# FAA relocates parking at airport

SANFORD — Parking at Orlando Sanford International Airport won't require a four-wheel drive, but visitors should expect to go off-road to find park-ing at peak hours.

Tighter security measures imposed by the Federal Aviation Administration forced airport officials to eliminate parking in the small lot some 20 yards from the terminal. Airports across the nation

Move is part of tighter security measures implemented at facilities across the nation

are increasing security following last week's terrorist attacks in New York and Washington D.C. The airport has a large parking lot about a quarter-mile from the terminal, but a substantial increase in travelers flying out of OSI is forcing many to park in a vacant field.

"For the time being, passengers are going to be parking further in the grass," said Larry Dale, president of OSI. "During the FAA's security checks to reopen the airport, we had to move the parking away from the terminal."

nal had already been eliminated in July to provide room for rental car space, Dale said. The remaining space was slated for short-term, paid parking, but those plans are now shelved.

Dale had hoped to receive \$1 million from the state to build a parking garage. Governor Jeb Bush vetoed that line-item in June and the airport again plans to push for state funding in next year's bud-

This year's original painting used for the festival's publicity poster is currently on display at SunTrust Bank in Lake Mary. The artwork was created by Seminole artist Bettye Reagan.

Titled "Thelma and Louise," the pastel depicts a group of people enloying a quiet afternoon in the Florida flora. Although a fictitious scene, the setting and characters are, in fact, a part of Reagan's life.

Reagan said. "The people are from old family photographs."

"It's always an honor and exciting to have painting cho-sen for a poster," she said. "It brings publicity for the show, but it also brings publicity to the artist. It looks good on a résumé.

Louise" is Reagan's first piece to be chosen as the poster for the Lake Mary/Heathrow fes-tival, several of her pastels have been chosen for various other festivals, including Taste of Oviedo and the Maitland in at least 20 festival shows and museum exhibitions each year in the eastern United States and has had five solo gallery exhibitions. Her work is in many private and corpo-rate collections, including per-manent collections in Oviedo,

New Smyrna Beach, Sanford and Winter Park.

Reagan said she began painting 25 years ago. Although she is not a professionally trained artist, she began her painting career by then at a local junior college. She has also had instruction throughout the years by vari-

Reagan said she enjoys creating pastel portrayals of the people and street scenes of every day life. She is particu-

larly fond of capturing the expressions and body language of social interactions where each person represents a different idea, but each personality is an integral part of the overall statement.

"But, lately I've done a lot of landscapes," she said. "I do a lot of Florida scenes and historical work."

# Seminole inmate may have ties to terrorists

SANFORD — The terrorist attacks in New York and Washington D.C. hit closer to home this weekend when an Orlando man was placed in federal custody as a material witness to the attacks.

The man is being held in the Seminole County Jail, according to Steve Olson of the sheriff's office, but he refused to comment any further.

At least a dozen individuals have been detained from the State of Florida since the attacks, but the majority of the Federal Bureau of Investigations work has been in South Florida and the Daytona Beach area.

According to state attorney officials, the Seminole County Jail has been used as a federal holding place for quite some time mainly because there is no jail particularly associated with the federal courthouse in Orlando. The man will be held there until a Wednesday hearing before a federal magistrate at a closed hearing in Orlando. ing in Orlando.

Court records from the man's initial hearing before a federal magistrate on Sunday were sealed with only a case number, but not the man's identity

So far the FBI's in-depth investigations have led to only two arrests nation wide, but as many as 50 individuals are suspected to be in federal custody. The FBI continues to target Florida flight schools as part of their investigation. More than half of the 19 suspected hijackers are presumed to have Florida ties.

## Students make long distance call to space

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — Students at Altamonte Springs Elementary School made a very long distance phone call Friday.

Students, parents and faculty gathered in the school's media center at 12:12 p.m. to converse with crew members on board the International Space Station. It was a conversation that took years to initiate.

Plans for Friday's hook-up with the space station began four years ago when Joe Singer of the American Radio Relay League asked teachers at Altamonte Elementary if they were interested in participating in a HAM radio program with NASA. Fifth-grade teacher Christine Scheer decided the program was a great opportunity for her stu-

dents, and it was also a good way to incorporate life in space with the science curriculum.

"With Joe's help, I filled out the application," Scheer said. "Then, I just had to wait. Each year, I told my class we might be able to do this. This year, I was actually speaking the truth."

According to Michael N. Welch, public information coordinator for the North Florida Section of The American Radio Relay League, the four-year wait wasn't unusual. "There's a long waiting list -

In discussing the events of the last week with a group of friends, an interesting point was made: Does our generation have what it takes to keep America great? Specifically, can we be as triumphant as our grandparents, the **Greatest Generation?** 

Some argued that America has gone soft, that Generation X lacks the discipline, courage

Americans will always rise to the challenge. I put myself in the latter group. I'm cynical about a great many things, but I have an unquenchable faith in the American spirit. I'm not a Polly-Anna about it. I understand we've got some difficult days ahead of us. But this country has faced difficult times before. In

fact, I would argue that our

and value system to make

a difference like our grandparents did. Others said

country is great precisely because we've lind to handle adversity.

A good example of what I'm talking about is my hometown in East Tennessee. On Dec. 7, 1941, the 30,000 plus acres of land the city of Oak Ridge now occupies was populated by a handful of farming families and a few hundred head of cattle. Less than four years later, on Aug. 6, 1945, the world learned that a secret city snuggled into the foothills of the Appalachians was the birthplace of the atomic

What always boggles my mind is not the fact that our country created the bomb, but that our grandparents built the massive infrastructure that lead to the creation of the bomb. The first spade of dirt was turned in mid 1942. Thirtysix months latter - less than the term of most of our car payments — a poor farming community was transformed into one of the most technologically advanced cities in the world supporting a population of more than 100,000.

I realize we face a unique situation today. I don't know what it will take to meet the challenges facing us. Point is, neither did my grandfather in his time, but he contributed his talents where they were needed. If that meant building planes or growing Victory Gardens or inventing the bomb, then he and the rest of his

generation were willing to do lt. Our generation will do the same.

Yes, we're greedy, self-centered, "soft." And future generations of Americans will no doubt forget the lessons we'll be learning over the next many months. We're the world's poster child for attention deficit disorder. Prosperity tends to do that to a nation.

But Americans have never lost their resolve in times of need. You see it on a regular basis more frequently than you realize. Ask the folks in South Florida after Hurricane Andrew ripped through towns and cities like a buzzsaw. Talk the locals here in Sanford who lost loved ones or belongings in 1998 during the tornadoes and wildfires. Ask Rick Stevens and his family if the American spirit still burns. What you'll discover is neighbors near and far are always there to unite behind a common

good, be it a family, a community or the nation. I've thought about it quite a bit. My grandfather's generation wasn't the greatest ever born. A society is not born into greatness, it must be repeatedly achieved. My grandparents and their peers certainly achieved that goal. Why? Because that's what the times called for. My generation hasn't had to make that sacrifice, in large part thanks to our grandparents. Perhaps now's the time for us to prove our mettle. If it is, I have no doubt that we'll follow the example set by the Greatest Generation.

**Body Found** 

The body of a missing 15-yearold Winter Springs area teen was found Sunday at 10:14 a.m., in Gee Creek, in about 10 feet of water, under some debris. A member of the Volusia County Sheriff's Dive Team, which was on scene to assist, found the teen's body after doing a hand field grid search of

The teen, Corey Norwood, was swimming with three friends in Gee Creek on Saturday. The creek was higher, and the current faster, since the rains from the tropical storm. The current carried the four toward some logs and other debris in the water. The four apparently were pulled under. Three of them surfaced. Corey Norwood dld not.

Authorities were contacted Saturday afternoon and a search was initiated, which included fire rescue divers, a helicopter, fire and law enforcement personnel working from shore, and personnel and equipment from Seminole County Public Works. Search efforts were scaled back Saturday night as it became dark. On Sunday morning, the search resumed with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office and the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Dive Team on scene.

Even though the death appears accidental, the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Section is conducting the death investigation into this case as a matter of course. The teen's body was taken to the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office for autopsy.





# The death of Moral Equivalenc

omething else died last Tuesday, in addition to thousands of innocent people. It was the doctrine of moral equivalency — the idea that people every-where are just like us, or can be made so by meeting their demands.

Secretary of State Colin Powell said Wednesday that the United States will now go after terrorism wherever it is found in the world. That's a nice change from the State Department's criticism of Israel for

doing precisely what we now plan to do. Powell has said that Israel went "too far" when it retaliated against terrorists who killed Israeli civilians. Powell seems to indicate that America's approach to terror will be limitless. If that's good policy for America, why isn't it good policy for Israel?

Perhaps the idea of a "cycle Thomas of violence" in the Middle East has also died. That phrase has always implied that there are

no perpetrators and no victims. Funny how American leaders stop talking about such things when Americans bleed and

The enemies of religious pluralism, tolerance and other American values see it as their divine mandate to eradicate people who do not believe as they do. These are not people who can be mollified, coddled or persuaded to think and act differently. For them, it is not an aberration to kill what they regard as the enemies of Islam. It is their commission and their duty. Before plotting future approaches to terrorism, it would be well to consider our past approaches, which have clearly falled in light of this American holocaust.

We have eviscerated our intelligencegathering capabilities, mainly due to politi-cians and their media colleagues who have alleged that the United States no longer has enemies and to think so is to engage in a Cold War mentality. A laughable moment occurred during CNN's coverage on Tuesday when anchor Judy Woodruff was interviewing novelist Tom Clancy. Clancy said one of the reasons our defenses broke down was the media's anti-spying bias. Woodruff responded that the media doesn't take positions on such things.

Our approach to terrorism has failed because we have looked at it through the Adviser Samuel Berger spoke of a "100year conflict" between Israelis and Palestinians — not a 4,000-year one. He said he believed there was "not a single issue...that cannot be resolved." Well, how about the very existence of Israel and the West, or the doctrines of Judalsm and Christianity? (Check out the kangaroo court trying those Christian missionaries in Afghanistan and the death sentence that's the lot of anyone in Afghanistan who speaks of another God besides Allah, to say nothing of the Afghans' cave man view of women. Does anyone seriously believe such radicals can be converted into democrats by Western "earnestness"?)

Former Middle East negotiator, Ambassador Dennis Ross, spoke of the need for "earnestness" and a "profoundly serious approach" to peacemaking. Did he think Israeli and Western leaders had been playing games since 1948 when Israel was re-established in its land?


This is the kind of fuzzy thinking that makes America (and Israel) vulnerable to enemies who will not be satisfied until we look like the ashes that came floating down from the World Trade Center.

Evil exists. It must be opposed. It is self defense to kill people intent on killing you. If this is war, as President Bush and others have said, let's start acting like it and tell America's enemies that if they are so intent on seeing their God, we'll help them get there. As for us, we intend to die of natural

Those humanistic, "can't we all get along," "profiling potential terrorists is racism," "we're all God's children," Kumbaya, "all we are saying is give peace a chance" moral equivalency equivocators will soon be back. They'll try to wear down our resolve. They should be ignored. They have lost all credibility, just as the peace in our time" crowd did at the start of World War II.

We know the enemy. We know where they live. Let's go get them before they get any more of us, and let the moralizers sort it all out later.

# God Bless America

'our darkest moment will be our most defining day, and will yet become our finest hour'

Editor's note: Charles R. Jones, minister at Markham Woods Presbyterian Church in Lake Mary, delivered this sermon Sunday following the "Attack on America" Sept. 11, 2001.

Scripture Reading: Paalm 27

he last few days have seemed like eternity, and still for many people the horrors of Tuesday Sept. 11, 2001 hardly seem real.

Except that they are real enough, and we find ourselves facing the reality of a new terrorist war, a war the United States and her Allies and many other nations of the civilized world will engage with determination and a renewed commitment to save all people from experiencing in the future what we are facing now.

We acknowledge with heavy hearts that we must walk in the shadows of war, for it is in the shadows the cowardly enemy hides because he does not possess the courage to stand out in the open to defend his cause, because it is indefensi-

In 1941, after Pearl Harbor, it was feared by the enemy that all he had achieved was to stir a sleeping glant. He was correct and our response was such as to ensure he will never trouble our shores again.

On Tuesday our terrorist enemy stirred once more the sleeping giant that is the United States, but he has completely underestimated the resolve, the detertination, the strength and the spirit of the American nation and many other nations with us, to root him out and

defeat him once and for all, as we will Before he committed his foul deeds he neglected to remind himself of the American patriotism that lies in the words of the National Anthem.

He has miscalculated the expression of unity and determination to defend freedom and democracy that is real every time Americans put their hands on their hearts and sing:

"O say does that star-spangled banner yet wave,

O'er the land of the free and the

home of the brave!" He failed to calculate the depth of patriotism and passion that beats in American hearts when they stand in front of the flag and confirm they are "One nation under God, indivisible, with

liberty and justice for all." He has completely forgotten the words that are embodied deep in the heart and spirit of the Anthem that express our resolve to defend ourselves with all our might when any enemy attempts to invade our shores and take our freedoms:

"Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just

and this be our motto, 'In God is our trust."

When these words were written, the issue of the day was the sovereignty of the United States and the rights of Americans to self-government, self-determination and the right to enjoy Godgiven freedoms peaceably with one another. We will never allow anyone, especially a cowardly enemy who hides in the shadow to attempt to take it away from us!

As far back in the Bible as Genesis 3.15, GOD spoke of the on-going battle between good and evil, between Satan and Christ, by reminding those who perpetrate evil of the sure and certain victory of good, of Christ, of God!

There the Almighty reminded Satan about Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of the world, with these words: "You may bruise his heel, but he will bruise your

You may claim your victories, Satan, you and your evil cohorts with you, but In the end YOU LOSE! You may knock the heart out of the World Trade Center but you will never knock the heart and spirit out of the American people!

You lose, because right always triumphs over wrong!

You lose, because God's light ultimate-ly triumpha over darkness! You lose, because a just cause always

triumphs over terrorism!
You lose, because the heart of the American people is filled with resolve to wipe your human demons off the face of

You lose, because people who trust in God always will triumph over those who trust in you!

You lose, because CHRIST HAS ALREADY DEFEATED YOU!

President George W. Bush rises in stature and inspired leadership with each passing day, both in the nation and in the world. We must continue our prayers for his wisdom and strength. He has declared that "the United States will lead the world to victory over terrorism," and he is drawing the full support of civilized

nations for this just cause. British Prime Minister, Tony Blair said: "The democracies of this world are going to have to come together to fight terror-

ism together.

This is the new hope, the new resolution, that rises out of the ashes of disaster in New York City, Washington D.C. and the brave fields of Pennsylvania.

This is the new expectation that is heard in the voices of the dead as they cry out nor for revenge, but for justice for all in the world who have become victims of terrorists.

I dare to prophesy in the Name of God that the forces of tyranny, evil, and asion will not prevail at the end of

I dare to prophesy that the moral, political and spiritual forces existing in our country and throughout the world that seek for a better world order and freedom from terrorism, will win at the end of the day because our cause is just and right and because our trust is in

GOD! Some people may be doubtful and disillusioned about the possibility of ever achieving a peaceable world. But it is not the ideals that have failed.

It is men and women who fall as they betray and ignore and debase the moral standards of the world, and in particular the commandment of GOD that states: "You shall not kill" (Exodus 20.13), which literally means: You shall not murder. We were witnesses to mass murder on a horrific scale on Tuesday September 11.

We certainly will fail if we stand back and do nothing to prevent evil men from destroying the good that society has built

In the light of the attack on America on Tuesday Sept. 11, the darkest day in American history, let us as Christians ask the question: If we declare war on terror-

ism is our cause a just one?
Some Christians hold the position of pacifism, believing that violence of any kind, under any circumstances, cannot be considered, even under the circumstances of terrorists committing the worst strocity in American history.

It can seem confusing, when we are reminded to demonstrate the Christian characteristics of forgiveness, and restraint, and all that makes for peace, which lie at the heart and foundation of our faith.

Certainly, when the United States take inevitable action, let it not be with hot anger blazing in our hearts ... let it not be with the spirit of hate as our passion ... let it not be with a spirit of revenge and the all-too-human desire to get even, for these are not godly attitudes. Remember that the LORD GOD said:

"Be angry, but sin not ... put your trust in the Lord" (Psalm 4:4-5)

The LORD GOD said: "Never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written 'Vengeance is mine, says the Lord, I will repay ... do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:19-20)

Rather, let our actions be made with cool reason and self-restraint, and trusting the guidance of the hand of God Almighty. Let our sole purpose be that of securing our borders and freedom of life for all in the world who suffer under the burdens of terrorism.

We also know in our hearts that we are not being called upon to determine speculatively how we must react in the event of aggression and terrorism striking our shores.

The aggressor has already come. He has already committed his foul

He has already broken international

He has already ignored the laws of God.

And he is unrepentant of his actions. This is the great "falt accompli" of American and world history, and our fallure to act will encourage him to continue his acts of terror. Occasionally in history, thankfully not

too often, there appears an aggressor who ignores God's justice and moral law, whose inhumanity to man knows no

When he rebuffs all efforts to have him cease his activities, then he has created the situation that draws nations who live under the embrace of God's moral and holy justice to defend that justice for

The Westmirster Confession of Palth, one of the great confessions of our Church, states that Christians, for the purpose of maintaining plety, justice and peace, "may lawfully under the New Testament, wage war upon just and necessary recessions" (Chapter "2")

essary occasions" (Chapter 23 Many centuries ago, the Christian Doctrine of the Just War was clearly defined by six principles, or points, and no Church in Christendom, nor any civilized government has ever added or subtracted any word of this doctrine.

The Six Principles are as follows: 1) The Just war must be undertaken

by a lawful authority. We know the United States and her Allies would certainly be acknowledged as a lawful authority in the face of international terrorism.

2) The Just war must be undertaken for the vindication of an undoubted right that has certainly been infringed.

On Tuesday the rights of all American citizens to live peaceably within our own borders was intringed upon in the most grievous manner.

3) The Just war must be a last resort, all peaceful means of settlement having

We must acknowledge that over the years the United States and her Allies have steadfastly continued the struggle to fight terrorism by all available means. short of engaging in out-and-out war, and that these efforts have been continually unsuccessful.

4) The just war must offer the possibility of the good to be achieved outweighing the evils that war would involve.

The choices open to us are not simply the clear-cut choices between good and evil. If this were the choice it would be an easy matter to decide.

However, the choice open to the United States and her friends of the International Community is a choice between two evils:

The evils of war ... or the evil forces that would continue to threaten democracy, stability, and human rights in the whole world order, which if left unchecked will merely continue.

These International terrorists have

made another miscalculation! If they had remembered the history of the United States and her Allies they would have noticed we have many times in the past accepted the evils of war as the less these two evils, because we have always been willing, and will be willing again, to prove that the principles of freedom and liberty and the pursuit of happiness are principles worth fighting and dying for.

5) The Just war must be waged with a

right intention. A war can only be a just war when it is fought to defend something, rather than as a first act of sheer aggression for

the sake of aggression.
On Tuesday the world witnessed the most terrible acts of sheer violence against humanity. It is likely as a result that the forces of the United States and most of her Allies will be called upon to engage in a conflict that has the intention engage in a conflict that has the interitors of securing the rights of free and civilized peoples all over the world to live without fear in their own land and to go about their business without the threat of ter-

6) The Just war must use methods that

are legitimate.

That is to say, the methods of warfare must be in accordance with international conventions.

One strong principle in this respect is that military might must be used against military targets rather than civilian tar-

The United States and her Allies observed this principle in 1991, exerting force against Iraqi military establishments, but not against the Iraqi people. This despite much evidence that Iraq had committed terrible anticordities against the

people of the tiny nation of Kuwait. On Tuesday, Sept. 11, we saw how terrorists do not care about international conventions, as they attacked both mili-tary and civilian targets in the USA and succeeded in inflicting their very worst damage against innocent civilians, our own fellow citizens.

I believe, therefore, the doctrine of the Just War, based upon Christian principles, encourages us to trust that if we act as a nation for the proper reasons and in the proper fashion, to put an end once and for all to terrorism, our actions will be both right and necessary.

And we can look to God, for our trust is not only in a Just Cause, but a Just and Holy and Loving God, who loves the world so much that he gave his Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the cross to free all people from the tyranny and oppression of sin and evil.

As we look to the Father of all creation, the God of the ages, the Savior of the world, His words of assurance and hope ring in our ears: "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; we are perplexed, but not driven to despair; we are persecuted, but not forsaken; we are struck down, but not destroyed" (2 Corinthians 4:8-9).

And so we turn to God. We trust His holy presence with us. We trust His demands for holy justice. We believe we can trust Him and He will act.

We know our spiritual confidence is in GOD alone.

We stand upon the great truth of the ages that stirs the human spirit and provides the very heartbest of a nation and a world united against this most despicable foe. We affirm it with all our might and faith! The Almighty God speaks to us in the midst of our deepest sorrow and assures of this great and unchangeable truth expressed at Paalm 27: "The Lord is my light and my salva-

tion; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

When evildoers assall me, uttering slanders against me, my adversaries and foes, they shall stumble and fall.

Though a host encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; Though war arise against me, yet I will be confident ...


... and now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies round about me. I believe I shall see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living!

# **AAA** offers airport tips

The cliché "Better safe than sorry" is certainly appropriate at airports, especially in light of the recent tragedy this country experienced in New York and Washington D.C. Though we all understand the need for strict security measures, many travelers may find themselves frustrated if they are not properly prepared for them.

The American Automobile Association (AAA) offers these tips to minimize hassles and frustrations related to airport securi-

 Curbside check-in for pas Curbside check-in for pas Curbside check-in for passengers has been discontinued, so expect to proceed to the ticket counter immediately.

· Do not carry any sharp objects, such as a pocketknife of scissors, on your person or in your carry-on luggage that could be deemed a weapon. It is likely to be confiscated.

 Place a tag with your name. and address on every piece of luggage, including carry-on

• Be aware of parking restrictions. Unauthorized vehicles left unattended near a terminal could be towed.

· Arrive early. Crowded airports and increased security mean longer waits. Be at the airport two hours prior to departure for domestic flights and three hours for international.

 Carry two forms of photo. identification, including at least one that was issued by a state or federal agency such as a passport of driver's license. When booking your ticket, use the exact name on that ID. Airlines will be checking the name on the ticket against the ID to ensure the person whose name is on the ticket is actually flying.

 Don't leave your luggage unattended - even for a moment. Airport security might confiscate unattended luggage.

 Avoid wearing excessive metal jewelry or accessories. Don't carry keys through an air-port's metal detector. If you can't clear the detector in two tries, you could be searched.





Being close to acres and acres of wetlands along Lake Monroe and "deficient culverts" in the area have made Celery Avenue sus-ceptible to flooding during typical Florida rain storms. The former celery fields along the road permits for "sheet flow" which also disrupts the water quality in the area, said Flomerfelt

According to Flomerfelt, the remaining 40 acres could be used for a various of uses including a recreational park, public works facilities and created wetlands. Created wetlands offer animals a native habitat while possibly providing walking trails to the pub-

The county will continue its discussions with the state for a possible buyout if the lease transfer from UF to the county is approved, said Flomerfelt.

Thomas Radzai, senior engi-

neer for the county's stormwater division, said the project could cost more than \$500,000 for the construction of the stormwater facility. The environmental cleanup of old pesticides left behind by the university will be assessed and remediated by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.



averaging about three years - to have the chance to communicate with the space station," Welch said. "Then, NASA gets to choose who communicates with the station."

Once Scheer was notified this summer her application was selected, plans began for Friday's hook-up. The fifth-grade teacher went through a series of classes to become licensed as a HAM radio operator, and a date and time were determined for the communication.

"Everything has to be just right," Welch said. "It all depends on the curvature of the Earth, where the space station is and other factors.

On Friday, members of The American Kadio Relay League

arrived at Altamonte Springs Elementary School with the equipment needed for the radio hook-up. Antennas were placed on top of the school, and huge bat-tery was placed outside the school to guarantee there would be no interruption during the communi-

cation. At exactly 12:12 p.m., when the space station was above the southcentral United States, communication between students and Space Station Commander Frank Culbertson began.

Brooke Hoffman asked

Culbertson how fast the space station travels. Although the commander's answer was hard to decipher through the static, the student left the microphone beam-

"It was so exciting to talk to the

astronaut," Hoffman said. "I loved it."

Ten minutes after first contact with the station, the school lost its reception with the facility. Nevertheless, Scheer said many of her students will never forget the short, but exciting, HAM radio conversation they had with the astronaut.

"It was nice for the students to see a different method of communication other than the telephone or the Internet," Scheer said. "Many of them might not understand right now what a great opportunity this was. But, when they get older, they will realize, 'I really got to talk to an astronaut.'


