

Argentine, Britain Sign Monetary And Trade Pact Today

LONDON, Sept. 17, (A)—Britain today signed a provisional trade and monetary agreement with Argentina. The pact settles differences between the two countries on sterling payments, meat purchases and British-owned railways in Argentina. Under its terms, London and Buenos Aires agree to continue their old trad-treaties, which recently expired. until a new one can be written;
The agreement was signed totaneously announced in London. It followed lengthy conferences which several times nearly broke

down.

The two countries agreed that discussions be started at once to prepare elements in the expired treaty, which now is revived and will continue in force until the end of next December.

Among other things, it was mutually decided that Britain may buy all of Argentina's surplus meat, for a four-year period, except small reserves to be sold in other countries. Britain agreed to pay at least 25 percent more for

pay at least 25 percent more for Argentine meat than at present.


