Apparently, Baldree was working on the outside of the machine with his foot on the tread of the huge dragline.

A. R. Middleton, Troubleman for Florida Power and Light Company, who tied a rope line to the dragline cable to pull it clear of power lines, said that the line from which the electricity surge came contained 7620 volts.

There are two possibilities which might have caused the apparent electrecution. The machine might have been left free and when the clamshell, operated by a steel eable from the motor of the machine, was disengaged the cable could have been swung into the power line. The other possibility was that the cable, left tense with re clamshell attached, when released, swung into the high pow-
