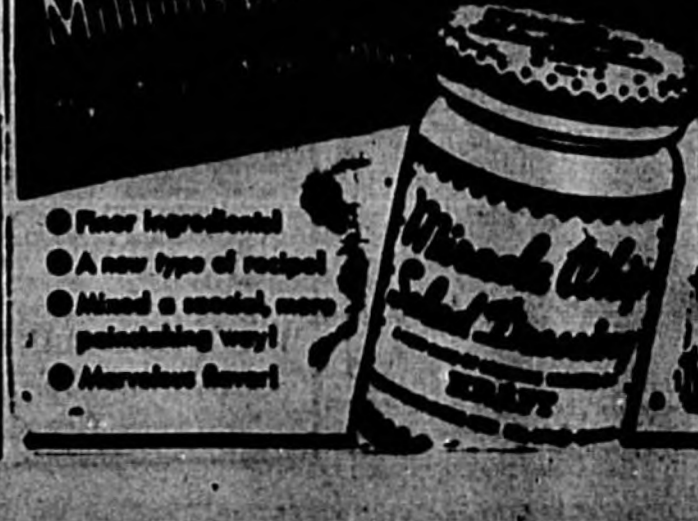

Pulling Together

Charlotte Man Is Chauffeur To Nation's Chiefs

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Sept. 15.—(AP)—Oswald Barringer, Charlotte business man, claims to have chauffeured every president who has visited Charlotte except George Washington. A recent visit of President Roosevelt led Barringer to relate how he had driven for Theodore Roosevelt, William Howard Taft, Woodrow Wilson and Herbert Hoover before he piloted the present Chief Executive through the city streets to the scene of the seven-state rally here.

The stocky "driver of presidents" does not recall exactly how he happened to get the job. "I was the first automobile dealer in the south," he says, "and had been driving since 1900, and I guess they just had confidence in me."

The job does not make him nervous, he says, but "I naturally feel the responsibility." He always drives more carefully, keeping the automobile at a speed of 35 miles an hour between towns and 15 through them.

Perhaps the most impressive thing in connection with the job, Barringer says, is the precautions taken for the president's safety. For instance, the secret service orders Barringer to stay at the wheel continuously.

When President Hoover was at Kings Mountain in 1932 something went wrong with the motor and Barringer started to get out of the car to repair it.

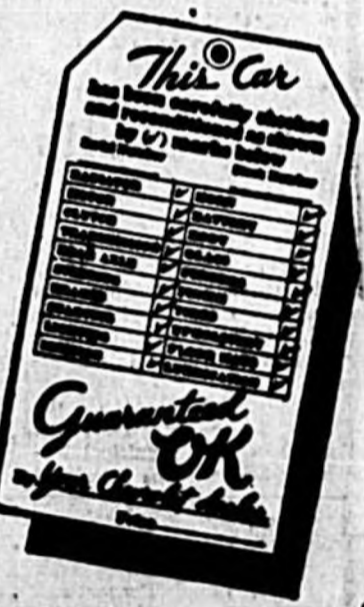
