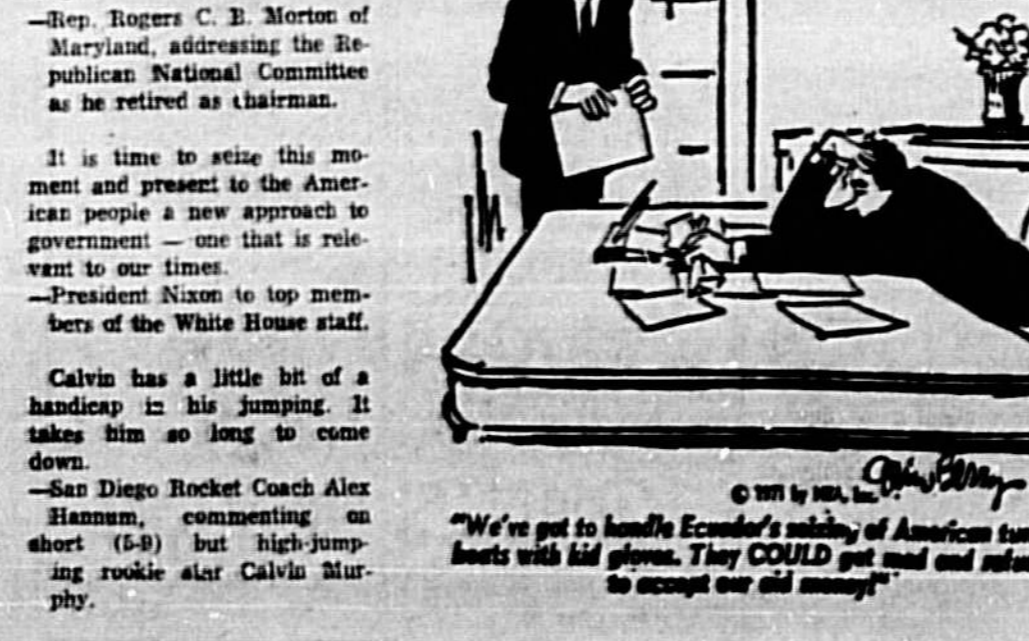

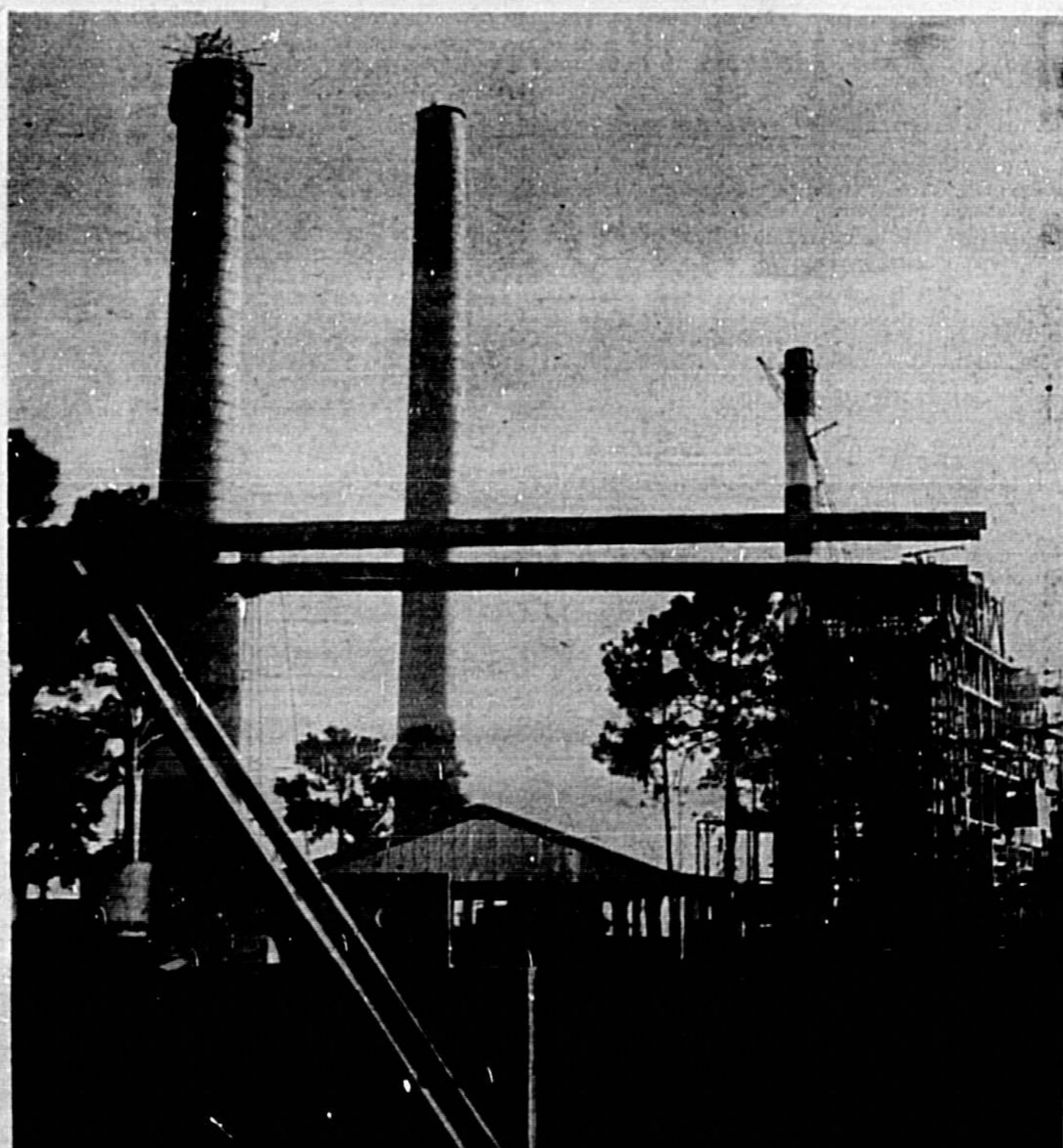

Kennedy Challenges President

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., says President Nixon's Vietnamization policy will lead to expansion of the war in Indochina.

"Vietnamization means war and more war," Kennedy said Wednesday in an address to a business executives' peace group. "It has nothing to do with an end to violence. It is a policy of violence."

Kennedy said he was disappointed and dismayed that Americans had not protested more about the incursion into Laos.

"A gross step was taken in the invasion of Laos and unlike times past the people of this nation have uttered hardly a word of protest," Kennedy said. "No trains are coming from New York now filled with the finest legal minds. No law schools have prepared their briefs on the constitutionality of it all. My mail room is not flooded with telegrams; no Senate committees are meeting in public."

Nixon Puts Hanoi On Notice

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon has advised North Vietnam he is ready to reallocate with massive airpower anywhere it is needed in Indochina to protect American troops.

Repeating a pledge made three weeks ago by Secretary of State William P. Rogers, the President said: "I am not going to place any limitation upon the use of airpower..." ruling out only nuclear weapons.

Nixon's statement at a news conference Wednesday in his Oval Office put Hanoi on notice that either of several trusts could provoke a U.S. bombing response.

Although Indochina dominated the 45-minute news conference, Nixon made these other points:

—Should construction industry leaders fail to agree on a voluntary wage and price freeze, the federal government will use its power to bring about "more reasonable settlements" than the customary 16 per cent wage increase and to stabilize prices.

—Federal law does not allow the government to force zoning changes as a means of combating housing segregation.

—He is not surprised his revenue-sharing proposal has encountered rough sledding in Congress and among labor and business organizations. "Down in the valley, where the people live, you will find there that the people in the front lines, the governors, the mayors, the county officials, an overwhelming majority of them are for revenue sharing."

—He rejected a suggestion he use his influence to overcome apparent Israeli objections to mediator Gumat V. Jarring's latest peace proposal for the Middle East. He said Israel and the United Arab Republic have been "more forthcoming than we expected" and a "three-and-a-half" relationship might develop.

Moreover, Nixon said, there is no reason to interpret the action in southern Laos as a thrust against Communist China.

"As you know, the Communist Chinese have been operating in southern Laos for some time," he said. "But this action is not directed against Communist China."

"It is directed against the North Vietnamese who are pointed towards South Vietnam and toward Cambodia."

Tanned and smiling, the President welcomed follow-up questions on Indochina. He overrode two efforts to conclude the session, his first press conference since Dec. 10.

At the end, only two dozen of the 71 reporters who had clustered around his desk remained.

Nixon Aide Tells Solons Of 'Blind Trust' Assets

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of Commerce Maurice H. Stans says a blind trust he set up before joining the Cabinet has been "totally blind" all though he has received information from companies whose securities are in the account.

Stans also declared in a six-page statement Wednesday that he fully disclosed all his financial holdings in a report to the Senate Commerce Committee Jan. 12, 1969 a few days before he was confirmed.

Stans said in his statement that he had disqualified himself from any role in the Penn Central negotiations. The administration later abandoned the planned loan as politically "risky."

Stans did not list any specific holdings in Great Southwest in his financial statement to the senate committee. But he did refer to an "undivided interest... of indeterminable value" in two partnerships, Staats & Co. and Glorie Forgan Staats & Co. Glorie Forgan was the Penn Central's investment adviser for most of the past decade.

In his statement Wednesday, Stans said the partnerships did not own any great Southwest stock when he was confirmed but did have options, on the stock of Macco Development Corp., another Penn subsidiary later merged with Great Southwest.

President Plans Counter Demo Ideas

Major Insurance Switch Urged

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon's health care message to Congress proposes a major switch in medical financing for lower income groups and comprehensive health insurance for many higher paid workers.

Nixon's plans, which counter sweeping Democratic blueprints for national health insurance, remained undecided only hours before he sent them to Capitol Hill today, but the sources said the provisions included:

—Federally subsidized medical and hospital insurance to replace the federal-state Medicaid program for families earning less than \$3,000 a year.

—A new requirement that all interstate businesses with more than 25 employees offer comprehensive health insurance to workers earning more than \$3,000 a year.

Also in the omnibus health package, the sources said, are provisions to encourage prepaid, group medical practice, to stimulate medical school expansions and to combat cancer and sickle cell anemia, a disease that afflicts Negroes.

Administration health planners indicate the new insurance for the poor and the insurance employers must provide will also gain in present health coverage and meet the President's State of the Union goal "that no American family will be prevented from obtaining basic medical care by inability to pay."

The Nixon package falls midway between organized medicine's plan for universal, government-subsidized private health insurance without structural change in health practice and the proposal of some influential Democrats in Congress for cradle-to-grave, federally financed and run health insurance.

Counted as a sure thing only weeks ago but missing from the administration plan is federal catastrophe insurance to cover the cost of major illnesses and long hospitalizations. The sources said.

Congress is considered likely to pass some sort of major health legislation in the next two years because of consumer unrest over soaring medical and hospital bills.

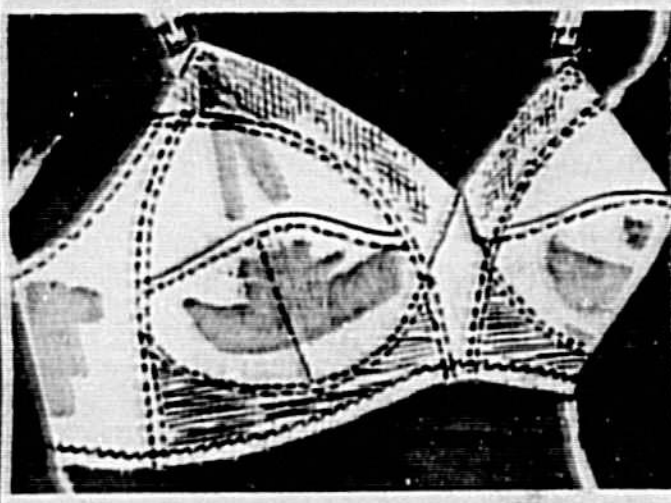

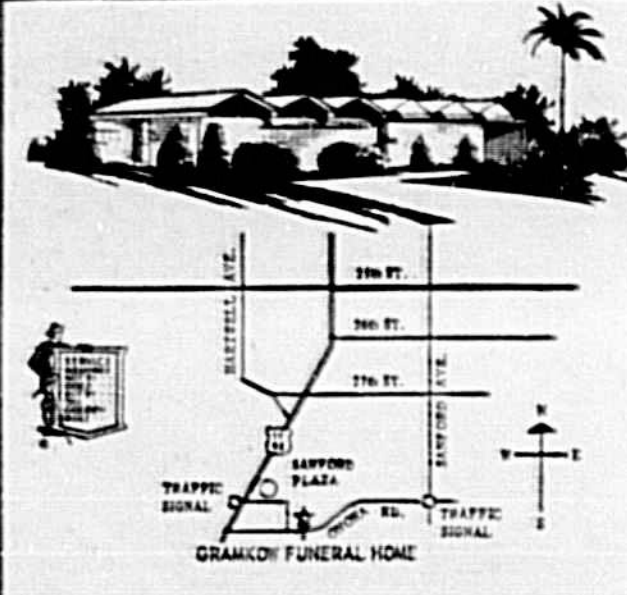

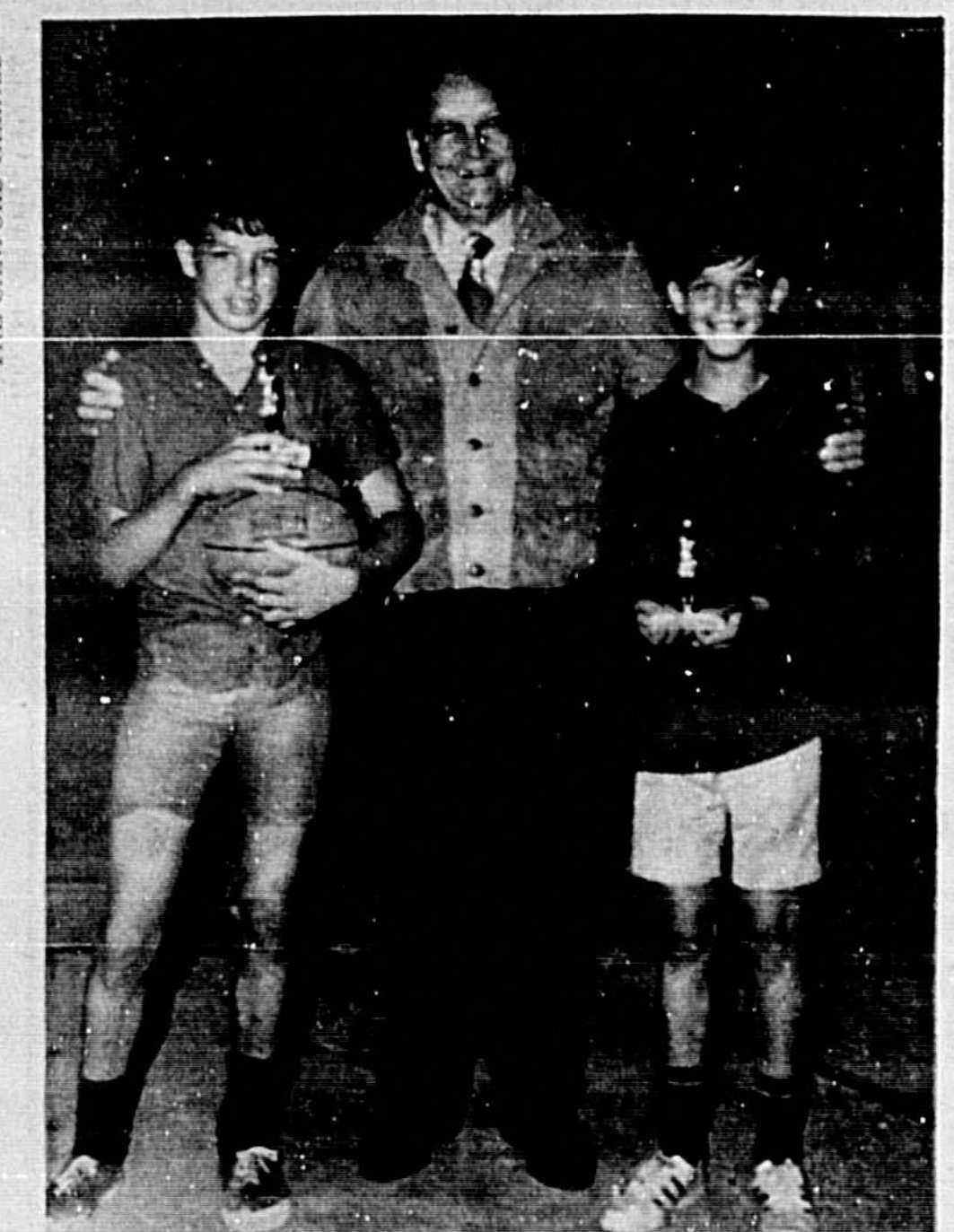

'Rats Of Khe Sanh' Dig In At Front

KHE SANH, South Vietnam (UPI)—The rats of Khe Sanh, said the black secret on the back of the GI's sweatshirt. Three days of dust were caked on his face and arms but he dug and filled sandbags as if his life depended on it.

His life may depend on it, or on how hard he works to dig himself a deep hole somewhere on this grassless plateau just over a mile long and a quarter-mile wide.

Three years ago, Communists moving out of the mountains which loomed up on three sides of the plateau held a force of 6,000 Marines in a deadly artillery siege. Clouds that wreathed the mountains, fog that came in almost daily and closed the Sanh to both helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft were additional hazards.

Problems Getting Ready building a new 2,500-foot runway to use their bulldozers for building bunkers, slowing down the Communist rocket or mortar attacks. But other five support bases in the region had been hit by U.S. casualties.

Bad Weather, Terrain Whenever weather allows, Australian B-57 and U.S. F4 Phantom jets can be seen bombing within 5 miles of Khe Sanh, which is a forward base for the South Vietnamese invasion of Laos.

In addition to the weather, New Sanh has only one access road, a dirt strip, along which American and South Vietnamese convoys have been ambushed several times. A heavy Communist attack could knock it out long enough to provide resupply problems for the base.

Khe Sanh Helicopters can carry only so much and weather can stop their operations.

Now and again, the hum and chatter of the more than 100 helicopters which crowd the plateau is shattered by an exploding mine detonated by teams clearing minefields, led by the Marines during the 1968 siege.

\$100 Daily Cost Already Reported Hospital Rates Going Up, Up And Up

By JOHN CUNIFF

NEW YORK (AP)—The national average cost of maintaining a hospital patient for one day rose from \$9.50 in 1964 to more than \$81 last year, it is expected to reach \$83 this year and to top \$105 in 1972 and \$110 in 1973.

Those are averages. Costs in excess of \$100 a day already are reported in some hospitals, pricing medical care beyond the reach of millions.

And consider how wasteful it is that the entire emphasis is on illness rather than health, on correction rather than prevention, on remedies for ailments that might have been avoided through proper diet and exercise.

So bleak is the picture that one is impelled to believe that the future can only be brighter. Perhaps so. At least one man who believes the corner has been turned is Dr. Edwin Cross, head of the American Hospital Association.

I'm an optimist, and Cross by as he described "Amorion plan," a proposal by the association for restructuring the "delivery" and financing of health services, mainly through establishment of health care corporations.

Such units would take responsibility for the health of individuals living in specified areas, providing them with five essential health maintenance, primary care, specialty care, restorative care and custodial care.

Although the functions of such corporations are still related in broad terms they would, in general, be able to control duplication of services in an area, insure patients a correct facility, coordinate purchasing, and install cost-cutting procedures.

Work would be contracted out to doctors and institutions with an eye not only for the best care but the greatest efficiency. The patient's needs and the area's facilities would be coordinated. No such corporations now exist, and in fact a federal law would be required before they ever became a reality. As envisioned, medical schools, hospitals, insurance companies or others involved in medical care would develop the corporations, with financing coming as before from fees, insurance programs and government aid.

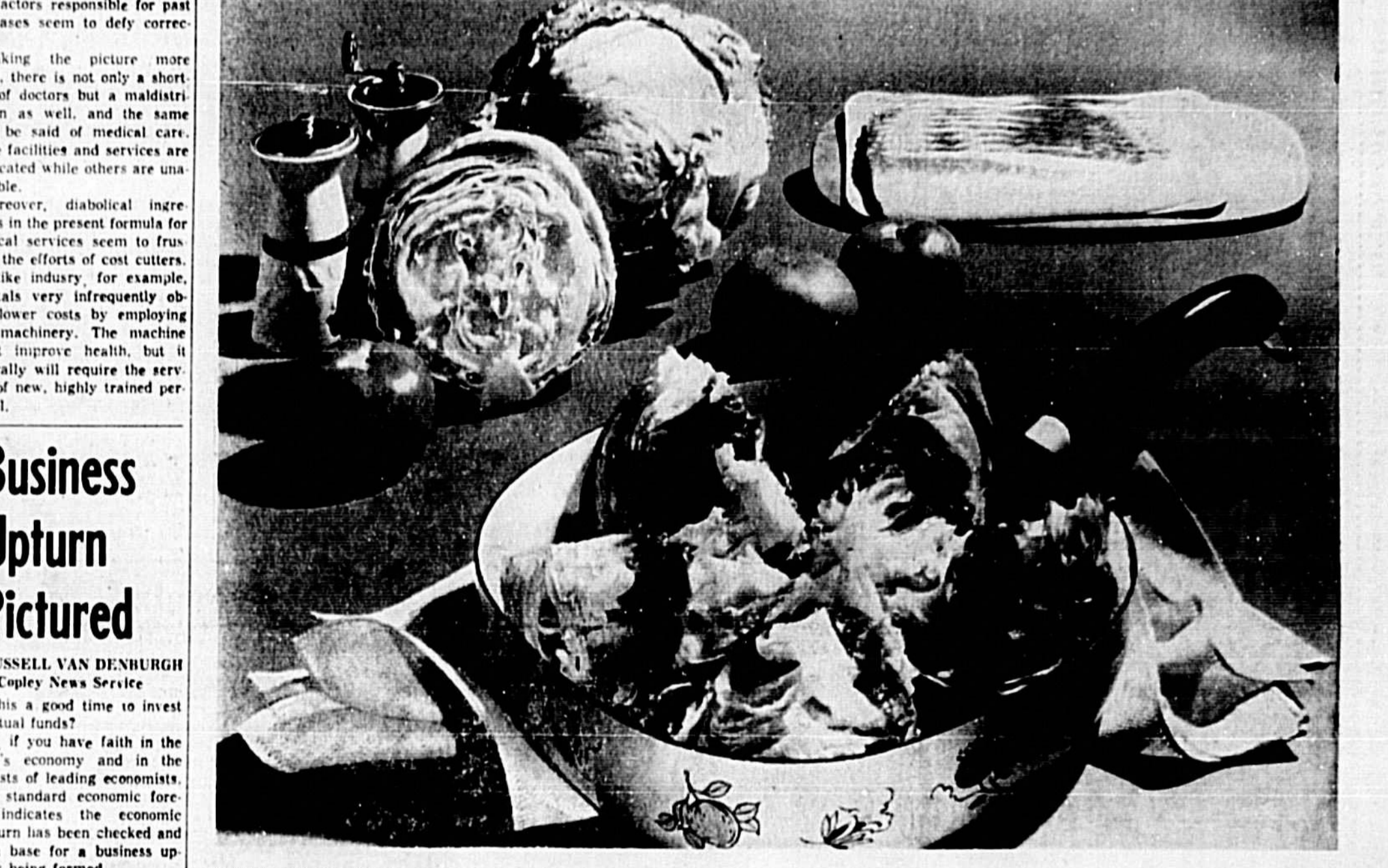
