

School enrollment for the past year was 26,062. And savings to the county through use of the program over the next five years is estimated at from \$8 million to \$12 million, Board Chairman Allan F. Keeth told members of the interested audience.

Member Pat Buie at the same time pointed out some method had to be found where school buildings which represent a large taxpayer investment can be used more. Buildings currently are being used less than half the year, considering the five-day week, he said. Pointing to Lyman High School, in particular, he said that plant could be used for triple sessions.

The Political Pot At A Rolling Boil

There is just no telling what the overheating political pot will brew up and spill out into an atmosphere which has already provided some smells which are as unbelievable as they are

The last weekend provided such an instance. This, of course, was the detection and arrest of five men involved in a break-in at the Democratic National Committee headquarters in Washington and the identification of one as on the payroll of the Committee For The Re-election

Former Attorney-General John N. Mitchell is the chairman of that committee and when informed of the arrest, immediately issued a denial that the man in question was "operating either in our behalf or with our consent.

Chairman Lawrence F. O'Brien, of the Democratic National Committee, bristling with indignation, has now asked that the FBI investigate the affair and do so with the newly appointed Attorney-General Richard G. Kleindienst providing the spur.

So it goes and so such affairs will go as there seems to be no limit as to what tactics those who are fighting for the second term for President Nixon do with, evidently, no holds barred. Already with or without the knowledge of the

probable GOP presidential nominee, this reelection campaign has provided instances where the power of the free press and the ability of the free press has been challenged by his associates.
