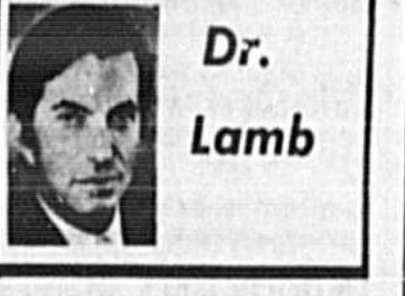

Emphysema Is Not The Same As TB

By Lawrence E. Lamb, M.D. DEAR DR. LAMB—Please explain to me what emphysema is and how it affects people. Is it contagious? How is it different from tuberculosis?



When we breathe out we expel the air in the tiny sacs and when we breathe in we bring in new oxygen. In emphysema the neck or opening into the tiny sacs is narrowed or constricted. This makes it particularly more difficult to empty the air sacs of old air adequately.

The constantly over distended air sacs results in an over distended chest. A person with longstanding emphysema will have a larger, often barrel shaped chest because of the over inflation. We call this configuration an emphysematous chest.

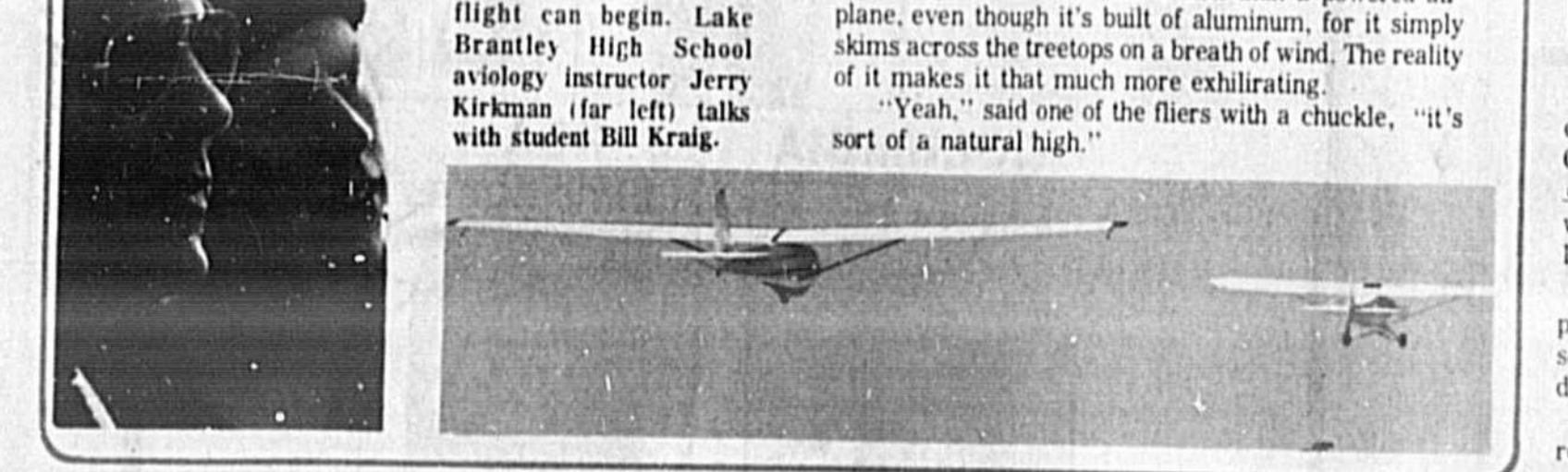

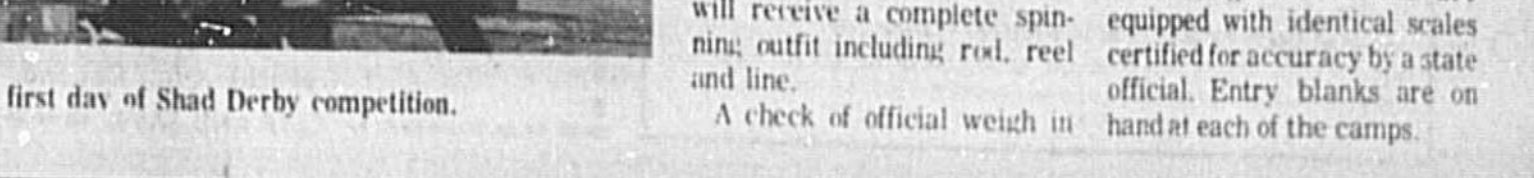

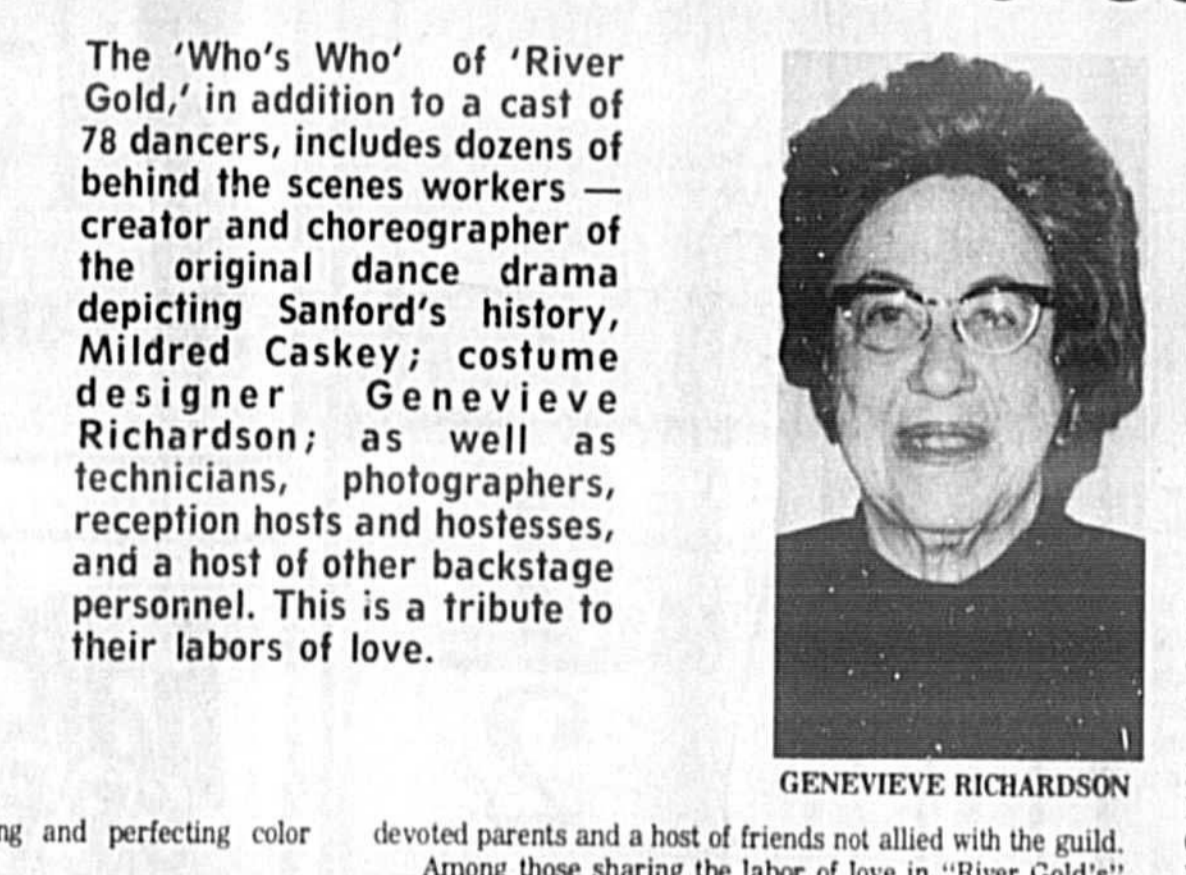

Her style is bold and free, with an obvious feel for color and perspective. The 17-year-old Bishop Moore High School senior has "always liked art," but only in the past four years — since moving to Florida from Avon, N.Y. — has she been able to express her talent.
Classes with Sanford artist Judy Malone set her on the right course. Later, she joined Helen Hickey's portrait classes at Seminole Community College and is also taking art classes at school this year. Mary finds the discipline of having to attend regular classes more productive than just grabbing for paintbrush and canvas when the impulse strikes.
"I started out doing oils," she explained. "But now I'm into everything — pencil, water color, pastels."

Portraits remain her first love. She has the rare talent of capturing the elusive likeness of her subject with her pen, and has even produced a couple of striking self-portraits.

Hartwig, a teacher at the Pre-education and Development Center in Sanford.
"I like art really well. I like teaching art and have taken just about every workshop possible," said Mrs. Hartwig. "I think most kids would enjoy art if only the materials were available."
Her daughter Mary, as well as sweeping the board of honors in the art

department, is also an outstanding student in academics, favoring English and history. She plans to become a teacher, and will probably take a double major in college — education and art.
Trude Nopper of Sanford waited until her son, Leroy Jr., was grown before she put paintbrush to canvas.
"I've always loved art, but never had the time — just never got round to it," she said.

problem. They will help any member of the family who comes to them — whether it is the teen-ager or the parent. But so far the teen-age drinkers and their drinking parents are not coming to the Center.
As Peggy Fapp, a family therapist associated with the Center, points out, alcoholism tends to relay itself from generation to generation. Teen-age alcoholics will grow up to be adult alcoholics. They will marry and their children are likely to become alcoholics — and so the problem is perpetuated.
The vicious cycle of alcoholic parents — alcoholic children

can be broken, says Mrs. Fapp. But the first step will have to be taken by the parent. They may have to admit that the three-martini lunches and regular after-work bar sojourns constitute drug abuse, just as surely as their teen-ager's tripping during baby-sitting jobs and stashing liquor in school lockers constitutes drug abuse.
This is one problem that is going to require honesty and vigilance on both sides of the generation gap.

TV News Reporter Has Real Life Drama To Cover

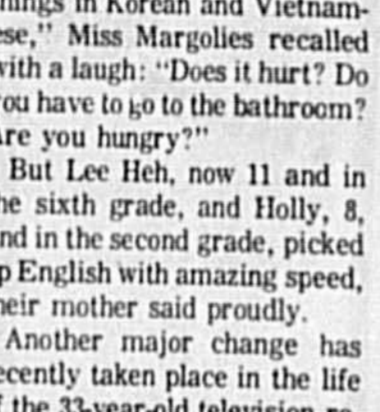
NEW YORK (AP) — The life of television reporter Marjorie Margulies for the past five years has been as dramatic as any story she has covered for the evening news.
In fact, it was an assignment for WCAX-TV in Philadelphia — a picnic for Korean orphans adopted by U.S. families — that started it all. Seeing the happiness of both parents and children led her in 1970 to Korea and in 1972 to Vietnam "to fulfill a dream" — the adoption of

hard-to-place children. Ignoring the advice of family and friends, overcoming agencies' prejudice against single parents and fighting immigration red tape, she eventually managed to adopt two little girls, first Lee Heh from Korea and later Holly from Vietnam. With Ruth Gruber she has told the story of those eventful years in the book, "They Came To Stay."
"I had expected to have the traditional marriage at 23, have

two kids and adopt some more," the slim, dark-haired Miss Margulies explained in an interview here. "But 23 went, then I was 24 and 25 and I realized I wasn't going to do it the traditional way. I wanted something I was crazy about and could legitimately think about spending the rest of my life with and I wasn't meeting him."
She had a good job and an apartment. Why not adopt a child, she thought. But the fact that she was single proved an

Special Touch For Laid Work

Laid Work is done in two separate stages. In part one, an area of the design is completely covered with flat, side-by-side stitches. Unlike the Satin stitch, in which the needle goes in at one side of the area and emerges at the opposite side, the Laid Work is made with the needle taking a tiny stitch along the outside edge of the design.
Try it first in a small, clearly outlined area. Take care to keep your thread from twisting as you stitch and make sure there's no fabric showing between stitches.
If the area to be covered is large, start your Laid Work stitching in the middle to establish the direction of the stitches. Beginners will do well to start this way, even in smaller work areas. It also may be easier to lay these first stitches a thread's-width apart and then go back and fill in the spaces between to produce a smooth, well covered surface.
The second part of Laid Work is achieved with design effects worked on top of the laid threads. In the case of leaves this might mean stitching the leaf veins in a fine Stem Outline, worked from left to right with the thread below the needle to produce a thin, firm line.
Chain, Split or Coral stitching also may be used for surface outlines. For purely decorative effects on larger areas, contrasting color threads may be laid across the top and held in

Must crevel embroidery always be done on linen? Can I also use a coarser, more loosely woven fabric like burlap for very large projects?
Dear E.M.B.,
There are patterns for which an evenly woven burlap can be very effective, especially since it now comes in a handsome range of "decorator" colors. Just remember that for such a fabric your design should be both larger and simpler and you should use heavier thread or multiple strands of crevel wool.
I've seen embroidered burlap used for a three-paneled screen. Very few colors were used and the design, a flower and leaf, accented vine, was very effective against the burlap background.
