



"Freedom from something is not enough, It should also be freedom for something. Freedom is not safety but opportunity.

"Freedom ought to be a means to enable the press to serve the proper functions of communication in a free society."

The Federal Trade Commission's decision to regulate advertising, starting with the automobile industry, could have one possibly good result: It may add some analysts to the government payroll and to that degree help solve the unemployment problem. Meanwhile, on the othpaperwork, more nit-picking and higher legal

To what end? If the FTC's purpose is to stop advertising falsehoods, where there are any, it has the requisite powers and probably the necessary staff. But to halt the preening and puffery that goes with selling is as hopeful an enterprise as setting up an FTC sub-section to stop women from using cosmetics. These cosmetics do prevent bachelors from getting a true, honest look at reality - but does anybody com-

The consumerist and advertising-regulator have too low an opinion of the intelligence of the reader. For example, anyone who has read this far knows that The Roanoke Times, like all newspapers ,depends on advertising for its very existence. Knowing this, the reader will examine the argument more critically because the editorial might not be as objective as it is intended to be. Taking all the circumstances into account, the reader may accept the opinion; he may discount it or reject it entirely. If he feels strongly about it, he may fire off a strong letter to the editor (a privilege readers ought to use more often).

In any event, the reader is not likely to be fooled too often by editorials or by advertising. Readers are not dumb. They may welcome protection against outright lies and short-counts at a big establishment to help them to detect puf-

So many of us approach tasks, challenges, opportunities, with a nagging conviction of our own failure, even before we begin. We need more faith in ourselves. Self-faith comes only from a far greater faith! Faith in God.

Face up to your own "fencewalking." In the course of life, we all have to do quite a bit of it. Find the courage to start by listening to what your church
