

The horrors of a total war and the work that the Salvation Army has been doing in France are told in a letter from William Booth Davey, director of the Salvation Army with the British Expenditionary Force.

The letter is in part as follows: My dear Chief:

"You will naturally be anxious to know what is happening to us over here. The following is a summary of the events to date, from the time that I dictated a letter to my daughter for you on the hoat at Le Havre on Saturday morning last.

"I then went to Dieppe and learnt that Le Treport had been hombed. We went over to see if Major and Mrs. Anseembe and workers were alright. We had only been there a few minutes when the town was raided and bombed again.

"We were out on the road outside the Canteen, when the plane raid dropped a bomb on a house about one hundred yards away, where Major and Mrs. Anseembe had been living until we built a small bumpslow for them in the garden at the last of the Club. If they had atill here, there they would probably have been in the smash. The planes were really trying to destroy the railway and harbour.


