80-Year-Old Paper Interesting Reading

Some people accomplish this by taking in an old Charlie Chaplin or Laurel and Hardy film. By far the best way is through old copies of newspapers and other periodicals. Up in the attic of many homes are old copies of magazines or newspapers. Many times the papers were used in packing. James O. Otto, of DeBarry, is more fortunate than most. When Otto wants to glance at the happenings of the "most audacious" tabloid newspaper founded by his grandfather, Ely Otto, in 1877, he has to go to the attic. The book is a bound edition of the March 1880 through February 1881 copies of the Savannah Local. The book carries a little more meaning to Otto than a book of newspapers following with age. The Savannah Local was a weekly tabloid newspaper founded by his grandfather, Ely Otto, in 1877. The DeBarry resident took possession of the book in 1966 when his father died. Having passed through three generations the book has more emotional value than monetary. However, the Savannah Morning News offered Otto \$150 for it back in 1964. Considering inflation, the book certainly has increased in value since then. The Savannah Local is a good barometer of the attitudes and life style of what appears now to have been a pressureless living in the "Gay Nineties." The temperance movement was rampant and editor and proprietor Ely Otto devoted at least two columns of front page space to the Georgia Term of Hechmate, an anti-alcohol group. Conspicuously absent from the pages of the Savannah Local are stories of questionable political actions, foreign policy and reports of the military movements in various geographic areas of the world. 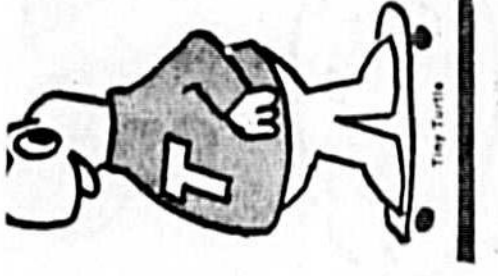

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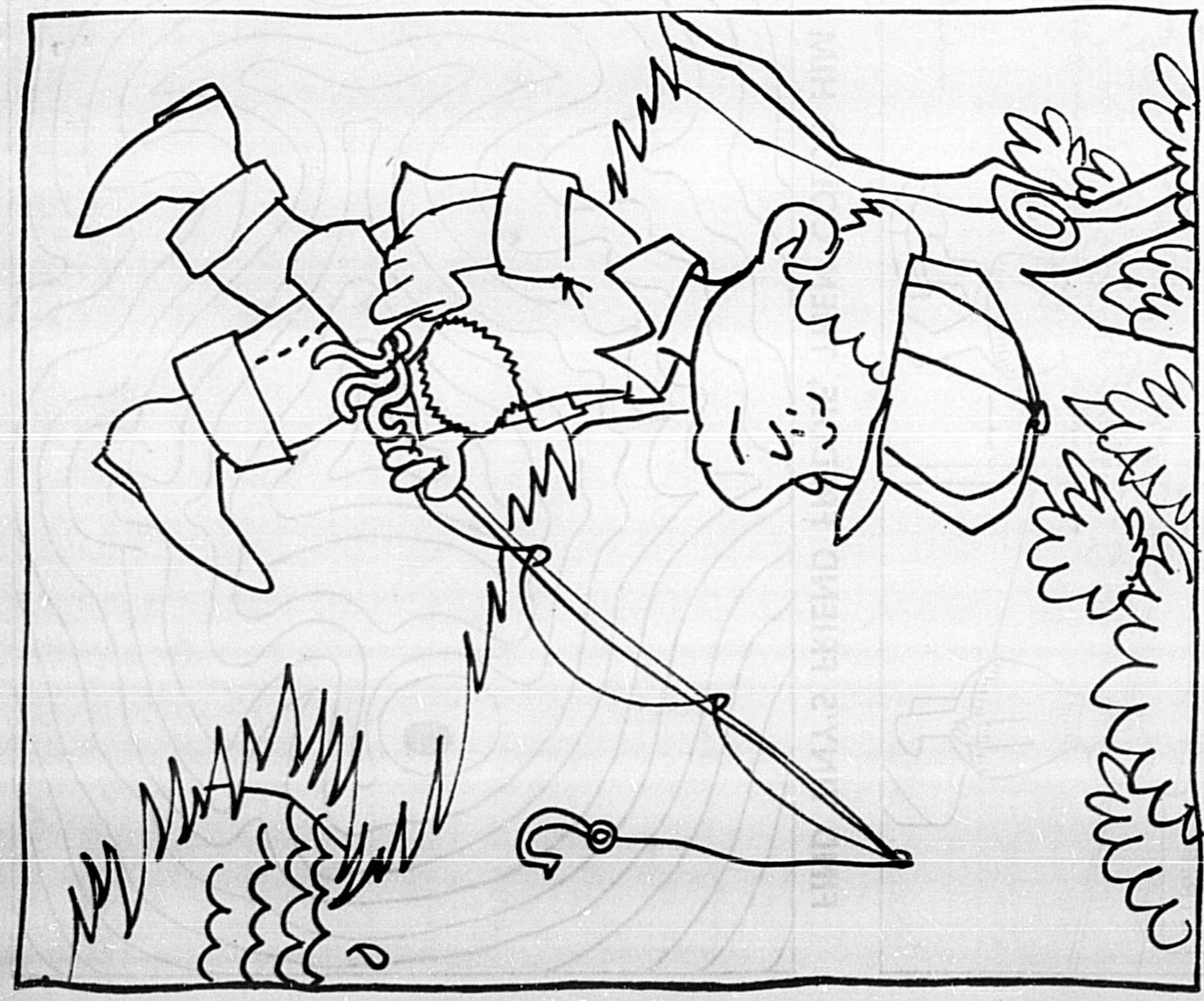

Apollo 15 Well On Its Way

Drive On Moon Is Next On Agenda

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — America's Apollo 15 explorers rocketed out of earth orbit today and streaked toward the moon on another search for lunar secrets. They are to conduct man's first driving expedition on the surface, a quest among towering mountains and along side a deep canyon.

Col. David R. Scott, Lt. Col. James B. Irwin and Maj. Alfred M. Worden, all Air Force officers, broke away from the embrace of earth's gravity at 12:30 p.m. EDT as a jarring rocket blast shot them out of orbit and sent them winging toward their distant target, and one of history's greatest scientific explorations.

For nearly three hours, the astronauts had circled the globe in the command ship Endeavour, checking the craft's hundreds of systems before committing themselves to the three-day outward voyage. Then they reignited the third stage of their Saturn 5 rocket and their speed accelerated from about 17,400 to about 24,200 miles per hour.

The Saturn 5 propelled them away from their home planet right on time at 2:14 a.m. at an estimated one million persons watched in the Cape Kennedy area.

"Good job," Scott told the launch crew. "It was a very smooth ride all the way."

All three stages of the Saturn 5 fired precisely on schedule and propelled the spacemen riding in the command ship Endeavour into earth orbit more than 100 miles high.

For three days, Scott, Irwin and Worden are to soar across the vast ocean of space and fire into lunar orbit Thursday.

SPACE CENTER, HOUSTON (AP) — A Russian named Alexi Leonov started it all in 1964 when he stepped into weightless space and twisted and turned and flipped with an effortless, abandoned joy.

Films of the cosmonaut cavorting freely, without the restraint of gravity, fascinated the world.

An American joined the game months later.

On Gemini 4, in March 1965, astronaut Edwin H. White stepped out of his spacecraft

and floated free, restrained only by a tether and a hose feeding oxygen into his space suit.

For 21 minutes White frolicked like a child. And when it was over, he returned reluctantly to the spacecraft.

"Aw, gee," he said, "this is the saddest moment of my life." That was the last of the fun space walks.

Officials realized that if man was to conquer space astronauts had to be able to do useful space walks.

It has taken six years, but the day of a useful, necessary space walk arrives Aug. 5 during Apollo 15.

Tampa-Daytona Corridor High-Speed Study Proceeding
