

County Commission Actions

The threatened flooding of SR 434 by Island Lake south and north was ordered investigated by Commissioner Greg Drummond Tuesday.

Drummond told the board and County Engineer Bill Bush he has received complaints that rising waters in the north section of the lake are bottlenecked. He asked Bush to check the lake levels on both sides of the state highway and the weir and pipe system on the north side, co-ordinating his efforts with the LAgrwood city engineer.

County officials repeatedly stated fears since Longwood annexed the section on the north side of the highway and allowed a subdivision to develop there that the road would be endangered during the rainy season.

In other action, the board instructed Bush to release use permits to Altamonte Springs and allow the city to install a 12-inch water main in the Douglas Avenue right-of-way. Permits for were waived.

Commissioner Dick Williams said the increased water supply will provide better pressure and fire flow for the county areas served by the city system.

Permit conditions are that the city install the pipe on the right-of-way shoulder and keep the pavement unobstructed. Bush was authorized to stop work if the rules are not followed.

Fire And Arbor Codes

A fire protection code for the unincorporated areas of the county was reviewed in work session and placed on the agenda for action at next Tuesday's meeting.

The proposed ordinance includes a fire prevention bureau to enforce the law outside fire control districts in unincorporated areas.

It is to be reviewed in work session at 11 a.m. next Tuesday and is scheduled for public hearing at 7 p.m. the same day.

The board adopted an arbor ordinance which has been under consideration for many months. Assistant County Atty. Howard Marsee said the law will become effective when notification has been received from the secretary of state that the document has been filed in Tallahassee.

Marsee urged the board take action as soon as possible to set a fee schedule for permits, required in the ordinance, before certain trees are destroyed.

Hazardous Situation

A three-foot deep washout on Longwood Hills Road, termed an extremely hazardous situation, was ordered brought to the attention of Longwood officials by J.C. Lavender, county road superintendent.

The board told Lavender to if Longwood is unable to correct the problem immediately to take county crews in to repair the road.

Zoning Director J.B. Williams reported the new zoning commitments inspector in a review of board minutes over the past several months found that building permits have been issued without receipt of monies committed for the school board. Williams said the inspector was able to collect two cash commitments totaling \$1,160.

Greater Flexibility

Amendments to Seminole Zoological Society's lease of the Lake Monroe property where a new zoo and botanical gardens are to be constructed were approved by the board.

Clifford Nelson, society president, said the changes will give his group greater flexibility while retaining county control.

The major change will allow the society to let contracts of up to \$10,000 without requiring performance bonds and 10 per cent retainage of contractors' money.

The society, which Nelson said will spend \$350,000 this year, may also use any contractor in Florida, rather than just Seminole County business firms.

County Planner Roger Neisewander is to see that everything built conforms with architectural plans.

County Budget Delayed

Adoption of the county's rate of ad valorem taxation and budget for the new year was delayed one week after public hearing Tuesday night.

A law passed in the last session of the Legislature, appears to give the circuit court clerk responsibility for collecting the interest on bonded county funds with payment to the county delayed until the end of the new year.

Anticipated interest in the new budget is \$146,000. If the interest is not channeled directly into county coffers, an anticipated tax cut will dwindle to .07 mill rather than the .23 mill expected to make up the difference.

Summit Draws Many Leaders

ALGIERS (AP) — Leaders from 76 nations assembled in Algiers today for the fourth nonaligned summit conference, a meeting they hope will increase their influence and bargaining power with the industrialized nations.

More than half the nations were represented by their kings, presidents or prime ministers. The summit was President Tito of Yugoslavia, founder of the nonaligned movement.

The four-day conference is expected to approve a series of resolutions on such issues as natural resources, decolonization, the Middle East, territorial fishing limits, nuclear weapons and the international monetary system.

Drafting committees worked until early today, rounding up the proposals from various nations and seeking preliminary consensus.

Algeria, the conference host, had prepared texts on practically every item on the agenda and was expected to exert a strong influence behind the scenes.

Marlin Wins Freedom In Fight

HONOLULU (AP) — Somewhere in the Pacific near there swims a marlin who fought so fiercely to remain free that he hospitalized one of his would-be captors.
