TALLAHASSEE A-The latest Pregistration figures show that the Republicans are gaining on the Democrats in Florida, but they've still got a long way to go. Secretary of State Gray reported yesterday that 1,359,780 Floridlans are registered to vote in the Nov. 2

general election.
That's a gain of 20,212 over 1952.
Hegistration by Democrats have gone up slightly from 1,215,085 to 1,215,775 while the Republicans have gained from 116,794 to 136,

In the First and Seventh districts where red-hot congressional campaigns are being waged, Democrats outnumber the Republicans considerably. But there, as elsewhere, party lines have been crossed regularly in recent years in the First District composed of Hernando, Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas countles, the Demo-crats registered 159,314 to 42,331 for the Handbliggers

Democrats have an even wider margin of strength in the Seventh District composed of De Soto, Hardee, Highlands, Manatee, Polk and Sarasota counties. The totals are Democrats 1,139, Republicans

Outside of these districts there's little to attract a big turnout on Nov. 2. Statewide, the voting will be in the governorship contest between Democrat LeRoy Collins and Republican J. Tom Watson. and in seven proposed constitu-

Prevatt remarked in dustry should be encouraged to come here by keeping taxes down and supporting the industrial board.

Dean remarked the best couragement to offer is the natural inducements of Sanford. He did not believe "illegal" tax inducements should be offered. Transportation, he said, holds the key to the City's growth.
