## Fifth Graders Help Beautify School

Last fall the students in Mrs. Doris Duxbury's fifth grade room at Pinecrest volunteered to help the Beautification Chairman of the PTA, Mrs. John Carlton and Mrs. Carl Schilke in the planting and watering of new shrubs and trees on the east wings of the Pinecrest School.

The class came to school one day in their working clothes, bringing as many tools as they could carry. This day was spent in planting palm trees, ligustrum and viburnum, fertilizing, covering with top soil and watering. Some study had already

been made in class about soils, fertilizers and general information about planting. Now the students branched out on related subjects—all kinds of plants and their uses, conservation, relation of animals to plants, climate, soil, water and many more. They also studied about people who experiment with

plants and soil. Each member of the class made a special report, made a drawing or did an experiment. Books about these many subjects were borrowed from the school and public libraries and brought from home.

All the while, several times a week, committees took care of the watering and weeding, besides keeping up with their daily work.

On Jan. 18, the work of the class was culminated by the presentation of an Arbor Day program for the whole school. Brief reports were made, favorite poems and songs about trees were given. Following the program, a tree was planted on the east side near the Library Wing.

Soon after this 250 red cedar trees were given by the Forestry Service and the class helped in their planting and added them to the number already being watered. Six class members even came one Saturday morning and helped Mrs. Carlton plant border grass.

## Oops!

NEW YORK (UPI)—President Kennedy has cancelled his subscription to the New York Herald Tribune, one of 14 newspapers delivered daily to the White House. The Herald Tribune, being explained today on the first family's reading list by the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, said editorially it hoped the President would change his mind. In a front page story headlined, "We Get a Cancellation From Washington," the newspaper said: "We would hope that the President has not cancelled his subscription because of hard reporting by our greatly respected staff or because of the critical nature of our editorial page when we have disagreed with him." The newspaper called reports of a "feud" between Kennedy and the Herald Tribune "tommyrot." The White House, which has been receiving 22 copies daily of the New York morning newspaper, did not attribute the cancellation to the fact the newspaper often disagrees with the administration. A spokesman said the President wanted to diversify his newspaper reading.

The Washington Post commented in today's editions that "the President and Mrs. Kennedy are known to have been annoyed more than once by sharp criticism and stories they believed were unfair in the Republican Herald Tribune."

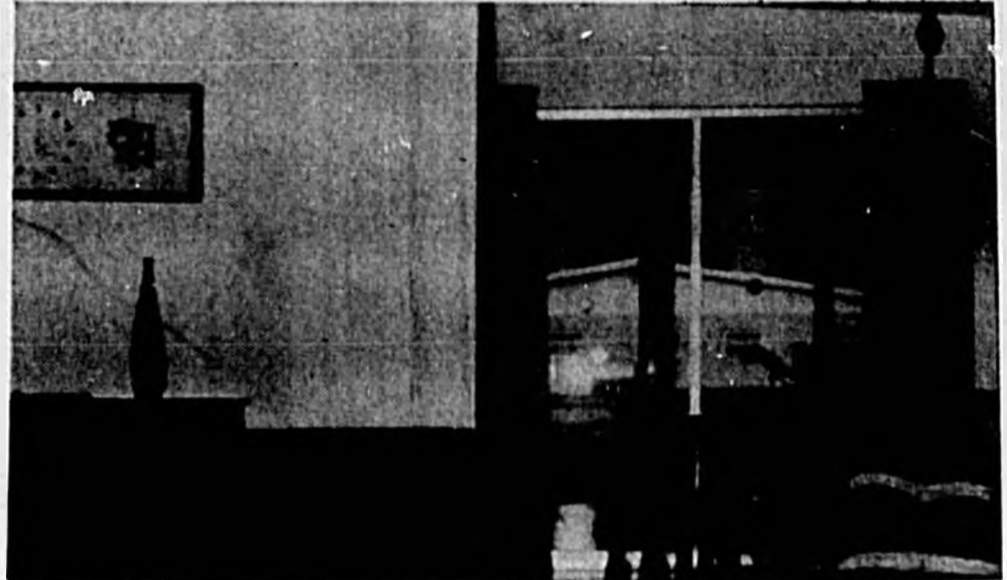
