

The resolution Thursday by commissioners of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey banned the flights and ordered a study by the agency's aviation director of Concorde operations elsewhere for six months and a report "as to the acceptability of supersonic operations at

Secret Fund Used

WASHINGTON (AP) - General Tire and Rubber Co. says it secretly kept more than \$1 million abroad, gave much of it to "consultants" in the Arab world and behind the Iron Curtain and may have made "improper or illegal payments to foreign government employes."

The company, based in Akron, Ohio, said one secret fund appears to have violated an unnamed foreign country's currency exchange controls. It also said it is investigating "the matter of political contributions in the United States by executive-level employes." General Tire did not name the recipients of any political ontributions in the United States. Domestic political con-

He tells stories of intrigue and danger on mysterious missions abroad for his Soviet contacts. He speaks of such mundane chores as providing the Soviets with a Senate telephone directory.

The FBI still doesn't know how much to believe about Tolliver's adventures.



is because, like so many other social programs inaugurated by Congress, food stamps have lost their original identity

In 1964 when Congress appropriated \$375 million to begin the program, stamps were distributed to persons and families with poverty incomes in order to supplement their diets. The central purpose was to assure that the poor people had a the adequate enough to preserve their

Today food stamps represent a \$5.6 billion annual program that is shifting toward welfare and income redistribution. It is rampant with fraud and chiseling because the stamps have acquired a cash

For example, in recent testimony before Congress, Secretary of Treasury William Simon and others said that stamps have been used for such diverse things as posting bond for traffic tickets, to paying speeding fines - and even to settle gasoline charge accounts.

By the same token, the farther that stamps wandered from their original purpose the more the genuinely poor suffered. Parade Magazine drew a model in which a family of four earning \$16,000 a year could be eligible for food stamps.
