Police nab kidnapping suspect

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - A man who police say kidnapped the 10-year-old son of a woman he was attracted to, and also attempted to shoot the boy's step-father at an Altamonte Springs apartment complex, was arrested Monday morning trying to board a bus for Texas.

Seminole County Sheriff's Deputies responded Sunday at 11:50 p.m. to a 911 call con-cerning shots fired and a fight in progress at the Wymore

Groves Apartments at 325 Wymore Road.

Wymore Road.

Police said Ysias Flores, 47, had helped Alma Gomez, 32, obtain her apartment 204 in the complex due to her lack of credit. She described their relationship as only a friendship, but told investigators that Flores wanted more than friendship.

"It appears that Flores was

"It appears that Flores was attracted to Gomez, but Gomez wasn't interested."
Seminole County Sheriff's Office Chief Deputy Steve Harriett said. "So, Flores challenged that."

Flores kidnapped Gomez'

10-year old boy Sunday night, who at the time had been playing outside with a friend, Harriett said.

"He threatened to shoot him if he didn't do the right thing." Harriett said. "He forced him to kick the door down. That shows how egregious this

crime is."

Flores fired a shot into Gomes' bedroom door with a .22-caliber semi-automatic handgun and forced the boy

kick down the apartment door, police said.
"He fired through the bedroom door without knowing where the shots would go,"

Harriett said.

Police said Flores entered the apartment and fought with the boy's step-father, 25-year old Joel Barrio. Flores fired a

shot during the fight, and struck Barrio on the right side of his face, police said. "Flores and Barrio struggled for the weapon," Harriett said. No one was injured from the gunshot, but Barrio received a laceration to his right eye and

cheek, police said.

"He has a bandage around his head," Harriett said.


Police said Flores pushed Barrio down a flight of stairs, and the fight continued into

the parking lot. Flores fired a round into Barrio's red Chevrolet Camaro, then fled on foot southwest toward Wymore

Lake Mary to call special election on amendments

LAKE MARY - Lake Mary city commissioners on Thursday unanimously approved two ordinances calling for a May 25 election for a special referendum on Charter

amendments.
The first amendment would extend by a year commis-sioners' terms of office. The other would allow city officials to apply for low-interest loans from a state revolving fund to pay for water, newer and stormwater projects.

Both items have drawn extensive public comment. Citizens are reticent to empower their elected officials to serve three instead of two years. Proponents of the plan say

sioners to serve full terms. plus campaign for re-election fewer times, making the process more efficient.

Lake Mary resident Darrell Leidigh objected to the May 25 election date. Commisonded that the November ballot is often filled with myriad state and county issucs. He cited last year's general election, which with two pages to cast 18 votes was too involved."


LONGWOOD - Several Longwood residents told the City Commission Monday that the city needs more stringent code enforcement regarding commercial vehicles and boats.

The spetting patrol recently spotted a sign at the intersection of U.S. Highway 17-92 and Airport Boulevard. Licence?





WIN AT BRIDGE

To start, let's modify the well-known saying for shipwrecked sailors dying of thirst into one for bridge players: Entries, entries everywhere, but not a winner in sight.



Lipstick may cause allergic reaction

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm using a new lipstick that is supposed to be effective for 12 hours or more. For the past few days, my lips have been swollen and itchy. Could I be allergic to this lipstick? DEAR READER: Quite possibly.

So-called long-wearing lipsticks, which actually stain the lips, may be associated with serious allergic reac-All lipsticks contain color formulat-

All lipsticks contain color formulated in a blend of oils, waxes and fats. Although the perfect lipstick doesn't exist, consumers continue to search for products that are creamy, pleasant-tasting, glide on easily and color the lips for at least eight hours. In traditional lipsticks, the following components have been discovered to cause allergic reactions: ricinoleic acid, benzolc acid, red nigment 57-1, microcrystal zoic acid, red pigment 57-1, microcrystalline wax, oxybenzone, propyl gal-late and certain aliphatic compounds.

What makes "long-wearing" lipstick so unique are the bromo acids it con-tains. These remarkable substances - known chemically as fluoresceins and halogenated fluoresceins - actually stain the lips and result in indeli-ble coloring. That is, once the lipstick DR. GOTT PETER GOTT, M.D.

film wears off — as it invariably does in a few hours — the lips remain stained with the bromo acids. Unfortunately, these compounds are associated with a high incidence of allergic reactions, called lipstick der-matitis, which can be difficult to over-

The most common stain is acid eosin (D and C Red No. 21). Although naturally orange, acid eosin changes to a vivid and indelible red color in an acid medium, such as is found in and around the mouth. Because this stain lasts so long, allergic reactions to it are a challenge to treat. Other bromo acids — including D and C Red No. 2 and No. 27 and D and C orange No. 5 and No. 10 - are equally potent aller

Therefore, I believe that you are probably reacting to the bromo acids in your "long-wearing" lipstick. You can test my theory. For five consecutive nights, apply a swatch of the lipstick to your upper inner arm and cover the area with a Band-Ald. If the skin under the cosmetic becomes irritated and itchy, you've got your answer. If the skin does not react, consult a dermatologist.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Last summer, I

was out in the sun a lot. I was able to

was out in the sun a lot. I was able to tan but got white spots all over as well. Now, almost a year later, I still have them. What causes this? Should I avoid direct sunlight? I'm 30, female and have many freckles.

DEAR READER: Depigmented areas may reflect sun damage. In addition, some skin diseases start with whitish spots that don't tan. See a dermatologist for diagnosis and recommendations.
