BUCHAREST, Roumania, Feb. 14.—Wemen in Roumania are obliged to vote. It is compulsory for all these who qualify—but qualifying is not so easy.

An appeal has just been sent out to the women of Roumania by Mms. Elena C. Malanner, president of the "Association for the Eman-cipation of Civil and Political Rights of Roumanian Women." The appeal notifies women of the risk they run in neglecting to reg-leter themselves as voters the moment they qualify and urges them in lines no time in aligning themselves with the organization working for their freedom.






