Three Killed As Gunmen

Attack President's Compound

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (UPI) - Three people were killed, including one tentatively identified as a U.S. citizen, in an attack by two dozen gunmen on the government compound of President Carlos Humberto Romero. There was no word if Romero was present during the attack Sunday and none of the leftist groups active in the crowded Central American nation of 4.5 million people has yet claimed responsibility for the attack.

There have been increasingly violent confrontations between the right-wing military government and leftist protesters in El Salvador since the successful revolution in neighboring Nicaragua.

Sunday's assault followed the kidnapping Friday of two U.S. businessmen. No demands have been made for the Americans' release.

Jesse Jackson To Mideast

NEW YORK (UPI) - The Rev. Jesse Jackson headed for the Middle East today, criticizing the tone and tactics of PLO chief Yasser Arafat but hoping to convince Israel to talk with the guerrilla group.

Jackson, the latest of a number of Americans black leaders who have flocked to the Middle East since Andrew Young resigned as American U.N. ambassador, stops in Israel before going to Lebanon, Jordan and Egypt. Government officials in Jerusalem have declined to meet Jackson, saying he "prejudged" the issues in the Palestine Liberation Organization's favor, and they assigned a protocol aide to assist him.

Pope Asks World's Prayers

VATICAN CITY (UPI) - Pope John Paul II, emphasizing the importance of his upcoming speech to the United Nations, asked the world to pray for the success of the voyage that will carry him from "green Ireland" to the "soils of Washington." "Again today, I ask you all for the spiritual help of

prayer," the 59-year-old pontiff told more than 25,000 people huddled in rainy St. Peter's square for his Sunday blessing and speech. The pope's Sept. 29-Oct. 7 trip will take him to Ireland and six cities in the United States, including New York

Masked Robbers Net \$1,500 In Holdup

Late Sunday evening two cashiers for the Phillip 66 Food Store, 1201 Airport Blvd., Sanford were surprised by two masked men. one armed, who forced the workers into the walk-in cooler and fled with almost \$1,500.

The first employee approached, Francis Lopez, 26, 510 Alcazer Ave., Altamonte Springs, said a man about five feet, six inches with a stocking mask walked into the store at 10:55 p.m., pointed a revolver at her, told her to "Get in back of the cooler." Ms. Lopez's fellow worker, James O'Neal, 2106 Amelia Ave., Sanford was then told to lay down on the floor of the cooler, Ms. Lopez said. The other robber five feet, seven inches, wore, a halloween mask. Both weighed about 140 pounds, according to the

After a few minutes Ms. Lopez was told to come out of the cooler and help open a cash register for the robbers, according to county deputies. She said they did not know what button to push to release the cash drawer. The bandits ordered Ms. Lopez to help them, then she was told to go back into the cooler. Waiting 15 minutes Ms. Lopez and O'Neal exited the cooler to find the robbers gone with \$1,489 missing.



U.S. Ambassador McHenry Ready For Difficulties

IN BRIEF

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Donald McHenry says he's ready for one of the most difficult U.N. sessions in a decade and his new post as U.S. ambassador, a role Andrew Young "didn't feel free to wish. . . on a friend." The State Department veteran who was hailed by President Carter as a "foreign policy professional" was sworn in at the White House Sunday to replace Young. During the ceremony, Carter affectionately praised Young as "my good friend" and denied reports the former ambassador was replaced because of Jewish outrage at Young's meeting with a representative of the Palestine Liberation Organization.

SOLOMONS ISLAND, Md. (UPI) - Some University of Maryland scientists say there is a good chance a large man-eating shark is swimming around in Chesapeake Bay - and there's just as good a chance he has gone

The scientists, members of a team studying marine life in the bay, were several hundred yards away when the shark made his presence known less than two weeks ago. Now, they say they don't know where he is. The bull shark, a known maneater, ate most of a cownose ray that had been caught in a new Sept. 14 in Eastern Bay, an arm of the bay.

Black Judge Sworn To Bench

COLUMBIA, S.C. (UPI) - Matthew J. Perry, a 58-yearold Columbia attorney and U. S. Military Appeals Court judge, became the first black judge to sit on the federal bench in the South since Reconstruction. Perry was sworn-in Saturday during an poignant ceremony at the U.S. District Courthouse in Columbia.

"What is happening is something that can be taken with pride by all South Carolinians," Perry told a crowd of more than 200 in the tightly packed courtroom. 'I hope you will understand what I am trying to say."

The U.S. Nears **Moment Of Truth**

The recent political violence in El Salvador, coming as it does in the immediate wake of the Sandinista revolution in Nicaragua, is but the latest warning that Central America is a region in crisis.

El Salvador and Guatemala appear poised on the brink of disastrous. revolutions. Honduras is only slightly less threatened. Nicaragua is agonizing through a revolutionary transformation the outcome of which is much in doubt. Costa Rica. while democratic and seemingly stable, is hardly immunized against the ferment sweeping its neighbors. And Panama, whose canal renders it the most strategic of all Central American states, is likewise certain to be affected by the prevailing revolutionary currents.

It is true enough that, with the exception of Costa Rica, the winds of change are long overdue in Central America. Brutally repressive governments and the stark contrast between the vast wealth of the few and the pervasive poverty of the many mark these states as textbook candidates for

In less-troubled times, the form and substance of political change in each of these tiny nations might be considered internal affairs not rightly subject to outside intervention, be it political, economic or military. But these are, of course, supremely troubled times.

The gathering storm in Central America, and in the Caribbean as well, carries with it a very real Marxist threat. The mounting danger is abundantly clear in El Salvador, for example, where anti-government terrorists openly proclaim their allegiance to the tenets of Marxist revolution.

The presence of Cuba as an expanding, fortified Soviet beachhead in the Western Hemisphere transforms the crisis in Central America to a matter of the most profound concern to the United States, Mexico and other hemispheric powers.

The security of the Panama Canal is an obvious worry. Mexico's size, oil reserves and proximity to the United States make it a natural target for longrange Ciban and Soviet strategy. Colombia and Venezuela are only slightly less inviting objectives for a Marxist tide moving north and south from Central America.

With such critical interests in the balance, the United States and its major hemispheric partners have no acceptable choice but to respond to events in Central America while there is yet time to avoid the more serious crisis that indecision invites.

A hemispheric strategy capable of containing the potential threat from Cuba and the Soviet Union is not difficult to envision. Individual revolutions in El Salvador and elsewhere in the region must first be quarantined against manipulation or exploitation by either Moscow or Havana. The Soviets and their Cuban allies must be informed that intervention in any form on the mainland will not be

To underscore the seriousness of this warning, the United States and other members of the Organization of American States should make it clear that joint military action is a distinct possibility if necessary to prevent establishment of a Cuban or Soviet satellite state in Central

Concurrent with efforts to forestall such a possibility, the OAS, and Mexico in particular, could assist Washington in applying appropriate political pressure to induce reforms in those Central American states most threatened by Marxist revolution. Where revolution is seen to be unavoidable, every effort must be made to identify and encourage non-Marxist elements among the

Candor compels us to acknowledge that Washington's benign neglect over a period of decades has led the tempest brewing to the south. What should be overwhelmingly apparent now is that another year or so of similar treatment by the United States will risk a calamity of momentou







Gasoline, Oil Lead Another Big Price Jump

consumer level climbed 1.1 percent in August, led by another big jump in gasoline and heating oil prices, the government reported

With the exception of grocery prices, the cost of most items used by consumers went

The Labor Department's monthly analysis of prices paid by consumers represented another setback to the White House, which has been hoping to see a slackening of inflationary pressure as a result of slowing economic growth.

The 1.1 percent price climb — a 14 percent annual rate - was the seventh consecutive month that consumer costs have risen by 1 percent or more, the department said.

Prices for gasoline and home heating oil continued to surge upward. Gasoline prices at the pump rose 4 percent last month while home heating oil increased 7.1 percent. The Labor Department said the average price for all types of gasoline was 96.7 cents a

gallon last month, up 3.7 cents from July

During the first eight months of 1979, average gasoline prices have surged by 28.2 cents a

The average price for a gallon of home heating oil was 80 cents last month and has now climbed by 25.5 cents per gallon in 1979,

Housing costs, the government said, rose 1.4 percent for the largest increase of the year. Besides heating oil, house prices jumped 1.5 percent and financing costs rose 3 percent last month.

Furthermore, the cost of clothing rose 0.7 percent after three consecutive months of

The only bright news in the report was that food and beverage prices were unchanged over the month, the best performance of 1979, and grocery store costs fell 0.3 percent.

The Labor Department said its price index for all urban consumers stood at 221.1 last month. That means goods and services which cost \$100 in 1967 were prices at \$221.10 in

Sanford Taps Attorney For Sands Lawsuit

named special attorney to defend the city of Sanford and Police Chief Ben Butler in a lawsuit filed by former police

Sands is suing the city, alleging his rights under state statute called the "Police Bill of Rights" were violated when he was fired from a position with the city police department. The city has claimed however, that Sands was serving only as a probationery officer and thus did not come under the protection of the state law.

Named as defendants in the suit filed by Sands or

Nov. 30, 1978, are the city, Butler and City Manager City Attorney C. Vernon Mize Jr. told city com-
