County manager releases proposed budget

Seminole County Manager Kevin Grace has submitted his proposed budget for fiscal year 2004/2005 to the Board of County Commissioners for its review and consideration.

The 2005 budget is the second year of the County's biennial budget process, and was tentatively approved last year.

The total proposed 2005 budget for services falling under the auspices of the Board of County Commissioners is \$585 million which represents a 2.8 percent increase over FY04.

The proposed budget holds the County's tax rate constant for the sixth consecutive year, county officials said.

Issues facing Seminole County in FY05 are largely related to legislative actions taken by the State of Florida.

Funding mandates levied by the State will cost Seminole County taxpayers approximately \$2 million each year.

The Board of County Commissioners will review the County manager's outlined spending plan with staff at a work session at 8:30 a.m., Monday July 19 in the Board of County Commissioners chambers.

The Commission chambers are located at the County Administration Building, 1101 E. First St., in Sanford.

As part of the budget process, the Commissioners will hold two public hearings in September.

City manager claims he was misled

SANFORD — The city's top administrator contends it was misrepresentations, not solely the use of a golf cart, that led him to recommend termination of his second-in-command.

City Manager Al Grieshaber placed Deputy City Manager Andrew Van Gaale on suspension with pay on July 6 regarding his personal use of a city-leased golf cart during Sanford's July 4 celebration. Two days after the suspension was implemented, the city manager asked Van Gaale to resign or face an investigation that would end in ter-

mination. " ... (I)t would be inappropriate to have Andrew on the second deck with me," Grieshaber wrote in a July 14 memo following a meeting with Van Gaale and Mayor Brady Lessard. "I thought it would be detrimental to the organization."

As part of the preparations for the July 4 celebration, the city obtained golf carts for staff members to use dur-

ing the event. Mayfair Country Club donated eight carts for city use, and the city leased five others from Mid Florida Golf Carts for \$75 each.

According to Grieshaber's findings of fact, on July 1 Van Gaale called Lisa Jones in the city's recreation department to ask if the city was obtaining golf carts for July 4. Jones, who oversaw the lease of the carts, said yes. Van Gaale, who oversees the city's code

enforcement department, asked if one could be reserved for him to handle code enforcement duties, since he had given employees in that department the day off.

About 7:30 p.m. on July 4, Grieshaber saw Van Gaale driving the golf cart in the Mayfair subdivision with two minor children sitting in the front seat and a minor child standing on the back. Both Grieshaber and Van Gaale live in the Mayfair subdivision, about eight blocks east of the July 4 activities.

Peers help seniors battle scams

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — Senior citizens often make easy targets for crimes or scams. Sometimes that leads to shame or embarrassment and the victims do not report the problem.

Now seniors in Seminole County will have peers who can talk them through the situation and lead them to help.

The Seniors vs. Crime Project will have its grand opening at its storefront office at the Altamonte Mall July 22 at 11 a.m. Initially the project will reside in the C.O.P.S. Center hosted by the Altamonte Springs Police Department. The center is located just inside the mall's entrance between Sears and Dillard's.

"We're helping our peers," said Sandra Jernigan, the storefront manager. She will head the Senior Sleuths, as the projects volunteers are called.

"We're not going to turn anyone away," Jernigan said. "We have a lot of seniors in the area and the police department is very busy."

The services will be available for any senior, she said. They expect to have seniors from throughout the county.

Brother searches for answers

SANFORD — A missing Sanford man's truck was recovered by the Winter Garden Police Department July 7, but the discovery has left more questions unanswered for the man's family.

Vincent Reali, 39, disappeared along with his blue 2000 Nissan Pathfinder June 24. He was last seen leaving his business, The Auto Club in Sanford, around 3 p.m.

The SUV was recovered at about 3

a.m. July 7. A businessman reported the vehicle in the parking lot of the Tri-City Center Plaza at the corner of State Road 50 and Dillard Street in Winter Garden, said Investigator Jeff Bean of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

Vincent's brother, Dominic Reali said July 16 that he has no idea why the truck would be in Winter Garden.

"I don't have a clue," Dominic said. Vincent co-owns The Auto Club, a wholesale car business on West 27th Street in Sanford.

The Sheriff's Office speculated that

Vincent may have gone to an auto auction the night he disappeared. A large auction is held in Ocoee, Dominic said, but that is on Tuesday and Vincent disappeared on a Thursday.

There was an auto auction June 24 in Sanford, Dominic said, but the sons' father attended that one.

"They rarely went to the auction in Ocoee," Dominic said. "I have a hard time believing he would be in Winter Garden for that."

'Chief' shared his life with everyone near him

Chief Petty Officer Michael Caolo, 84, died Sunday, July 11, 2004, at Florida Hospital, surrounded by his loving family, after a long illness with congestive heart failure.

He was retired from the U.S. Navy after serving 20 years, including service during World War II.

The "Chief" as he was affectionately called was surrounded at his bedside by his lovely wife of 62 years, Jackie Caolo, his children, sons Michael Jr., Jack and Mark, and daughters Bonnie and Susan.

Against all odds, he was able to enjoy the last three months of his life which he spent at home doing those things that brought him the most joy, which he shared with his family, making his famous and delicious Italian spaghetti sauce and faithfully

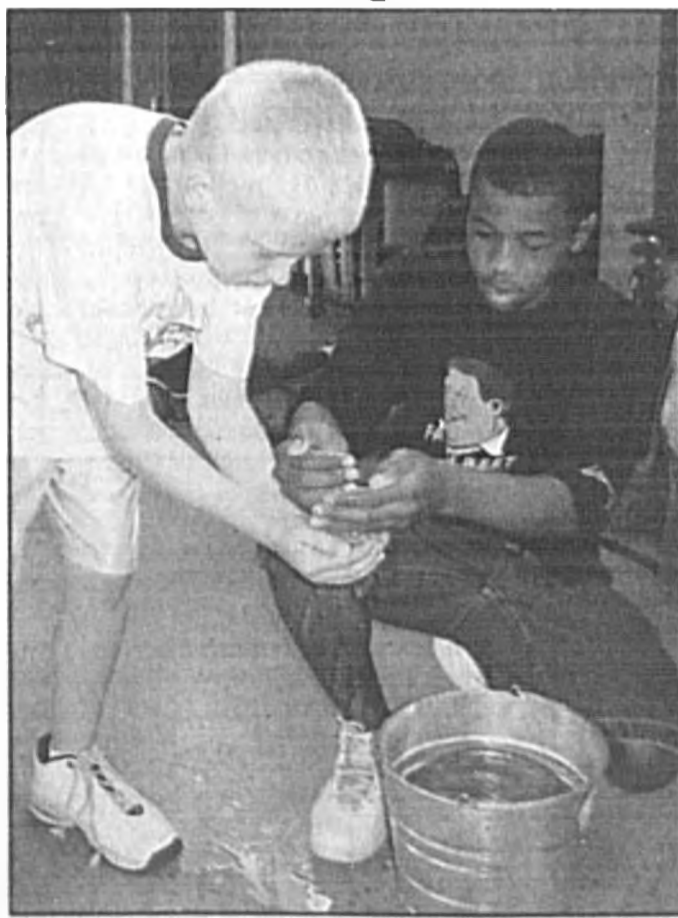
listening to his favorite big band classics of the '40s, while grilling dinner in "The Chief's Gazebo".

Chief spent many afternoons with his wife Jackie as they enjoyed the beautiful spectacular sunset on Lake Monroe.

He often shared the aisles of the local grocery store as he spoke with friends, fellow veterans of the Navy Fleet Reserve, sharing stories of his career in the Navy where his tour of duty, after joining at the age of 18, to make a career which saw him serve on the Battleship USS West Virginia BB-48 before the Japanese attack at Pearl Harbor. Serving at Naval Air Station, Miami, he flew in the large PBV Catalina anti-submarine seaplanes along the Florida coast and in the Caribbean. He met his life long love, Jackie, on the beach in

Alcohol sellers comply with law

LAKE MARY — Sixteen-year-old Amanda Kelly will never forget the first time someone sold her beer.

She sat outside a restaurant with another young woman and ordered a beer. The waitress asked her how old she was, but before Amanda could reply, the server asked to see identification.

Amanda handed the woman an ID that clearly stated her name and her age. The waitress said the young women would have to move inside where they were served. The waitress was later

SEMINOLE SUMMARY

A GLANCE AROUND OUR COUNTY

A couple of notes regarding the Cartgate saga:

- In a front page article in Wednesday's issue of The Herald, I reported that Mayor Brady Lessard was considering a vote on City Manager Al Grieshaber's future. Lessard contends he never intended to call for such a vote. That may be his intention, but that wasn't the indication he gave me late Tuesday afternoon.

Lessard had met hours before with Grieshaber; Deputy City Manager Andrew Van Gaale and his wife, Debbie; and community activist George Saunders to discuss Van Gaale's situation. According to the Van Gaales, Saunders and Lessard himself, the mayor lobbied Grieshaber to restore Van Gaale to his position, at one point pounding on the table and saying, "End this now." Grieshaber's notes of his conversations with Lessard before and after the meeting don't quote the mayor specifically, but the city manager did write that Lessard "repeatedly said we had to try to resolve the matter."

The Van Gaales and Saunders also said Lessard noted that he "could get three votes on the commission." Lessard told me after the meeting, without prompting, that he knew he had two votes and could "probably get a third." Lessard said Grieshaber responded, "Yes sir, but you'll have to do it in an open meeting."

Since city commissioners don't vote on personnel matters — except for hiring and firing the city manager — it was clear to me that Lessard considered terminating Grieshaber, particularly when Lessard said he was considering a special meeting, possibly on Saturday, July 17, three days before Grieshaber's deadline to make a final decision on Van Gaale.

Perhaps Lessard was thinking out loud and not contemplating any action. I was remiss in not asking the "nut question," as Grieshaber refers to it: Are you planning to fire the city manager? Lessard said he was referring to Van Gaale's appeal to the city commission, if it goes that far, when he made the three vote comment. However, I stand by my original analysis.

There may not be a formal vote on Grieshaber's future employment with the city, but such a vote could happen by default if Van Gaale appeals to the city commission what looks to be his certain termination.

Under the city's policies, if Van Gaale is fired, he can appeal to the civil service commission. That board will hear the case and make a recommendation to Grieshaber on what action to take. The board's decision is not binding; Grieshaber may ignore the recommendation if he chooses.

At that point, Van Gaale can appeal to the city commission, but only if the punishment is termination. If Grieshaber chooses to suspend or demote Van Gaale, the discipline can not be appealed to the commission.

Grieshaber has taken a hard line in disciplining Van Gaale, so it's not likely he would agree to anything other than termination. If the appeal does go to the city commission, and commissioners do decrease the punishment, Grieshaber has a decision to make. He has stated in the record that "... it would be inappropriate to have Andrew on the second deck with me"; "... it would be detrimental to the organization"; and "I told the mayor that I was not about to have Andrew back on the second deck and that his presence would effectively render my leadership a nullity."

Given those statements, how could Grieshaber continue to serve as city manager if city commissioners override his decision?

Though he still has until Monday to respond to Grieshaber's allegations, Van Gaale was called into the office Friday afternoon to turn in his cell phone, keys and city credit card.

Jay Jury stopped by the office Thursday to talk about the Van Gaale situation and the James Orioles punishment. Orioles, a city code enforcement officer, was suspended for three days without pay for having a prostitute, Veronica Jackson, in his city truck while on the clock. Orioles told city officials that he was only talking to Jackson.

Jury noted that the city commission a couple of months ago passed an ordinance which allows the city to impound vehicles of those caught with prostitutes in the vehicles. His question: Has the police department impounded Orioles city vehicle? Hmmm.

This may be a bad time to bring this up, but there is a 1995 E-Z-Go golf cart for sale in The Herald's classified section (Section 187). For \$1,650 you get a 4-seater cart with lights, signals, radio and a horn. The owner swears it's in excellent condition.

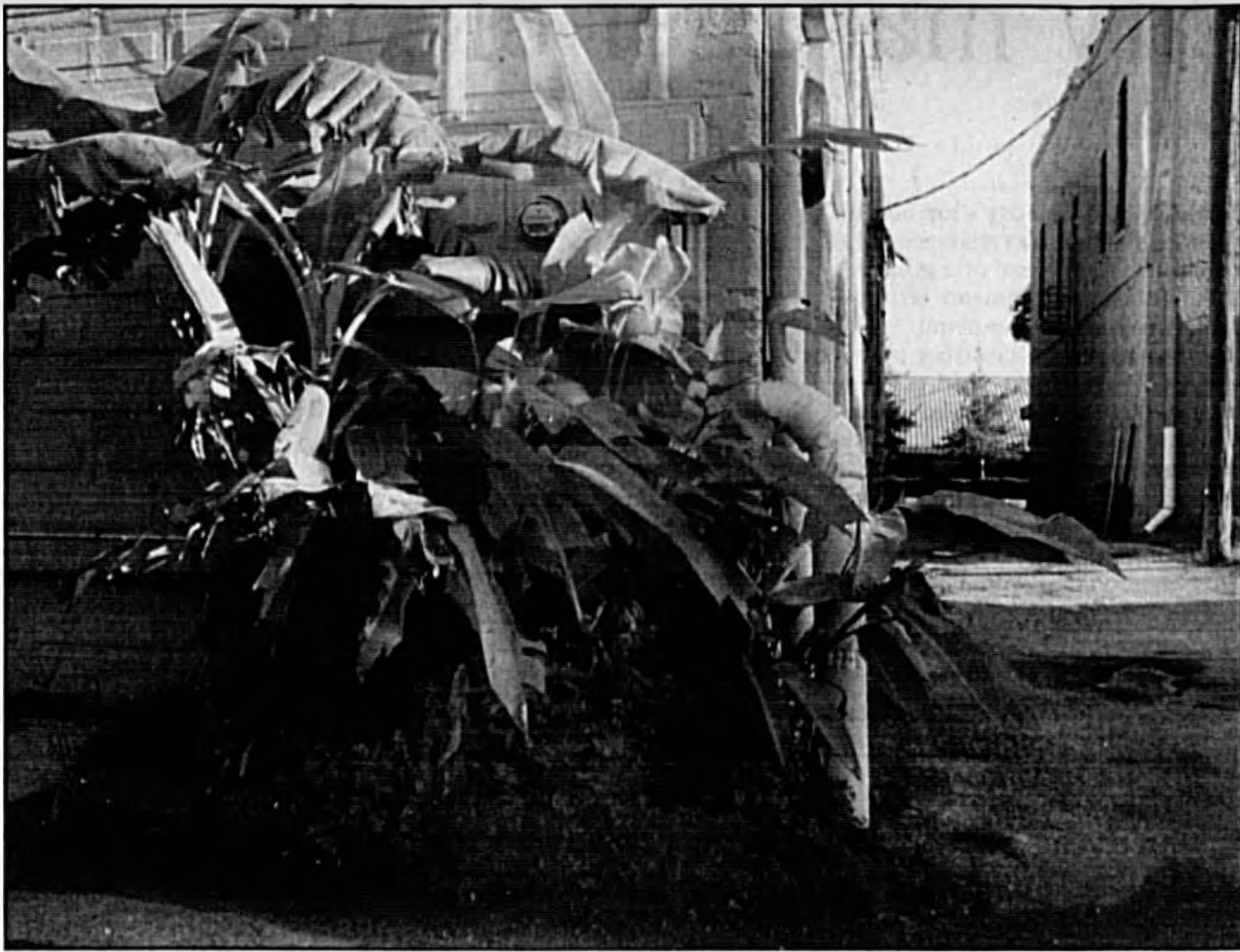

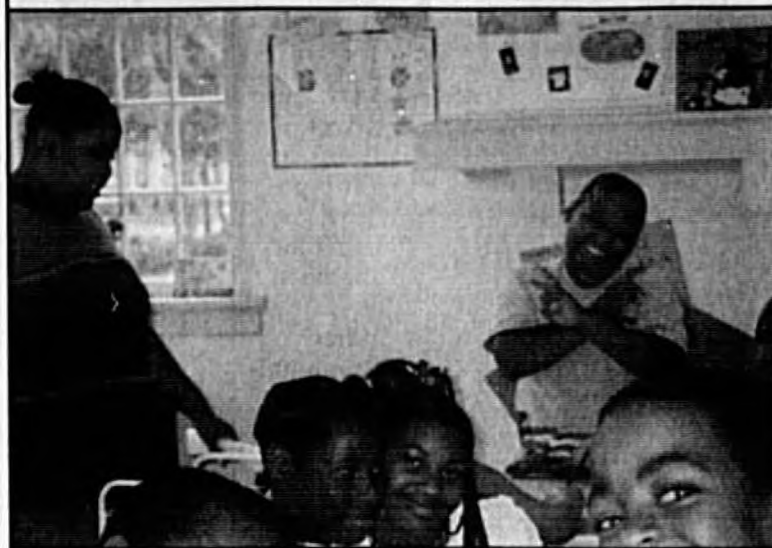
Happy Anniversary

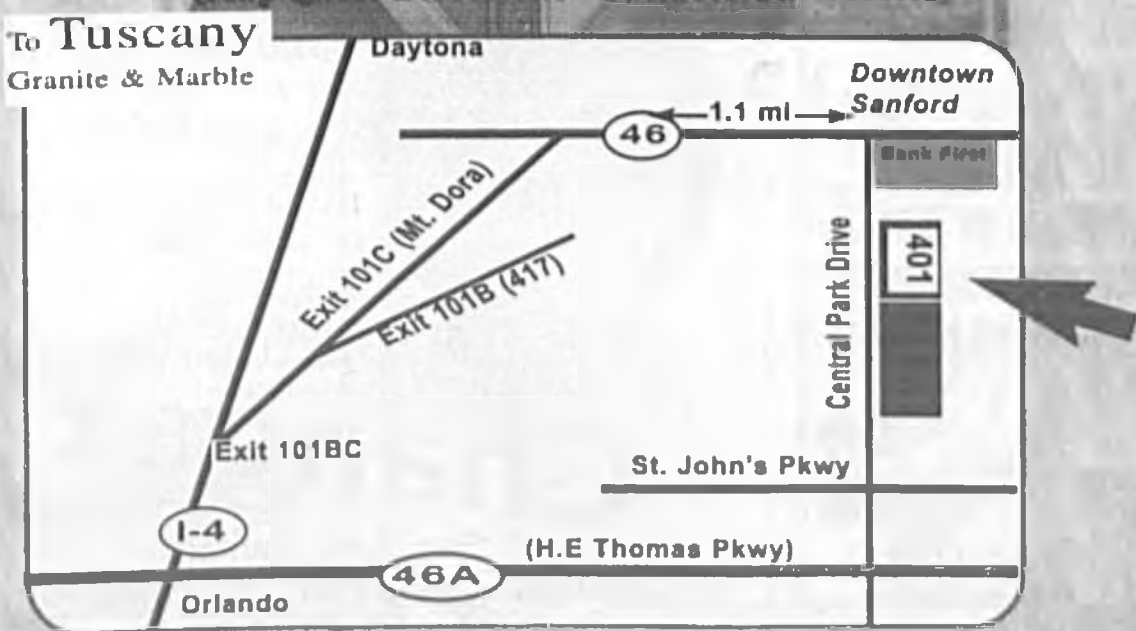

Airport Memorial

The Sanford Airport Memorial Committee sent out a news letter regarding recent and upcoming activities. It is an interesting document, and focuses primarily on the RA-5C Vigilante aircraft. That's the plane mounted at the entrance to the Orlando Sanford International Airport.

In this latest newsletter, Jack Dow, chairman of the Memorial Committee, and Chuck Templin, chairman of the Vigilante Reunion Committee, gave statistics about the RA-5C Vigilante. WOW! Not knowing much about it, I was amazed. Did you know that the maximum speed of that aircraft at sea level was 806 mph, and at 40,000 feet it could reach a speed of 1,320 mph? Yet it was considered a bomber. In that era, THAT WAS FAST!

Of course, not being a pilot, it also told of the plane having such innovations as the first integrated terrain avoidance system. Wow, that's a fact that will not remain in my memory very long. Those who have flown however, may be interested in the facts about the aircraft.

But here's the good news. The Memorial Committee plans to have a plaque on display at the Vigilante, 30 by 40 inches in size, telling all about this last and most advanced aircraft ever stationed at Sanford NAS. Folks will be able to learn all about the plane.

Now, a second aircraft is planned, and eventually a third. The second is a Lockheed PV-1 Ventura, representing the World War II era, during which time the base was operational.

The committee however, can't merely obtain a plane and put it on display without extensive renovations and repairs, presently underway. The committee's goal right now is to raise \$50,000 to help fund the plane renovation and plaque. Some help will be forthcoming (hopefully) with a Florida State Grant and a supplemental funding effort.

Now, what the committee is seeking, is financial support from former service personnel, many of whom settled in the Sanford and Central Florida area after their discharges from the service, as well as organizations and businesses. For those of us in the Navy in Sanford, we found this to be one of the best cities serving as home port for Naval personnel.

As a sidebar, one of the Navy cities many of us served in was known to be unfriendly. I recall seeing signs there that read, "Sailors and dogs, keep off the grass". No need to identify the city — those who were stationed there know about this. The people in Sanford however, were friendly and treated service personnel with kindness. Many times we were allowed admission to various entertainment facilities at a reduced cost. Sanford civilians were most appreciative of our being here and we all knew it was an excellent place to settle after retirement or discharge.

For those who haven't seen the plane presently on display, pay it a visit - take the youngsters along. It's a good history lesson for them, and a fond remembrance for many of the adults.

Army demotes Carlson for Bush comments

Editor's note: Charlie C. Carlson III wrote Iraqi Diary, a nine-month series in The Sanford Herald detailing his service as a staff sergeant in Baghdad. Carlson was recently disciplined for negative comments he made about President George W. Bush. Carlson's father, Charlie Carlson II, e-mailed the following update.

We thought we had this case in the bag. On July 12th, C3 (Charlie III) appeared before an Article-15 hearing for making "disloyal remarks about President Bush." The Army based their charges on a sworn statement by another soldier who stated that C3 said that "Bush should have

never started the war" and that "Bush was no military leader."

I was there with my suit and tie on — I even wore my new shoes — to represent C3 as he was denied an attorney. An Article-15 hearing prohibits an attorney. We did not get to review the investigation report. We basically had to guess our way through the hearing and could not cross examine anyone.

Speaking on C3's behalf was myself; his commanding officer; a captain; his platoon sergeant; his first sergeant; and two other non-commissioned officers. No one testified against him. All testified that C3 was one of the best soldiers in the unit, often taking on the risky missions, or

going into risky situations ahead of his troops, and that they never had any problems with him or his squad in combat. The platoon sergeant testified that he frequently relied on C3 over the other three squad leaders as C3 could make quicker decisions and took care of his people.

In addition, I presented an inch-thick medical report on his 7-year-old son and a letter from the doctor who has followed the child for a year that documented his son's medical problem at home while he was deployed.

In addition to this, I presented Herald articles about the ton of care packages that C3's supporters shipped to his platoon in Baghdad from the people of Seminole County.

So, that all sounds like a great soldier who has gone beyond the call of duty while worried about son's medical conditions at home. Well no compassion here folks, not when you disagree with the Bush Administration or the war. C3 was reduced in rank from a staff sergeant to a sergeant, given 45 days extra duty seven days a week (that's 45 days straight without a break) and fined one half of his pay for two months, which I managed to get suspended. This was not a court martial, although it was definitely a kangaroo court if there ever was one.

They must have loved the Iraqi Diary, as they had copies

of every article on the table. I was impressed. It's always nice for a writer to know he has such a wide following. Although they did not make any charges based on the Iraqi Diary, I did mention what a popular series it had been and suggested that they should subscribe to The Herald as it would save them from having to download articles from the internet. In response I only got a few "grunts" and a "humph." I don't think they liked me, but we weren't about to lick their boots.

Is this the gratitude of the "new" America? Fourteen years of flawless service, three wars, extra concerns for his troops, held beyond his discharge date on an indefinite enlistment and now punished for simply expressing a personal political opinion? If you can figure it out let me know, because it defies logic and appears to be very un-American. As for his request for discharge, it is still sitting in an inbox where it has been for over two months. Thus, he remains an "indentured servant" on active duty.

C3 is doing fine. He has not lost his sense of humor, and is carrying out his extra duties as he has always done. Our next move is to try to obtain a hardship discharge for him based on his son's problem. C3 is on an indefinite enlistment and is actually about three years beyond what should have been his discharge.

The army attempted to destroy a good soldier, but they failed. They haven't broke him yet, he has no regrets for expressing his political opinions and will do it again until they bust him to a private. He is both a hero and patriot, as it took guts to stand up against the system and exercise the rights guaranteed him under the Bill of Rights that he has risked his life for.

Our family has more than 80 medals for combat service; however, we are framing his

Article-15 papers and will hang them on the wall as the greatest honor we have ever won during our accumulated 56 years of military service to the country, because this Article-15 is symbol of freedom of speech.

After C3's hearing, my wife Dot and I were stopped at the gate of Fort Stewart and made to get out of the car, open all

doors, hood, and trunk, while the military police searched the vehicle, even though we had already been issued a temporary pass and both had retired military identifications. We were driving a new Lincoln Towncar, certainly nothing that looked like rolling bomb, unless terrorist are now buying \$40,000 cars to blow up.

So here we were, two senior citizens standing there, dressed-up in suits, with our hands on our heads, grinning like possums, while they searched the car. In the trunk they found a 50-pound sack of dog food for my dog, Bubba James. I said out loud "Oh no, they've found the dog food!" Dot, who looks a lot like a short blonde Osama Bin

Laden, tried to explain that it really wasn't our dog food, that a secret agent must have planted it in our trunk. They slammed the lid and said "humph" and then let us go. We got to keep the dog food too. We're not worried about terrorists, we are more concerned with what Bubba James would do if he did not get his dog food.

We don't know what that search was about, but what was interesting is that the MP's were from the same battalion where C3's hearing was held. We certainly did not look threatening with a big ol' white town car. Oh well, that'll teach us to try to defend someone who is accused of using the Constitution.

PR director: Zoo won't be a secret anymore

If Richard Frohlich builds up too much stress at work, he takes a break, like anybody else.

But while employees on break at other companies are debating between ordering their daily latte with skim or 2 percent milk, Richard debates between visiting the howler monkeys or the elephants.

As the new director of marketing and public relations for the Central Florida Zoo in Sanford, Richard admits that it is an unusual, but fun, place to work.

"You have to wake up in the morning and like what you're doing," Richard said. "And I like going to work here."

Originally from New York City, Richard, 44, now lives in Orange County with his family.

Richard's media and business experience at his previous jobs prepared him for the demands of his new position.

Richard learned the subtleties of business etiquette while working as the Manager of Public Affairs at Rural/Metro Ambulance. Part of his new job is to recruit sponsors for the zoo's upcoming projects and exhibits.

And like a good father, Richard also took his children to the Central Florida Zoo.

"I've been coming to this zoo with my kids since they were little," Richard said. "I've always enjoyed myself here."

Internet service helps get pet adoptions

Homeless pets in the area stand a greater chance of being adopted since CARE Feline Rescue, Orlando; Buddies for Life, Inc., Orlando; Gold Coast Greyhound Adoptions Inc., Winter Park; and Greyhound Ranch Adoptions Inc., Longwood, joined Petfinder.com, the oldest and largest online database of homeless pets.

"Once a pet's photo and description are added to our database, its chances of being adopted go up sub-

stantially," said Betsy Saul, president and co-founder of Petfinder.com. "No longer does a pet have to wait for an adoption day event or for someone to walk in the door at the shelter. Its information is out there for potential adopters to see from the comfort of their own homes on their own time schedule."

More than 6,000 animal welfare organizations nationwide and in Canada post their pets on Petfinder.com. Once visitors

to the site find a pet they are interested in, they contact the shelter where it is housed. Each animal welfare group has its own policies and handles its own adoptions.

Petfinder.com was created in early 1996 as a grassroots project by Jared and Betsy Saul to do something to help homeless pets. The animal welfare community immediately recognized the Web site's benefits for pets, and by 1998 the American Society for Prevention of

Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) had signed on as a strong supporter, helping with shelter outreach and education materials for the site.

Petfinder.com has also allied with PetHealth, Inc., to provide a gift of two months of ShelterCare Pet Insurance, paid for by Petfinder.com, to every dog or cat adopted from a Petfinder.com member in approved states and provinces. The program is the first of its kind for shelters.

who told Van Gaale that "he didn't like that." Van Gaale attempted to fit all three children, two nieces and a nephew, in the seat, but eventually told his nephew to "run back home," according to Grieshaber's notes.

Later that evening, a neighbor told Grieshaber she had seen two women driving a golf cart in the neighborhood.

Grieshaber told Mayor Brady Lessard in a July 7 meeting that he believed Van Gaale was being dishonest when questioned about the incident. In a memo dated July 16 that Grieshaber wrote recalling the conversation, the city manager said, "I told the mayor that Andrew had lied to me twice: the first time being when he told me that he was going to handle code enforcement; and the second, when I asked him who were the two girls on the golf cart and he replied it wasn't him."

Grieshaber informed the mayor that he intended to ask a "nut question": Did Van Gaale call Mid Florida Golf Cart Company?

According to Grieshaber's notes, Lessard agreed the city manager should ask the question and added: "If he misleads you again, fire his

ass. Otherwise, suspend him without pay for 30 days and have him reimburse the city of Sanford for the golf cart."

According to Grieshaber's notes, Van Gaale said he had called to arrange a cart for his use and that he would personally pay for it if needed. Van Gaale told Grieshaber both the DeLand and Longwood offices of Mid Florida Golf Carts were out of carts. However, Van Gaale said the company told him they normally send an extra cart and would be doing so with the city's order.

An employee in the DeLand office of Mid Florida Golf Carts, Mitch Sander, told a Sanford police investigator that the company routinely sends a spare cart at no charge in case one of the carts malfunctions.

Grieshaber's notes indicated that he asked Van Gaale if he did not realize that using a city-leased cart for personal use would be a conflict, and Van Gaale said he had not considered it.

On the advice of his attorneys, Van Gaale isn't commenting about specific allegations Grieshaber has made. He admits that he used the golf cart, but contends he did conduct city

business. He apologized in person to Grieshaber Tuesday morning, July 6, the first work day after the federal holiday, and he provided Grieshaber with a written apology on July 7.

"I am disappointed that I have let you down as my boss/mentor, as well as the mayor who has been a supportive advocate of my contributions to the team," Van Gaale wrote in the letter. "... I made two mistakes. The first was allowing my mother and wife to drive the golf cart. The second was my (sic) giving my nieces and nephew a ride in the neighborhood. It was a lapse in judgment, and I regret any exposure brought upon the city because of it."

Despite earlier suggesting that Grieshaber terminate Van Gaale, Lessard has advocated a lesser punishment, particularly after a separate

Grieshaber suspended Orioles without pay for three days.

At one point during his July 7 meeting with Grieshaber, Lessard asked if Van Gaale could receive a reduction in force (RIF) or layoff.

"I thought about it and then told the mayor that I didn't think that would work," Grieshaber wrote in the July 16 memo. "We have a budget surplus for the next year, so I can't base it on the budget; and he was productive as the deputy, so I can't say his position should be eliminated

because of lack off production."

On July 13, Grieshaber and Lessard met with Van Gaale and his wife, as well as community activist George Saunders at Logan's Roadhouse restaurant in an effort to reach a compromise. Grieshaber proposed that Van Gaale resign and sign a release and waiver with the city. In return, Van Gaale could use his sick, vacation and personal leave; remain on the payroll through Oct. 31; have his personnel file cleared and copies of the written notification of charges shredded; and receive a good reference from Grieshaber.

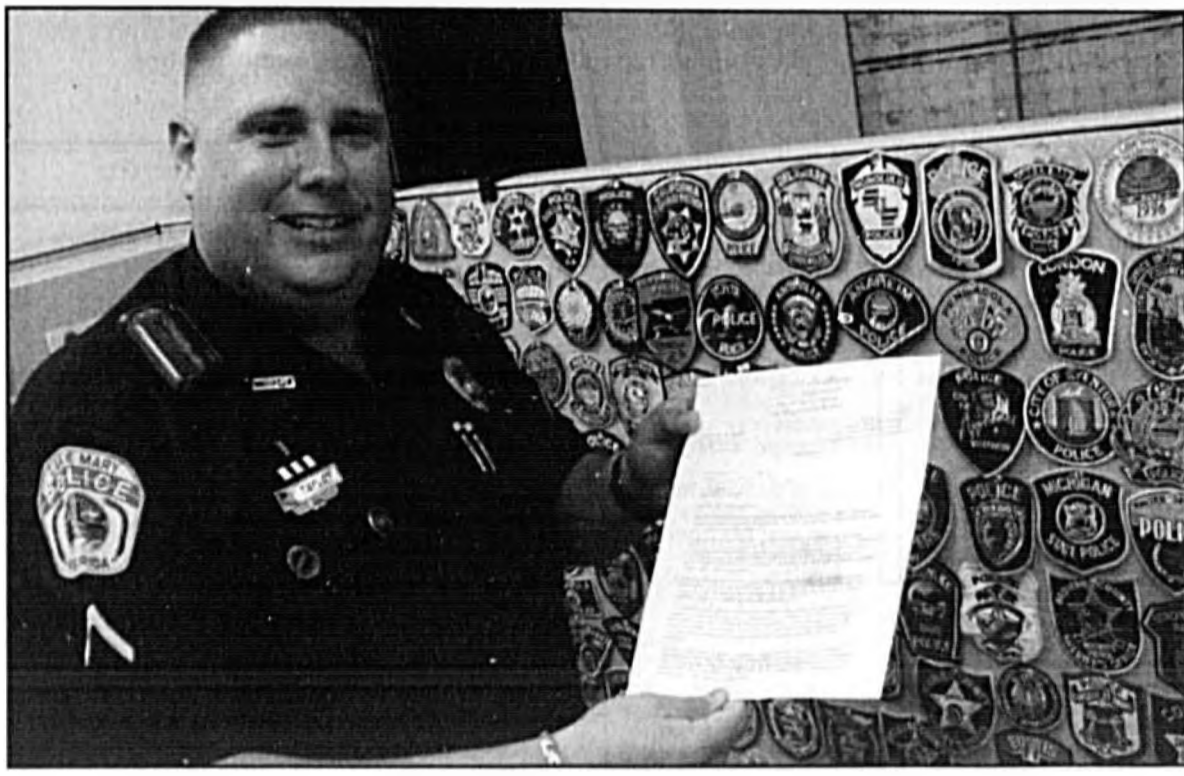
Van Gaale declined in part because media outlets had already requested a received copies of the charges through the Florida public records laws.

Following that meeting, Lessard continued to lobby Grieshaber for reduced punishment.

"I told the mayor that I was not about to have Andrew back on the second deck," Grieshaber wrote in a July 14 memo, "and that his presence would effectively render my leadership a nullity."

arrested for serving alcohol to a minor.

Amanda is one of a half-dozen undercover operatives that the Lake Mary Police Department uses in its Juvenile Alcohol Beverage Enforcement Detail.

During nine operations, the department has made 36 arrests — 29 for selling alcohol to a minor under 21 and seven for selling tobacco to a minor under 18.

On July 7, for the first time, each of 20 businesses visited during an operation were found in compliance.

None sold any alcohol or tobacco to the minors, according to Officer Chris Taylor, detail commander.

The detail checks restaurants, convenience stores and grocery stores, Taylor said. He said Lake Mary had experienced an increase in the number of underage people attempting to buy alcohol.

The police department started the program because the latest mortality data states that car crashes are the leading cause of death for young people between 15

and 20 years old, Taylor said. Many of the accidents are influenced by alcohol.

Taylor said the young people in the program are trained not to beg to be served. An undercover officer goes into the establishment with the young person. A uniformed officer waits somewhere outside.

The young people carry valid Florida identification. They are told not to lie about their age, Taylor said. This ensures that they are not tricking the store personnel, he explained.

Clerks or waiters who sell the products to minors are usually given notice to appear in court. Some have been handcuffed on the premises depending on how they react, Taylor said. Some have had previous warrants for their arrest as well. All are considered arrested, he said, adding that only the person who makes the sale and not the manager or owner of the business is arrested.

People convicted of selling the products to minors cannot become managers, Taylor

said. Amanda said she usually goes on an operation about once a month. She admits she was nervous at first, but said they started her at a Publix where they rarely sell anything to a minor.

Once a sale is made, she said, she walks outside to a uniformed officer close by.

Her friends think it is great that she does this, and she said, some have asked how they could get into the program.

"We're not meant to deceive the employees," Amanda said. "We're not tricking anybody. We look our age and we tell the truth."

The Lake Mary Police Department provides classes for businesses and their employees, Taylor said. The training includes proper checking of identification and the legal consequences of selling these products to minors.

Taylor tells most businesses when they comply with the law, he said, unless they sell to minors often.

To begin, the project storefront will open Tuesdays from noon to 4 p.m. and Wednesdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Jernigan said the goal is to open five days a week. She added that the project should have its own storefront in the mall in two or three months.

So seniors can stop by with a problem. They can also call or contact the office through the Internet.

The phone number is 407-571-8462. Voice mail will be set up soon, organizers said.

Jernigan has been involved as a volunteer setting up the project since March, she said. She has heard about the roofing scams to which seniors often fall victim.

The supposed roofers show up and inspect the home. They always find a problem and want money up front, Jernigan said. Trusting seniors write a check and do not get any work for the money.

Project volunteers will listen and direct the seniors to the right law enforcement agency or other resources.

Another problem Jernigan expects at the mall will be impulse buying. When seniors buy something they may not need, then take it back but are refused, Jernigan said the volunteers will talk with the store to see what can be worked out.

The scams can amount to thousands of dollars, Jernigan

said. The same project in Orange County recently returned \$4,000 to a senior who had been duped.

Officer Paul Machovina is community oriented policing coordinator for the Altamonte Springs Police Department. He said seniors are sometimes embarrassed to bring the situations to police officers.

Rather than having to tell a 20-year-old police officer about the problem, another senior may be less intimidating and even more understanding.

In a non-criminal case, he added, there isn't much the police can do. Now they can refer the person to the Seniors vs. Crime Project.

Since the project is connected with the Florida Attorney General's Office, other resources will be available, Machovina said. The attorney general can put pressure on licensing of a contractor who may try to con a senior. Investigative resources from the state office may be available as well.

Machovina said children or other relatives may get seniors to open up to the Senior Sleuths. This could be a resource for them when mom or dad or grandparents don't want to report a crime or problem.

Often, Jernigan said, people just want their money back.

"I'm excited," she said of

the possibilities. "I've gone around to a couple of places to talk with seniors about the program."

She said they also need volunteers to be sleuths. The project has 18 people, but will need additional help as more people use the service.

Some of the work will be answering phones or doing paperwork to record the cases, she said. Others will resolve situations.

Sleuths need to be people-oriented, she said. It would help if they have a background working with people or in law, she added.

Eight counties now have storefronts. Seminole will be the ninth.

Volunteers receive classroom training and then one-on-one training for about two weeks until they get used to the process. Sleuths are required to live in Florida for part of the year and speak English, but a second language would be valuable as well.

According to statistics from Attorney General Charlie Crist's office, the storefront projects have recovered more than \$2.3 million for seniors. The project started in 1989.

The Reali family and friends have blanketed the Sanford area with posters of Vincent and information on his disappearance. Until the truck was found, practically no information surfaced.

Bean said the Sheriff's Office is processing the SUV for evidence. He couldn't tell how long it may take.

Dominic said of the disappearance that it appeared Vincent meant to leave for a short time.

"He left his briefcase and he left the lights on," Dominic said. He did lock the door, he added.

The family is looking at placing posters in the Winter Garden area, he said. He described his brother as a happy person.

"He'll help anyone," Dominic said. The brothers have a different circle of friends, he said, because he

is married and Vincent is single.

Vincent lives with his parents on the same property as the business. Dominic said Vincent helps their parents quite a bit and he is home almost every night.

Bean said he found it strange that the Pathfinder was found locked. Investigators are trying to determine Vincent's connection with the area.

The delay in the information given to the public was to allow investigators to use the information in their investigation, according to a July 15 press statement from the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

Vincent wore blue jeans and a black and white shirt with an "8" on the back the day he disappeared. He is 5-foot, 9-inches tall and weighs about 175 pounds.

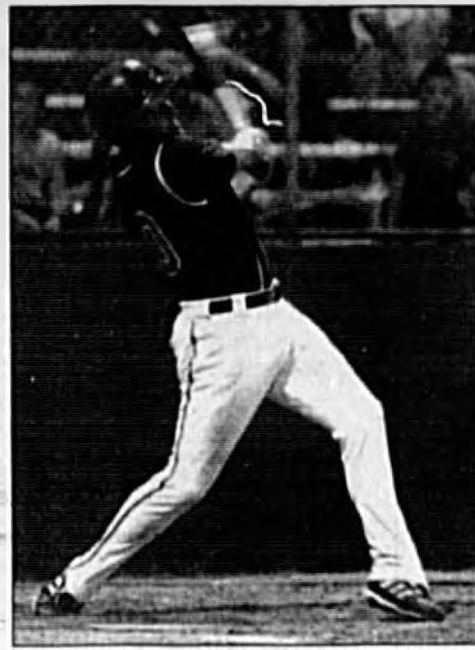

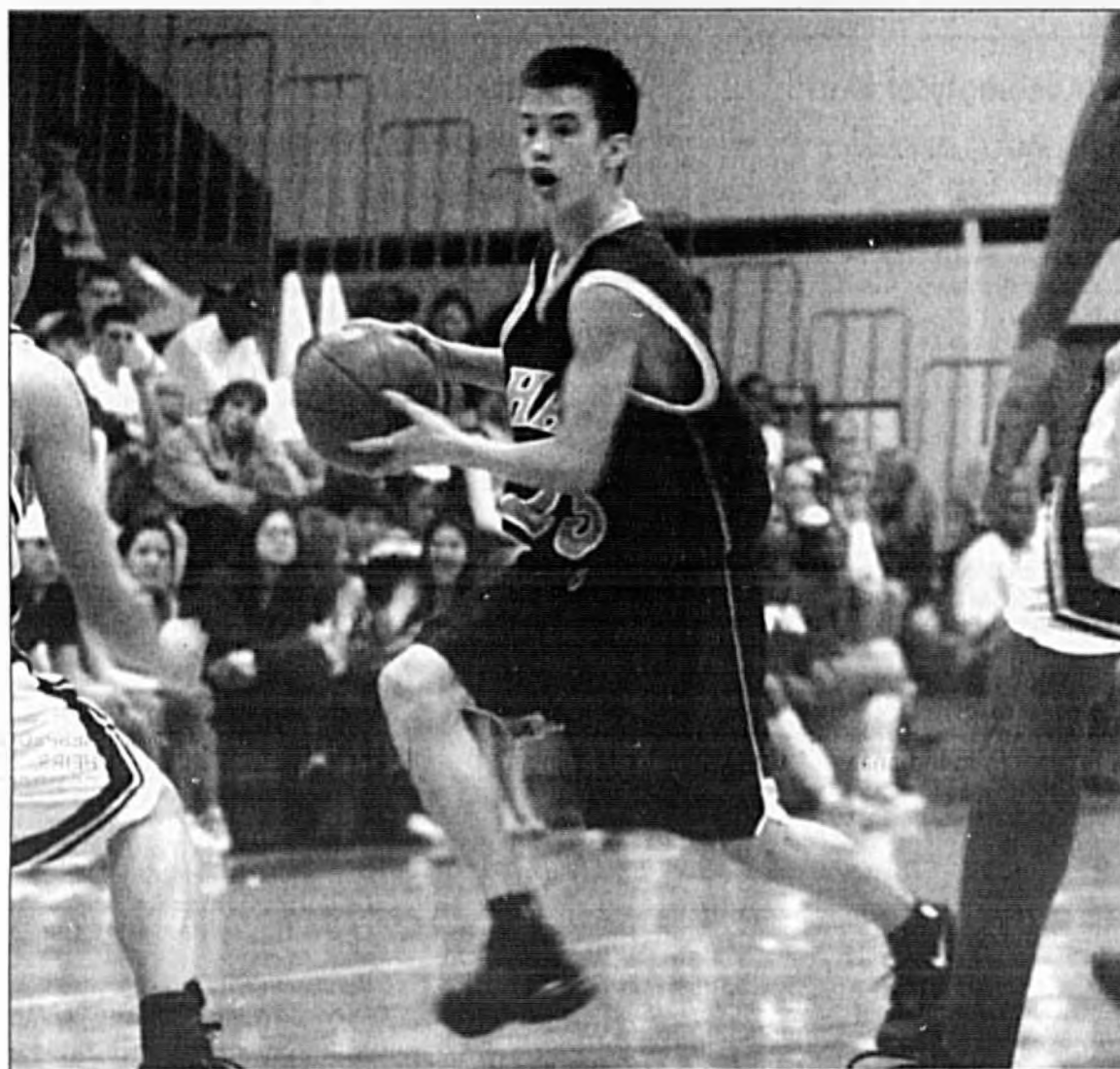
Currently, the Seminole Raiders, an 18-and-Under team consisting of present and future Seminole Community College players, is taking part in the Division I Girls Basketball Championships.

Four local girl weightlifters at U.S. Olympic Training Center

Four Central Florida teenage girls are at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs to train with U.S. Olympic weightlifting coaches for almost two weeks prior to the beginning of the 2004 Olympic Games.

Turkoglu also appeared in 10 playoff games, averaging 7.7 ppg., 4.5 rpg. and 1.5 apg. in 27.1 mp.

Said Turkoglu, "It feels great to be with the Magic. This is a great opportunity for me and gives new life to my career. I'm very excited and can't wait to get started with my new teammates."

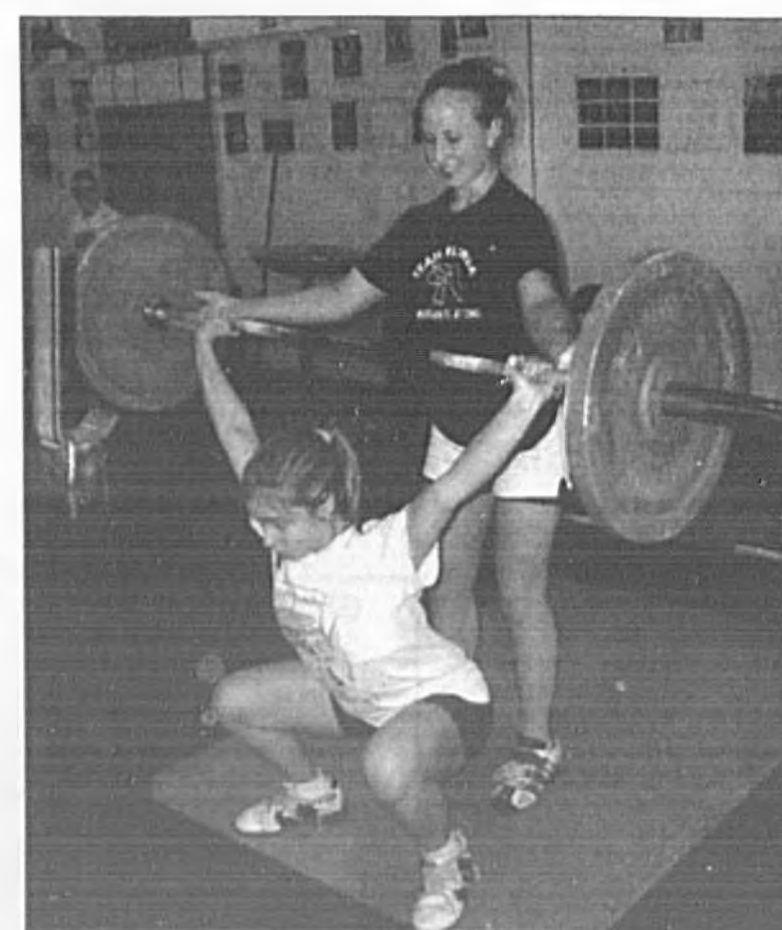

The team is coached by John Calathes, the father of Nick, and Dave Krazit, who played at Seminole Community College for Joe Sterling.

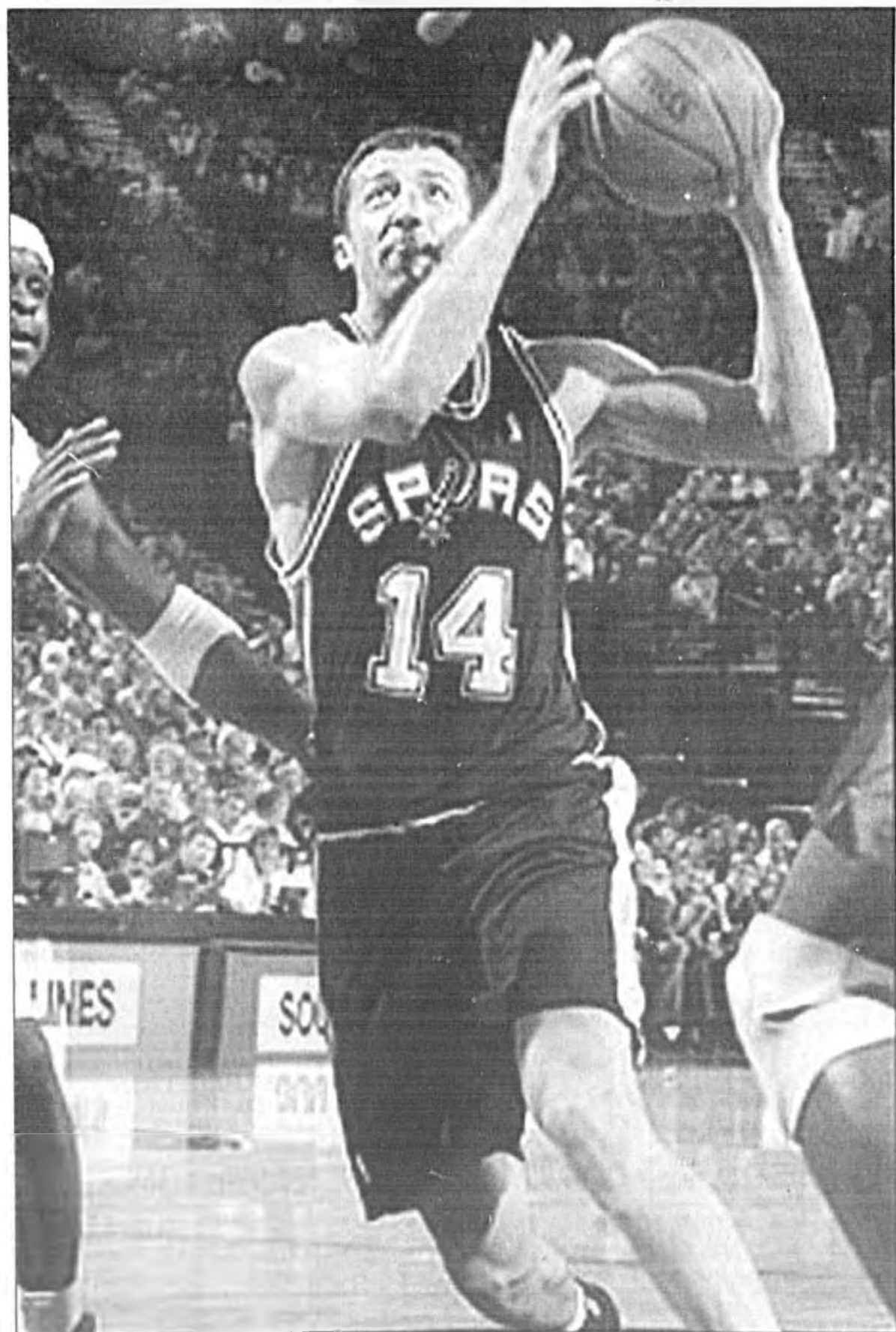

County seeks land-use authority

SANFORD — Seminole County commissioners want voters to give them more authority on land use, but the City of Winter Springs does not see a need for it.

"For some reason, they don't want the eastern part of the county developed," said Winter Springs Mayor John Bush.

The county voted unanimously to ask voters to approve an amendment that would give commissioners the authority to approve land-use changes in the eastern part of the county.

Sanford, Oviedo, and Winter

Springs border the area in question. Bush, reached by cell phone out of town, said he didn't know why the county wanted to do this. The city had not received the proposed amendment yet.

That is because the county hasn't finalized the wording, according to county officials.

Since 1991, the county has had an urban service boundary, said Matthew West, manager of the county planning.

At that time, the state was concerned about the density in the eastern part of the county. The zoning was one home per acre. That was changed beyond this boundary and lowered to three or five or even 10-acre lots.

"We want to limit development in this area because it's environmentally sensitive," West said.

The eastern third of the county contains probably the richest environmental assets of the county, besides the Wekiva River area, he said.

The area is ecologically diverse, but there is also a lifestyle issue, he said. How much of the county should remain undeveloped, and how much should become urban.

If zoning there is not low density, what municipality will widen roads like state roads 46 and 426 or provide services? Those are questions that need to be discussed.

Winter Springs has annexed several

properties in the area, but has not assigned them an urban zoning designation, West said. The areas continue to have the county zoning status and land use designation.

If they assign city zoning designations to the areas, then the issues may have to be arbitrated, he said.

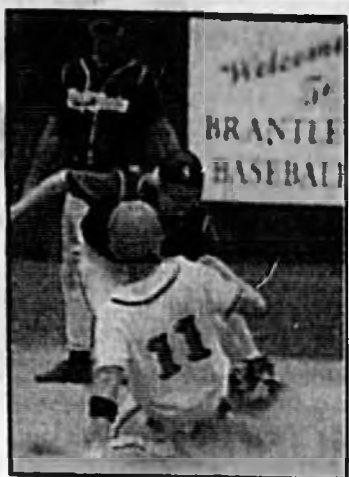
"Our attitude is to follow the state law," Busy said. If a development meets requirements, the city tries to accommodate them, he said. There are laws that govern development, even in environmentally sensitive areas, he added.

The mayor said Winter Springs did

New zoo property would aid education

SANFORD — Seminole County agreed July 13 to match state funding to purchase a tract of land and expand the Central Florida Zoo.

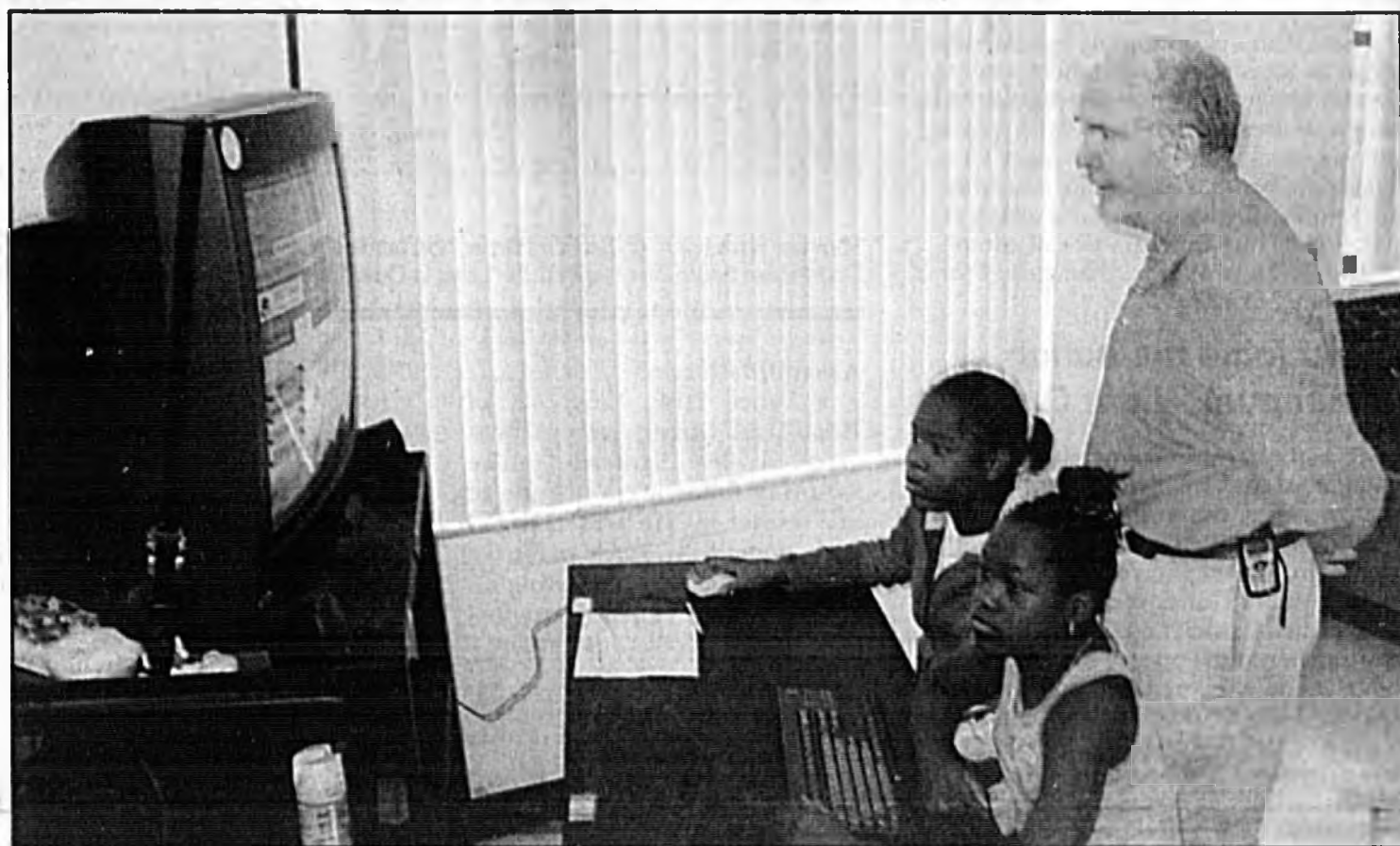
"We haven't actually acquired yet," Montisano said.

Seminole County received a 2003 Florida Communities Trust matching grant on behalf of the Central Florida Zoo to acquire the Woodland Park property west of the zoo.

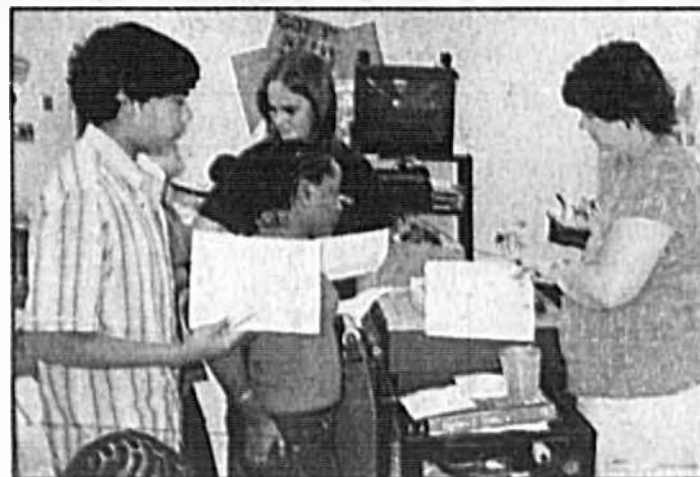

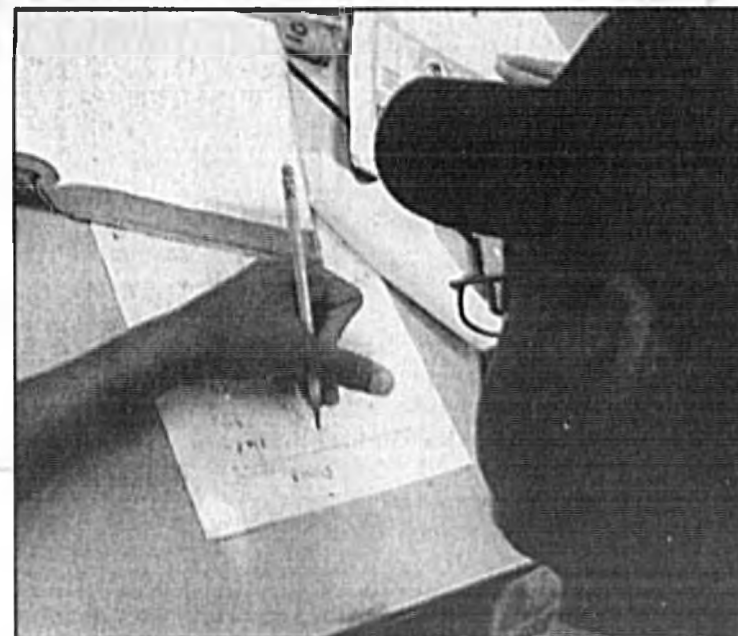

Pastor gave 10 years to Lake Mary parish

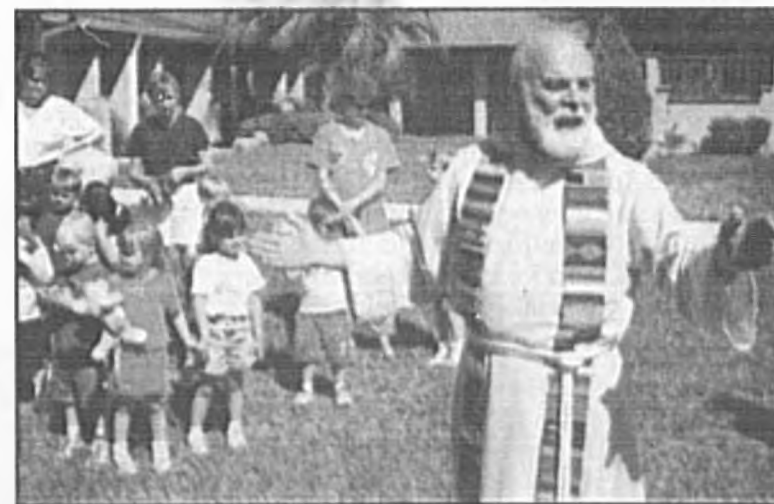
