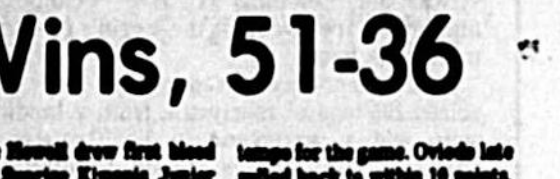

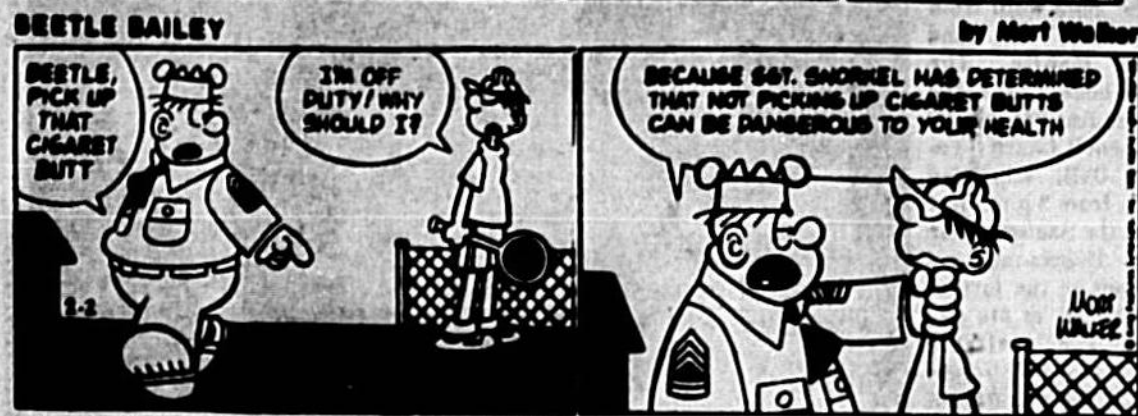

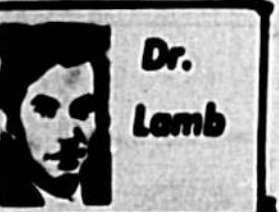

Vessel Breaks, Nose Bleeds

DEAR LAMB - I am 72 years old. I have a problem that is getting worse as I grow older. I have had nose bleeds all my life. My doctor only loans the vitamin in my nose with the vitamin in the blood or the I have nose bleeds again. I have high blood pressure at times, but I don't believe this is causing my nose bleeds. A little child surely would not have high blood pressure. I also have other problems. I need to know what I can do for myself. I have heard that vitamins K1 in cod liver oil is for nose bleed patients. My doctor has not suggested this to me. I am very discouraged. Doctor bills are high and a flood income (social security), I cannot be raising to a doctor all the time. DEAR READER - The ultimate cause of nose bleed is a broken blood vessel and constricting it with an electric needle is often sufficient. In other cases if there are a lot of blood vessels, it is necessary to surgically tie the source of them shut. Why don't you see a specialist in ear, nose and throat diseases if you can? He may be able to do some local correction that helps. Meanwhile, use a small cotton swab and coat the inside of your nose with baby oil in the morning when you get up and again at night before you go to bed. Keeping the area moist and preventing crusting often prevents crusting and bleeding. Even though your high blood pressure is of more recent origin it can provide the increased pressure to bleed from tiny broken blood vessels so it may be an aggravating factor. Vitamin K only helps if there is a decrease in the quantity of the blood to clot. This is probably not your case and that is why your doctor has not given it to you.

DEAR DR. LAMB - I'm a 16-year-old boy. About three months ago a hard lump appeared in both sides of my chest. The one on the left side is much larger than the one on the right side. They cause no pain but make my upper torso bulge out larger than normal. They continued to grow for a while but seemed to stop. What could they be? DEAR READER - That's normal. Many boys have these "lumps" during the maturation phase and they are related to the increased hormone production by your body. They usually go away in time. They are not cancer. If they persist for a couple of years and they bother you, perhaps you could see a doctor about them. Of course, if you were overweight and had other signs of failure to develop you should have a medical examination. The lumps alone, though, are not an indication of an abnormality.

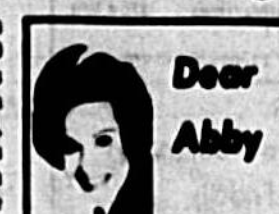

Of course, if you were overweight and had other signs of failure to develop you should have a medical examination. The lumps alone, though, are not an indication of an abnormality.

## County Aid Sought 'Walk-In' Births Causing Hospital Money Woes

Seminole Memorial Hospital officials will send a letter to the county commission next week asking for help in defraying the cost of child delivery for indigent mothers.

Hospital Administrator Charles Bentley said \$110,414 in doctor fees and hospital expenses have been absorbed by the hospital to pay for such deliveries since November, 1976. It was then the hospital board of directors voted to reimburse doctors for such delivery fees.

Bentley said the problem has escalated dramatically since the mid-wife program was phased out.

In April 1977, the county health department issued a policy that prohibited mid-wife child deliveries for first-born. "Since that policy went into effect last April," said Bentley, "the number of indigent deliveries handled by the hospital has about doubled."

He said 77 indigent deliveries were performed at the hospital during the final six months of 1977. That represented one-fourth of deliveries for that time period, he noted.

Bentley said he felt the rise in indigent deliveries at the hospital was directly related to the ban on mid-wives.

Trey Todd, director of human services for the county, said his department will begin "a preliminary staff study" of the situation immediately.

"The problem is this," said Todd. "When a person is low income, she is provided with prenatal care at the county health department. That care is extended through the sixth month. At that time the mother is encouraged to seek the services of a private physician and make arrangements for entering the hospital."

In most cases, Todd said, the women treated at the health center are not financially able to obtain a physician.

"We will give these prenatal care up through the sixth month if necessary," said Todd. However, there is no basis for coordinating care with the hospital, he noted. As a result most indigent deliveries are handled without prior notification being given to the hospital and no payment by the patients.

"So, when it comes time for delivery," commented Todd, "they simply go to the hospital and one of the emergency room doctors or someone on duty has to handle the delivery and the cost is absorbed by the hospital."

Bentley said until November 1976, obstetricians performed such deliveries without compensation.

## Panel Clears Police In Torey Riley Probe

A special committee, which has conducted an investigation into complaints by 18-year-old Torey Lee Riley of police harassment, reported to the Lake Mary City Council Thursday night it found "no probable cause" for any of the allegations.
