PHILADELPHIA, Apr. 3.—(AP)—Eight persons were killed and scores of others injured in a series of explosions today at the plant of the Pennsylvania Fire Works Display Company, Inc., at Devon, 16 miles west of Philadelphia.

The first of the series of explosions occurred at about 9:30 A. M., and shock houses and other buildings in the neighborhood were again shaken by successive vibrations.

JONES HITS OLD STRIDE IN TAKING GOLF TOURNEY

Atlanta Player Does 72 Holes In 13 Less Shots Than Rivals

AUGUSTA, Ga., Apr. 2.—(AP)—The golfing house of Robert Jones was back in order today.

The Atlanta amateur and national open champion shot a 72 on the first day of the Atlanta open tournament here today with a total of 294, 13 strokes better than the field and his rival, Byron Smith, the Craton, N. H. professional.

Missing in the hole, that earned him the title of one of the greatest golfers of the age, Jones won a second round in the final 18 holes. Smith, last year's professional, a second man in the tournament, gained the \$1,000 cash prize.

His long ago hobby and passion met for the first time at Savannah, in the first open ever held in Georgia's history. The amateur and the pro fought almost to a standstill. Bobby finally gliding under by one stroke.

Since that time Bobby has been making his time until he could get another chance at Smith. The opportunity came here and Jones was more than equal to the occasion. He was effective in the competitive drive.

Last night Bobby packed his golf clubs for the first time in competitive golf until he returns from England. He will leave late next month for England to captain the Walker Cup team in another foreign invasion. He has announced that he is going to attend to his law practice in Atlanta and practice with friends until the ship sails.

The south's first open had been widely heralded as "Jones against the field" and the advance notice was carried out in letters as well as in spirit. But there was little of the way of competition that was offered to Bobby's dazzling play.

Jones came within one stroke of equalling the course record in the third round when he landed in a 68, two under par. He shot par 71 in the final 18 holes. He was using his long wood and iron club proficiency and old and new clubs by Jones' his pet putter, ran true to his best form.

Smith reached through his two rounds yesterday, starting early in the morning. He completed the 36 holes before 2 P. M. and 45 minutes later was in an airplane dropping golf balls in the practice green at a hotel adjoining the course.

Jones went into the play yesterday leading the field with 111 par golf for the Hill Country at the Augusta County Club, where Monday's play was held. Today final 36 holes were shot on the White Hills Club course, where the hazards of the difficult, heavily wooded and well-trapped layout found among its victims several of the country's leading exponents of the game. Bobby started out yesterday with a long tee shot that par 4 off the rest of the nine, adding birdies on the fifth and seventh for 21, one more par than the rest of the round was completed in par to give Bobby a 69 one stroke high than the competitor recorded to the course set yesterday by Ed Dudley. Three birdies and an eagle on the first five holes of the afternoon round helped him to set the marker of two strokes for a 71, one par.
