Schools will be opened Monday and principals from all county schools are to report their progress on staffing their schools at a meeting with Phillips at 8 a.m. Friday. The principals also will report if they are going to stay at their posts. So far, no principal in the county has resigned.

Trinity Prep School Groundbreaking Set

Goldenrod will take place at 10 a.m. Sunday. Official groundbreaking for Trinity Preparatory School near construction of the three initial buildings at a cost of \$11 million.

Signing the contract in the office of Stevens and Walton, architects, were Rev. Canon A. Rees, Hay headmaster and chairman of the board of trustees, and Daniel Draper, vice president of business affairs for the school. Also present were Dean Benton Wood, George Stuart, chairman of the finance committee, Ray Stevens, architect, and Jennings.

The buildings, to be completed for the September opening of the on-educational day school, will consist of a three-story building, class room building, and shower-locker building.

This will provide facilities for 100 students, the limited number being accepted the first year.

The George Winters Science Building, designed eventually to take care of 200 students, will at first be used as a multi-purpose building, housing two laboratories, chapel, auditorium, library and administration.

Design of the building is called Florida Japanese. These three structures, when completed, will represent an investment of just under \$11 million.

Contributions for the establishment of the school have come from individuals, the major banks of the area, industry and utilities.

Registration is now open for grades 7-11. The school is programmed to give the finest in college preparation and will feature classes of 30 with no more than 10 students in each class.

Stepped-Up Viet Action Is Urged

WASHINGTON (AP) — Amid indications White House talks between U.S. Secretary-General U. Thant and President Johnson produced no new moves toward peace talks, a House panel has urged stepped-up U.S. military action in Vietnam.

Chairman Peter Hardy Jr. of a House Armed Services subcommittee told newsmen Wednesday the panel believes: "The enemy cannot be defeated within any acceptable time frame so long as we continue to fight a primarily defensive war. "Our slow rate of military progress has encouraged North Vietnam to reject our efforts to bring about peace negotiations."

The panel's news conference came several hours after Thant issued a brief Washington visit in which he reported to Johnson on his recent peace-probe journey in India, the Soviet Union, Britain and France. Thant had talked with leaders of the four countries and with North Vietnamese diplomats in New Delhi and Paris. His findings reportedly were not encouraging.

Johnson gave red-carpet treatment to his U.N. visitor, who said their one-hour talk had been useful.

Afterwards, Thant hunched with Secretary Dean Rusk and other high U.S. officials at the State Department before flying back to New York.

A White House statement said Johnson had reaffirmed to Thant "our continuing desire to achieve a peaceful settlement and the continued validity of the San Antonio formula."

The basic U.S. peace talks of the week before the President in San Antonio, Tex., speech last September is to stop bombing North Vietnam provided Hanoi promptly enters into productive negotiations and does not take military advantage of the bombing halt.

Hanoi has continued to call for unconditional end to the U.S. air attacks.

Hardy, a Virginia Democrat, said the subcommittee feels that the United States must cut off the enemy's supply routes into South Vietnam and:

"If necessary to achieve this end, all routes, whether by land, sea or air, should be closed or destroyed."

Saying the subcommittee's military conclusions represented a summation of testimony given by military leaders, Hardy said the panel "would like the civilians in the Defense Department to pay more attention to the advice from the military."

Harold Brown, secretary of the Air Force, meanwhile urged continued bombing of enemy targets in North and South Vietnam. He appeared before a closed session of the Senate Armed Services Committee to ask for \$20 billion to maintain and expand the Air Force. Parts of his testimony were later made public.

\$212.3 Million For Schools

Financial Experts See \$350 Million New Tax

TALLAHASSEE (AP)—A total of \$212.3 million will go to education out of the \$282.7 million in new state taxes approved in the special session of the legislature for the next school year, according to state fiscal specialists.

Financial experts, recalculating their figures in light of a wave of controversy about what the legislature really did accomplish, said a total of \$350 million in new taxes were levied during the session ending last Friday.

This amount will go from April 1, when the new taxes are supposed to start, until the end of the biennium 15 months later.

The experts said \$21.8 million of increased cigarette taxes that go directly to the counties should be deducted from the \$350 million. This would leave \$328 million for state taxes.

The \$22.7 million in what will come into the state's coffers in only the second fiscal year of the biennium, starting in July.

Actually, the accountants report that only \$315 million of the \$329 million state package is accounted for. The other \$14 million is a cushion in case of underestimates.

Included in the \$315 million are \$17.9 million for all educational purposes, \$66.7 million for property tax relief, \$4.5 million for other programs, \$19 million for noneducational building, and \$36.9 million to fund the state's deficit in 1968-69.

The money going toward the deficit includes \$17.3 million for state universities.

The \$66 million for property tax relief is probably the most controversial item in the package. It is the one teachers object to most violently.

Since the Legislature said counties cannot levy a property tax for schools of more than 10 mills except for debt service and junior college support, the relief money was set aside to replace the money that would be lost by counties now levying higher than a 10 mill school tax.

The deficit funding provides \$17.3 million for public education and \$7.1 million for higher education.

—reporting—the education package, Florida Education Association Executive Secretary Phil Constans argued that the program raised \$350 million in taxes but only gave \$127 million to public education.

He also argued that the \$17.3 million which public education will get by funding the deficit merely represents the Legislature "making good a bad check" and should not be counted.

Both Christian and Constans argued with Constans reasoning.

Christian said Constans' figure excludes \$26.4 million for school construction which the superintendent contends "always has been put in the minimum foundation program."

"It's money," said House Speaker Ralph Tarrington, referring to the deficit amount. He pointed out that, if the bill becomes law, public education will get \$17.3 million that it would not get otherwise.

Pro-LBJ Man Wins

NEW YORK (AP)—Bertram L. Podell, a pro-Johnson Democrat, defeated Martin Dublin, an avowed peace candidate, and two others Tuesday night in a special election for Congress that was fought over the Vietnam war issue.

Assemblyman Podell, a self-described "100 per cent" supporter of President Johnson, ran about 4 to 8 over party maverick Dublin in the Brooklyn contest.

A reform Democrat, Dublin ran as an independent. He said he would not fight in Vietnam if he were of draft age unless Congress first declared war.

U. S. Bombers Blast Hanoi Radio Station

SAIGON (AP) — U.S. planes detected heavy shipments of Communist propaganda coming from Hanoi, and on Tuesday night they bombed the Hanoi radio station, the U.S. Command announced today. But monitors said Radio Hanoi was still on the air.

The strike Wednesday against the station, which broadcasts to the south, was the most powerful transmitter in South-east Asia, coincided with these other developments indicating a sharp escalation in both the ground and air wars:

—Air Force F-105 Thunderchiefs attacked another target for the first time, a sprawling military storage area 41 miles southwest of Hanoi.

The number of Americans killed in combat jumped to a record high for the war last week, 463, and there were 2,547 wounded, 210 less than the record. It was a week of hard fighting in the Viet Cong's lunar new year offensive against South Vietnam's population centers.

Official U.S. sources disclosed that the North Vietnamese 224th Division had moved across the demilitarized zone to the area of Quang Tri City, key provincial capital 34 miles north of Hue. About 50,000 Communist troops were reported to be in or just on the fringes of South Vietnam's two northernmost provinces—Quang Tri and Thua Thien.

The attack on the Hanoi radio station apparently was intended as a blow against Communist propaganda claims of great victories in the South and of shoot-down more than 2,000 U.S. warplanes in the three-year bombing campaign against the North. The U.S. Command has accused Radio Hanoi of gross exaggeration and distortion.

The station apparently had heretofore been on the Pentagon's list of targets out of bounds to U.S. pilots.

The station is 84 miles west of Hanoi, normally targets that require the approval of President Johnson.

A military spokesman said the station was a 100 by 100 foot concrete building protected by a concrete blast wall. The bomb strikes were made by radar because of a 3,000-foot overcast, and because of this pilots could make no assessment of damage.

Monitors in Saigon said late Thursday afternoon that Radio Hanoi was still coming in "loud and clear" on all short-wave frequencies.

However, other sources said some of the bombs from the F-4E Starline A6 Intruders could have hit the medium-wave transmitters that broadcast inside North Vietnam.

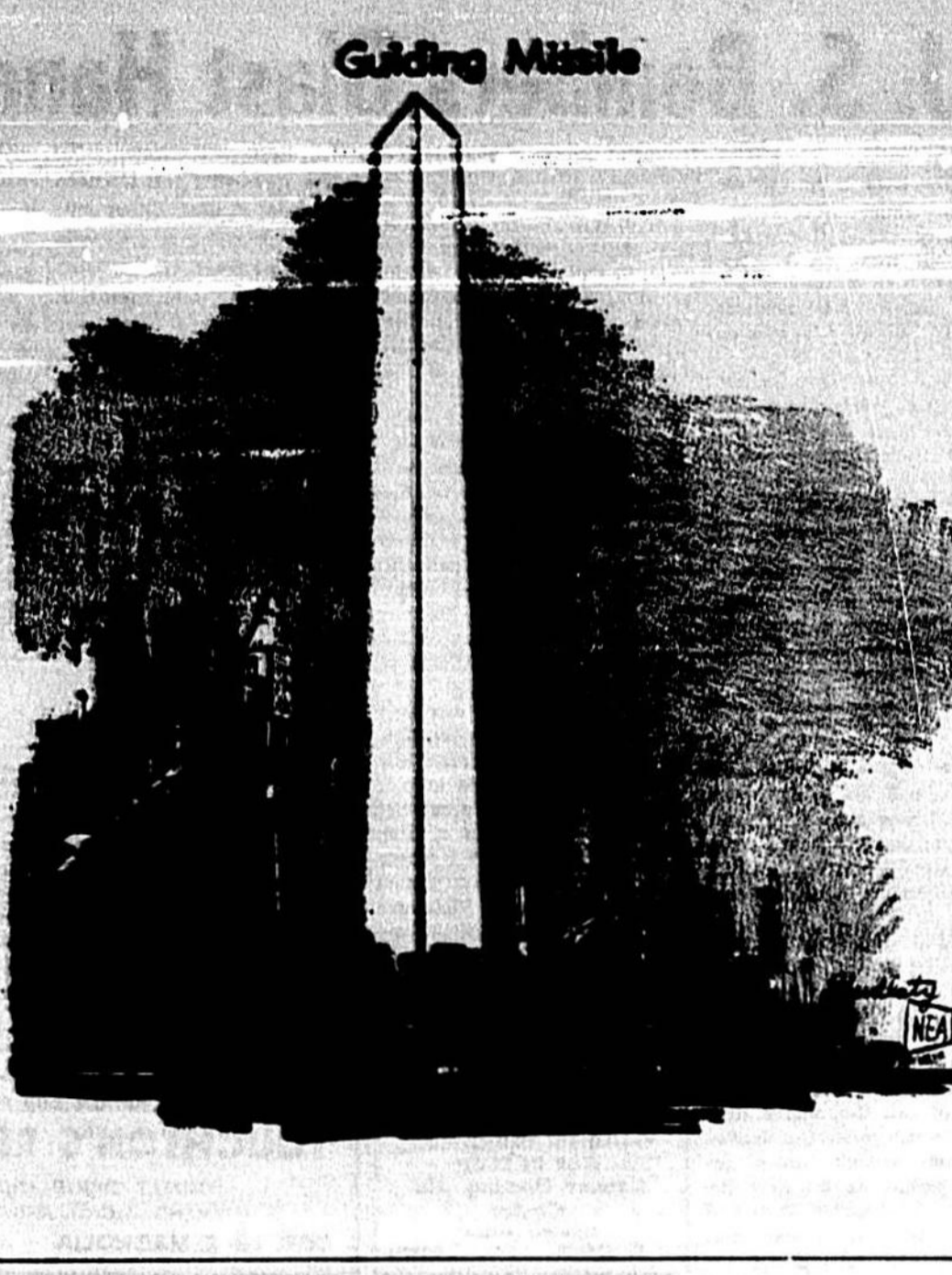

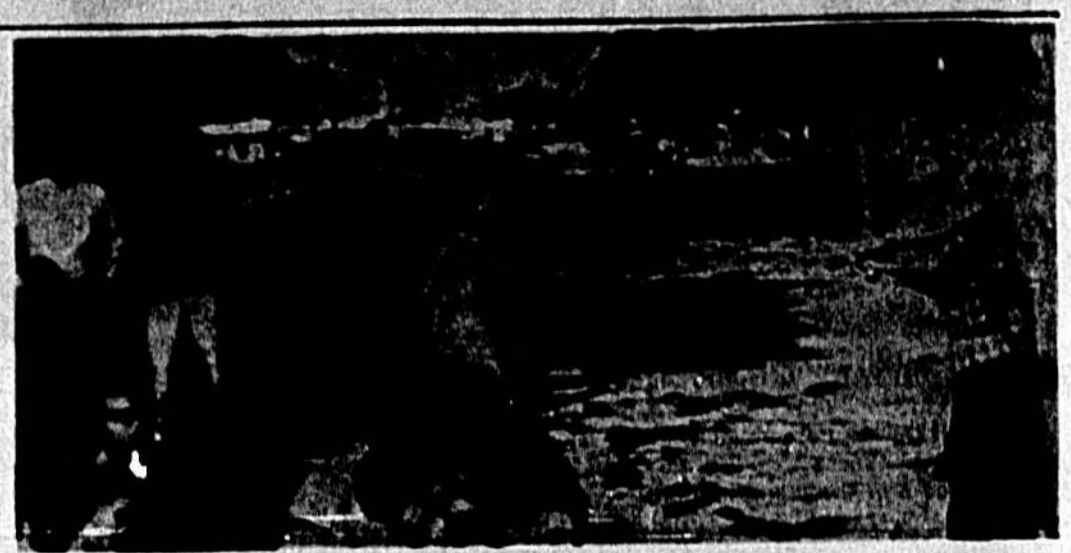

Poucher Denounces President

A 40-minute denunciation of the national Democratic administration drew rounds of applause from Tenthry Republicans for Wayne Poucher, candidate for U.S. Representative from Florida's 4th Congressional district, Monday night at the Republican Club's regular monthly meeting.

Poucher's targets were the Vietnam war, the "irresponsible inflation-breeding fiscal policy" and the lack of law and order "which has resulted from the Supreme Court's decisions protecting the professional criminal."

A minister, award-winning speaker and television personality, he stated his text in the Constitution of the United States which is being ignored and destroyed by the Johnson administration, pointing out that "the Constitution provides for Congress to control the actions and decisions of the Supreme Court but has not done so."

In the past, he urged "Go out or get out." He condemned Johnson's policy of drafting American boys to be killed in Vietnam and then sending their mothers and fathers to buy the bullets with which they are killed.

Attention was called to the fact that "under the Constitution all money bills must originate in the House although the Senate has unsuccessfully attempted to change this. A Republican controlled House could stop the deficit spending and help America regain the confidence and respect of the world," he said.

Demanding a "quit supporting Communism" he mentioned that "although there is \$16 billion dollars appropriated, uncommitted and unspent, the President is still asking for more and more foreign aid."

He also advised, "Without reservation, I am against changing the term of Representatives from two to four years."
