Police nab kidnapping suspect

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - A man who police say kidnapped the 10-year-old son of a woman he was attracted to, and also attempted to shoot the boy's step-father at an Altamonte Springs apartment complex, was arrested Monday morning trying to board a bus for Texas.

Seminole County Sheriff's Deputies responded Sunday at 11:50 p.m. to a 911 call concerning shots fired and a fight in progress at the Wymore

Groves Apartments at 325 Wymore Road.

Police said Yasin Flores, 47, obtained her apartment 204 in the complex due to her lack of credit. She described their relationship as only a friendship, but told investigators that Flores wanted more than friendship.

"It appears that Flores was attracted to Gomez, but Gomez wasn't interested," Seminole County Sheriff's Office Chief Deputy Steve Harriett said. "So, Flores challenged that."

Flores kidnapped Gomez

10-year old boy Sunday night, who at the time had been playing outside with a friend, Harriett said.

"He threatened to shoot him if he didn't do the right thing," Harriett said. "He forced him to kick the door down. That shows how egregious this crime is."

Flores fired a shot into Gomez' bedroom door with a .22-caliber semi-automatic handgun and forced the boy kick down the apartment door, police said.

"He fired through the bedroom door without knowing where the shots would go,"

Harriett said.

Police said Flores entered the apartment and fought with the boy's step-father, 25-year old Joel Barrio. Flores fired a shot during the fight, and struck Barrio on the right side of his face, police said.

"Flores and Barrio struggled for the weapon," Harriett said. No one was injured from the gunshot, but Barrio received a laceration to his right eye and cheek, police said.

"He has a bandage around his head," Harriett said.

Police said Flores pushed Barrio down a flight of stairs, and the fight continued into

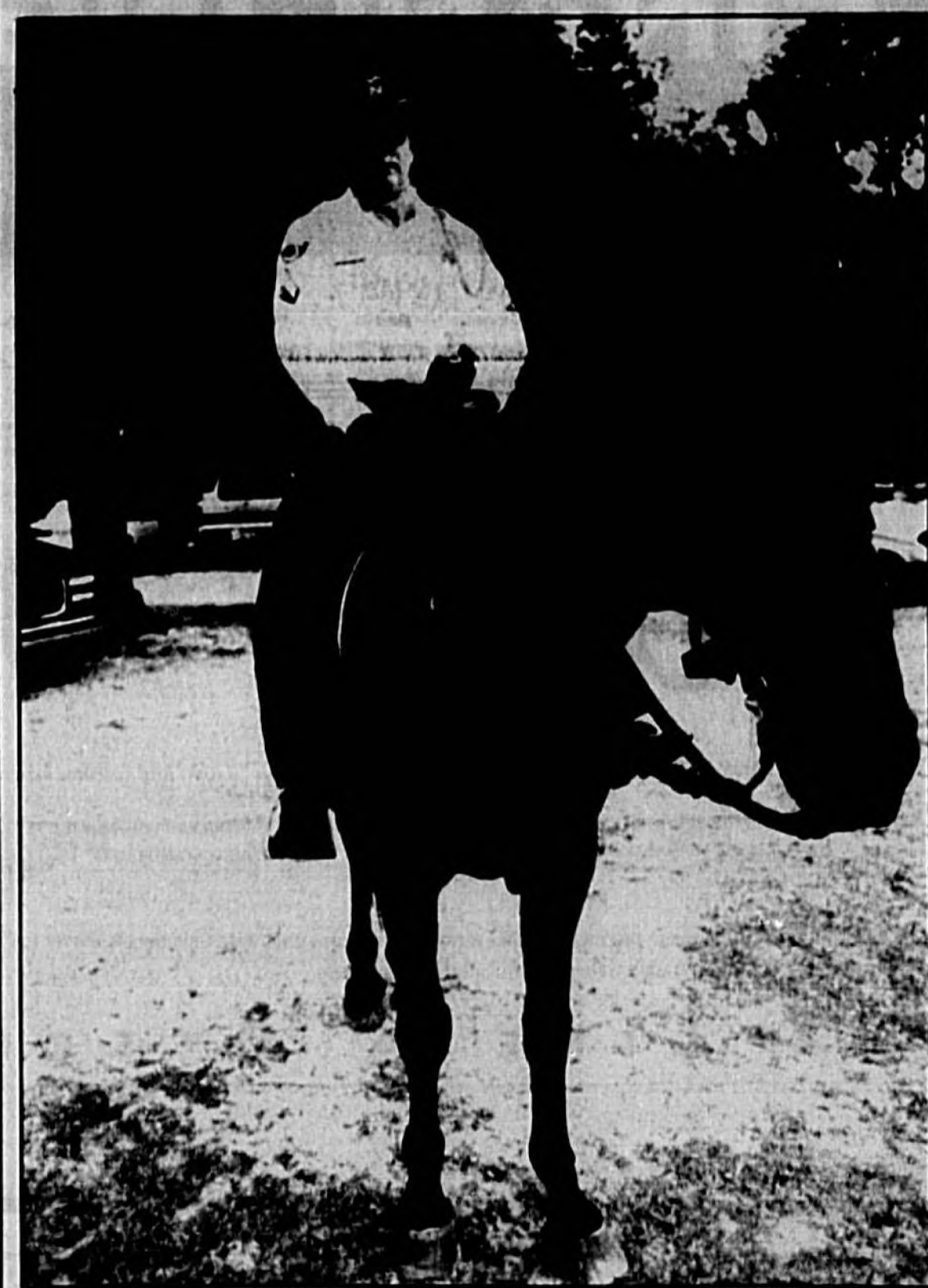
the parking lot. Flores fired a round into Barrio's red Chevrolet Camaro, then fled on foot southwest toward Wymore Road.

Flores was taken into custody Monday at 5:30 a.m. by Orlando police at the greyhound station trying to leave for Texas. He is charged with attempted murder, kidnapping, and aggravated assault.

Police said Flores made a confession and helped investigators locate the .22 caliber semi-automatic handgun he used during the struggle. He is

Lake Mary to call special election on amendments

LAKE MARY - Lake Mary city commissioners on Thursday unanimously approved two ordinances calling for a May 25 election for a special referendum on Charter amendments.

The first amendment would extend by a year commissioners' terms of office. The other would allow city officials to apply for low-interest loans from a state revolving fund to pay for water, sewer and stormwater projects.

Both items have drawn extensive public comment. Citizens are reticent to empower their elected officials to serve three instead of two years. Proponents of the plan say

that it enables the commissioners to serve full terms, plus campaign for re-election fewer times, making the process more efficient.

Lake Mary resident Darrell Leidigh objected to the May 25 election date. Commissioner Gary Brender responded that the November ballot is often filled with myriad state and county issues. He cited last year's general election, which with two pages to cast 18 votes was too involved.

Brender also said that an election driven by only two issues garners "better coverage" and possibly voter turnout.

Fellow resident Jean Robinson reminded leaders that "Old Lake Mary proper"

Tallent leaves county for HTE

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Another top county manager has decided to leave the government business for the private sector.

Human Resources Director Nancy Tallent is leaving on April 30 to become Vice President in charge of Human Resources at HTE Inc., Lake Mary.

At HTE, Tallent joins former County Manager Gary Kaiser, the new president and CEO which supplies software solutions for government agencies. Kaiser left the county's service on April 2.

Kaiser said at last Friday's Seminole County Chamber of Commerce luncheon in Altamonte Springs that he was delighted that Tallent accepted his invitation to join the company as a vice president.

Tallent said Monday that she was taking the new position because of the exciting possibilities at HTE and not that she had any

problems or difficulties working for the county. She worked for Seminole County from 1992 to 1995, leaving to be the Human Resources Department Manager for Orange County.

She said she returned to Seminole County in July 1997 at the call of Kaiser, who was then elevated from Acting to County Manager.

"Gary is one of the best leaders I have met in my career," Tallent said. "There are tremendous challenges and opportunities at HTE because of his leadership. Believe me, I'm not trying to get away from the county. I'm glad I came back as I did."

Cindy Coto, the Acting County Manager until a successor to Kaiser is selected, will also be Acting Human Resources Director until a successor to Tallent is chosen.

This prompted one county official to comment, "If Cindy gets any more acting jobs she'll be eligible for an Oscar."



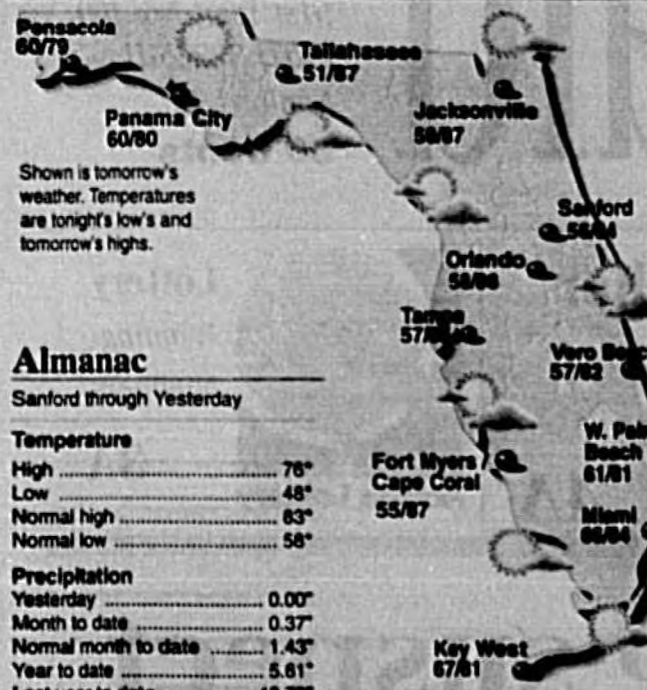

"We've gone through wrongwood," Longwood resident Phyllis Turner, who lives in the Harbor Isle subdivision, said. "And now are we going to go through trashwood?"

Turner said that the city needs to enforce its codes.

"It's very difficult," Commissioner Paul Lovstrand said. "We've got so many people on both sides of the fence."

Longwood resident Sandra Lomax said that code enforcement officers ignore the Skylark subdivision, and that there is a foul smell from a nearby lift station. Drago said the consulting firm hired to revise city codes will look into the problem at the lift station.

"City codes are out of control," Lomax said. "There are areas in the city that would make a ghetto look good."

Longwood resident Nancy Childers said that the commissioners "need to learn to listen

to the public." She said there is a lack of code enforcement in the city.

The city's land development code says that boats, trailers and recreational vehicles may be stored in a side or rear yard, but they must be screened from the street and all abutting lots by an opaque fence, dense hedge, wall or healthy ornamental evergreen hedge that is at least 60 percent opaque.

The code says that the fencing must be at least eight feet tall. The code at one time required six foot tall fencing, and city officials have said concessions can be made for six foot tall fencing.

The code says that commercial vehicles will be allowed in residential areas only if they can be parked in the garage with the door closed. The vehicles can't have more than two axles, four tires, and four square-feet of signage.

should receive attention and funds. "Before you spend all the money on Trailhead Park, make basic infrastructure repairs."

Money is at the root of the proposal to grant officials authority to apply for low-interest, long-term funding. The specificity of the application and award process was repeated by commissioners in order to assure citizens that, as Commissioner Thom Greene put it, "is no blank check."

"There are so many guidelines for protection, there is even no guarantee that if we apply for funds we will even get them," Greene said. He also cited a number one complaint from citizens about the water quality in the "City of Lakes."

Mayor David J. Meador said that the city Charter's adoption in the early 1990s specifically addressed voter concerns that commissioners not be awarded long-term funding for projects without voter approval. They have since learned that it is more expedient to use programs like the state revolving fund.

A 20-year bond issue cost cities about 10 percent. Issues underwritten by the Florida League of Cities carry a 2.5 percent interest rate over 20 years and, according to Meador, considerably lower fees, "some as low as a few hundred dollars."

This specific fund is only available for infrastructure issues, like water, sewer and stormwater projects, and limited environmental improvements. The fund designed to be repaid specifically from a city or county's water, stormwater and sewer revenues.

In related action, Meador proclaimed May 25 as Special

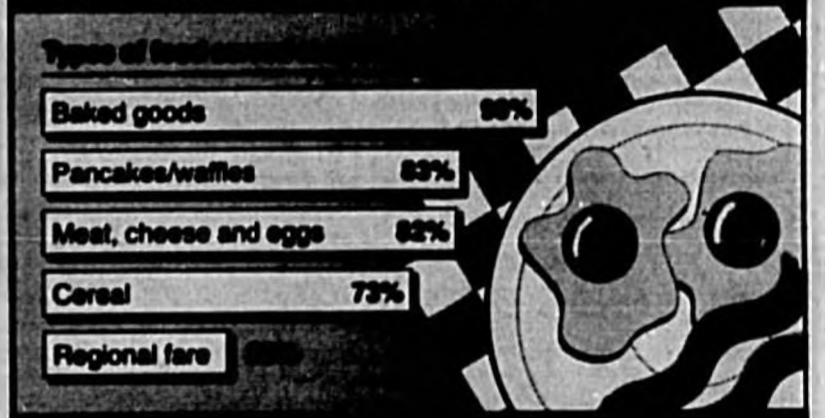
Election Day in the city and commissioners approved administrative orders to advertise the election and educate voters.

Two seats would be up for re-election one year and three the next, including the mayor's. The next two seats up for re-election are those of commissioners George Duryea and Al Crump. There would be no election held the third year.

The city spends about \$2500 to hold an election. Currently, Sanford and Seminole County commissioners serve four year terms.

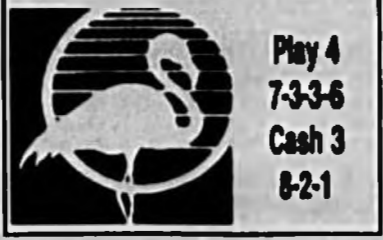

Wearing our Sunday best

Once when families were closer to each other and perhaps to God, going to church on Sunday meant wearing their finest clothes.

Children were taught to dress with dignity and reverence for church services. This meant wearing your nicest clothes and a special pair of Sunday shoes.

The popular expression was "to put on your Sunday best."

Apparently, dressing for Sunday has become a lost art in some places.

The Rev. Richard Trout, pastor at All Souls Catholic Church in Sanford, wants the Parish Council to discuss "the disgraceful example adults are setting for our children at Mass."

Wearing shorts and T-shirts by adults is "absolutely unacceptable here at All Souls," Father Trout told his parishioners this week. He said it was a situation that had become out of hand. He asked the Parish Council to monitor



the situation and give him some recommendations.

Father Trout thanked those who do dress appropriately and said that their effort inspires him to make sacrifices he must make. "What your best is, is between you and God," he said.

The Mass is the highest act of worship in the Roman Catholic Church. Years ago Catholic women wore a hat, kerchief or veil to Sunday Mass. Men wore suits and ties. Every Sunday looked like Easter Sunday.

Nowadays, some women wear tank tops and shorts to Mass. Instead of their Sun-

day shoes, they wear flip-flops. Men wear T-shirts and jeans. Teenagers wear basketball jerseys and athletic shoes.

A woman who is a lector at All Souls and whose teenagers attend Mass each week said she was stunned one Sunday when a parishioner told her not to make her youngsters get all dressed up. That this was Florida. That the old rules didn't apply.

One needs but visit any one of the black churches in the area to observe the dignity and reverence to God as it was and will be forever. "We haven't changed - never will change," Marva Hawkins told me. "If you joined us on Sunday, you would know that."

Southern Baptists, too, abide by time-honored rules for Sunday church, which brings immense pleasure to the Rev. Jim Henry, pastor at First Baptist Church of Orlando. "This is how we were brought up," he said. "We do it in respect to God."

Father Trout is certainly right about the responsibility adults must set for their children. I remember the late 1940s and early 1950s when my father and mother brought me to church. My father, a White House Policeman, was a non-Catholic but he came with us to Mass each Sunday.

My father always wore a suit and tie to church and you could see a face in the shine of his shoes. He didn't need to buy another pair of Church shoes for 45 years. He became a Catholic before he died. He wore his Sunday shoes to his grave.
