

quakes throughout the world registering 7 or more on the Richter scale—a potential major disaster in any heavily populated area. Los Angeles registered 6.5. Earthquakes can hit anywhere, but major zones are a broad band around the Pacific Ocean, where four out of every five occur, and from the Mediterranean to the Kimalayas. Minor areas are in Africa, Australia-New Zealand and Iceland. Quakes occur along giant fractures, or faults, in the earth's crust. Shock waves released circle the earth or sometimes pass through it at eight miles a second.






