CLARK GRIFFITH IS PLEASED OVER SIGNING SPEAKER

Senators Pennant Believes He Has Owner Contract With Speaker In The Lineup; Outfield Will Be Strong

TAMPA, Fla., Feb. 1.—(INS)—Clark Griffith was all smiles today after closing a deal via long-distance telephone last night with Tris Speaker who will cavort in the Senators' center garden next summer.

In grabbing Speaker for his Washington club, Griffith said he felt he was making a long stride to gaining another pennant for the former American League champion.

He declined, however, to make known the amount of the price paid for Speaker's services, contenting himself with the statement that the price was large but that if it results in giving Washington another pennant his ambition will have been fully realized.

Speaker will report to the Washington training camp here on Mar. 1 after a visit to his 81-year-old mother in Hubbard, Tex.

The Washington contract will be mailed to him in Texas.

Philadelphia, Detroit and New York also had been seeking Speaker's services.

Price Remains Unannounced

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—(INS)—Tris Speaker will play in center field for the Washington Senators next year.

Announcement of the signing of the Texas star was made by Clark Griffith, owner of the club. He declined to say what terms had been agreed upon, but it is understood, the ex-Cleveland manager has been paid a stiff price for one season's effort. Griffith, who is not exactly loose with his checkbook, evidently figured Tris as a box-office attraction that would pull his salary through the turnstiles.

The addition of Speaker to the Washington club gives the Nats one of the strongest outfielders in either league—Goose Goslin, Speaker, and Sam Rice. All his consistently and considerably.

Speaker will report at Tampa, the Nats training grounds on March 1.

Some General Rules For Basketball

By G. E. ("Pop") Rankin, Physical Director County Y. M. C. A.

1. LEARN the rules of the game and strictly adhere to them.

2. MANTEK the fundamentals of the game which are shooting, passing, dribbling and pivoting. Study the game as you play it.

3. LOOSE BALL: If the ball is loose get it even if you have to dive for it. When you recover it, swing around turning your back to the guard and watch for a chance to pass. Never make a pass unless you hold the ball rather than let your opponent get it.

4. PASSING: Use short, fast snappy passes rather than long passes as your opponent can and will cut in and intercept long pass. If your own team mate is close to basket with no one near that is time to use long pass.

5. KEEP IN MOTION: When your team has the ball do not stand still and wait for something to happen, keep moving, get in the play. Learn to pass and cut for the basket. Remember the man who just passed the ball is nearly always open for return pass. Use your head. Point to go one way and go another. Never travel in straight line on court, weave in circles and change your pace, except when going after loose ball or when going after basket.
