesday's action by Municipal Judge C. Vernon Mize and City Attorney William C. Hutchinson Jr., in which they ordered all copies of a "Sex to Sixty" series of joke books removed from the stands.

The move came after a woman filed a complaint with the police charging "children were reading it out More Sex to Sixty" and I couldn't even buy a copy of the Saturday Evening Post.

Chief Arnold S. Williams said the book in question was selling on the newsstands at \$1.25 and \$1.50 inside the cover were jokes, "eggs and cartoon, all with double entendres and innuendoes."

He issued a warning to all newsstands in the city they must rid their shelves of such literature or "cases will be made against them."

Bill Cooper, manager of the book department of Orange News of Orlando, magazine distributor which serves Sanford, this morning visited Williams and stated "I didn't come to argue with you; we'll cooperate with you 100 per cent."

Answering charges by the magazine vendors they are "forced to take these (questionable) magazines in order to get the good ones," Cooper said it is "absolutely untrue. We can't tell a dealer what to get or not to take," Cooper said.

He pointed out Orange News has been in business in Orlando for 41 years and "has got 700 magazine titles a month. We can't possibly screen them all."

Regarding the magazine in question, Cooper said he had heard of the magazine but never had seen it.

Chase Manhattan Bank, holder of the mortgage on the shopping center, was the only other bidder at the April 8 sale.

A hearing on the objections to sale will be held in circuit court at an early date, according to C. Vernon Mize Jr., attorney for Sullivan and Dawd. Circuit Court Clerk Arthur H. Beckwith Jr. said the sale could not be consummated until the legal action is disposed of.

Sanford Plaza Sale Closing Halted By Suit

A legal action filed in Seminole Circuit Court has stopped final closing of the sale of Sanford Plaza, court records revealed today.

Sanford Plaza was sold as a public sale at the court house April 8 to William Sullivan and Henry Dowd, trustee for a group of New York and Miami investors, for \$1,283,000.

The action filed by Patrick and Louise Zellott objects to the sale on the grounds it was "grossly inadequate, insufficient and undervalued to the degree that the same shocks the conscience."

The objections were filed through attorneys William Hutchinson Jr. and Kenneth M. Lottler.

The suit further contends: "By inadvertence, mistake and as a result of confusion, the bid of Chase Manhattan Bank was less than intended thereby creating an unwarranted and unnecessary deficiency adjustment and inequitably affecting the rights of the counter-defendants."

Chase Manhattan Bank, holder of the mortgage on the shopping center, was the only other bidder at the April 8 sale.

Committeeman Race Blossoms Into Fight

 Robert Petree, candidate for state Democratic Committee, blasted Robert Billhimer, incumbent, at Tuesday evening's meeting of the Seminole County Democratic Association, as being the "mistaken official" who has not been seen at any Democratic function in the past two years until campaign time.

Petree declared that the office of state committee man has been an honorary position and that "the state committee gives little, if any service to candidates of the party in a long time."

Petree's statements were quipped "out-of-order" by Association President Gene Stephens following protest by Billhimer that Petree was not following the prepared program.

Questions sent to both candidates to be answered at the meeting were: 1) Should the state executive committee have a published statement of funds to the counties be made? 2) On what basis should the disbursement of funds to the counties be made? 3) On what basis should the disbursement of funds to the counties be made?

Billhimer answered that the state committee does publish an estimated budget. Criteria used to determine amounts of funds to be disbursed to counties, he said, "population, geographical location, level of opposition, number of candidates, and the importance of the office at stake."

He further reported that state committee had allocated \$1,000 to the county committee in 1964.

Petree charged, however, "if the state committee was not paying the outrageous cost of maintaining the headquarters at Bradenton, \$700 could have been allocated to Seminole County."

R. A. Cameron and Robert Parker, candidates for the district county commission, also answered the questions: 1) What do you feel is the most pressing need or problem to be dealt with in Seminole County, and, 2) What changes, if any, do you think are needed in our county form of government to serve the public better?

Cameron answered "officials of thinking so that all are headed in one direction while looking toward, and taking into consideration, the needs of all the people." He stated that so real change is needed from wise in county government and pledged, if elected, to be on call 24 hours a day.

Parker stated he "would be available at all times" and that "a big problem in the county is created by the fact that the legislature meets only every two years." Other problems he cited were "growing pains" and the removal of Sanford Naval Air Station.

School board candidates John Horner and Donald Bales, incumbent, district 3; Dr. John Darby and Mrs. Jackie Calko, district 1, and John Evans, incumbent, and Lt. Col. Horace Smith, district 4, all appeared.
