a few days after the order had been received -- and after the cyclotrons had been destroyed -- his headquarters got an inquiry from Washington as to the feasibility of shipping one of the cyclotrons to the United States. Scientist-critics in the United States have compared the destruction of the cyclotrons in Japan to the Nazi book-burning and similar curbs upon the quest for knowledge in Europe. The Japanese diet continued its special session today and heard Premier Kijuro Shidehara promise a reformation in the upper chamber of the Japanese parliament -- the House of Peers.

Addresses should be complete, in ink, and the sender's name and address should be written or printed in the upper left hand corner. Packing and wrapping should be given careful attention with the use of strong, durable containers and secure wrapping. Parcels should not be sealed except when they bear a printed endorsement reading, "contents merchandise, Postmaster. This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary." Special delivery envelopes mail to the most expeditious handling and also entitles it to special delivery at the office of address.

**Six More Japs Found Guilty by Tribunal**  
MANILA, Dec. 13, (AP) - A dispatch from Manila disclosed today that six more Japanese war criminals have been found guilty and sentenced by a United States military commission. The Japs were accused of killing and burning two American fliers and five Filipinos at Cebu City, in the Philippines, last March. Two of the Japs have been sentenced to death by hanging and three others were given prison terms, ranging from ten years to life. A third death sentence has been commuted. The sentences are subject to review by the commander of Army forces in the western Pacific, Lieut. General W. D. Styer, and by General MacArthur.

## Committee To Put Off Labor Bill Hearings

### House Group Hears Murray Testify In Opposition To The Fact-Finding Bill

CLEVELAND, Dec. 14, (AP)—A court order was issued today halting the number of CIO pickets outside the Fisher Body Plant in Cleveland to 25. Judge Frank Day said he found no evidence to support the charge by General Motors that the pickets had threatened or molested persons trying to enter the plant. He announced that union attorneys have agreed to permit 200 office workers to enter the building without interference.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14, (AP)—President Truman is not going to get one Christmas present that he wanted. The Senate Labor Committee has decided to abandon hearings on the Fact-Finding Labor Disputes Bill for the time being. No further hearing will be held until after the first of the year. That puts an end to Mr. Truman's hopes of getting such legislation passed before the holidays.

Some 100 witnesses are listed to be heard on the pending measure. Chairman James Murray of Montana said today that the committee had decided there was no chance of concluding the hearings within the time limit set by the President.

Use of Representative Philip Murray today described the industrial outlook as "bright and dangerous." He charged that government figures prove American industry is in a position to grant pay increases of 24 percent and still earn in 1946 profits after taxes more than twice those of the previous year.

And Murray added this final comment: "The workers, he said, 'have cooled off and cooled off until they have been almost frozen out of the picture.'"

NEW YORK, Dec. 14, (AP)—Some 200,000 CIO electrical workers may join some time after the first of the year, the ranks of the nation's workers idle in labor disputes.

Almost complete returns from the NLRB conducted strike vote show today that the United Electric Workers have voted five-to-one to walk out in support of demands for a \$2-a-day wage boost. The workers are employed in plants across the country operated by the General Motors, Westinghouse and General Electric companies.

Official and complete tabulations in the strike balloting are expected later today.

The electrical workers thus have voted to follow the pattern set by two other big CIO unions—the auto workers and the steel workers.

After preliminary vote tabulations were completed, the electrical workers sent requests to officials of both Westinghouse and General Electric for wage negotiations to begin on Monday. The sacrificing its education standards requests declared that the recent 15% cut-in-hour wage increase offered by General Motors was unacceptable to the union.

## House of Commons Ratifies Bretton Woods Proposals

LONDON, Dec. 14, (AP)—The British House of Commons ratified today the Bretton Woods Monetary Stabilization Fund. Ratification of the pact was one of the conditions laid down by the United States for a loan of \$4,600,000,000 to Britain.

The Bretton Woods measure was passed without dissent on its third and final reading and was sent at once to the House of Lords.

The action on Bretton Woods came barely 10 hours after Commons had approved the terms of the huge loan by a vote of 345 to 98.

A sharp debate preceded the vote on the loan. It was interrupted by personal attacks between Labor and Conservative leaders, including Winston Churchill and Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin.

## German's Own Words Tell Of Killing Jews

### Thousands Die During 29 Day Massacre In Warsaw's Ghetto In Spring Of 1943

NUERNBERG, Dec. 14, (AP)—The savage effectiveness of the Nazi campaign of extermination against the Jews was revealed today in a new book introduced at the Nuremberg trial. They included an estimate by Dr. Wilhelm Hoettl of the German Secret Police that 6,000,000 Jews had been slaughtered—4,000,000 of them in extermination camps deliberately set up for that purpose. Dr. Hoettl was right-hand man to Ernst Kaltenbrunner, one of the defendants at Nuremberg. He said that Gestapo Chief Heinrich Himmler considered the estimate of 6,000,000 Jews killed too low. He said Hoettl, the figure came from a German official reported as an expert on the subject.

NUERNBERG, Germany, Dec. 14, (AP)—The Germans' own words were used today to describe how they slaughtered thousands of Polish Jews in Warsaw's ghetto in a 29-day massacre in the Spring of 1943.

The evidence was introduced in support of the charges that the defendants are guilty of all manner of heinous crimes against humanity. And the story told today left no doubt of the charges.

The records showed that the Germans used tanks, heavy artillery and flame-throwers in their assault on the Warsaw ghetto. Just how much of a "battle" it was is indicated by the claim that only 10 Germans were killed.

NUERNBERG, Dec. 14, (AP)—General George Patton is now out of the danger of death. That was announced today from the chief specialist attending the former Third Army commander. However, the specialist, Col. H. Glen Sprague, said that Patton might be partly paralyzed for the rest of his life. Col. Sprague said that it would be impossible to forecast the effects of Patton's injuries for at least three or four weeks. He explained that while it was possible that the General might recover fully from the lesions, such a recovery, he might never be able to command his troops again.

Colonel Sprague was flown to Heidelberg from Washington with Mrs. Patton.

Sprague disclosed that as soon as Patton's condition permits, he will be flown to the United States for hospitalization. That will be in about four to six weeks.

The specialist said that the General cannot move his hands or legs, but is able to move his shoulders. There is a small amount of movement in his right upper arm. Dr. Sprague explained that the injury to the spinal cord cannot yet be determined and that it may be six months before it is definitely known whether the four-year general will regain full control of his arm and leg.

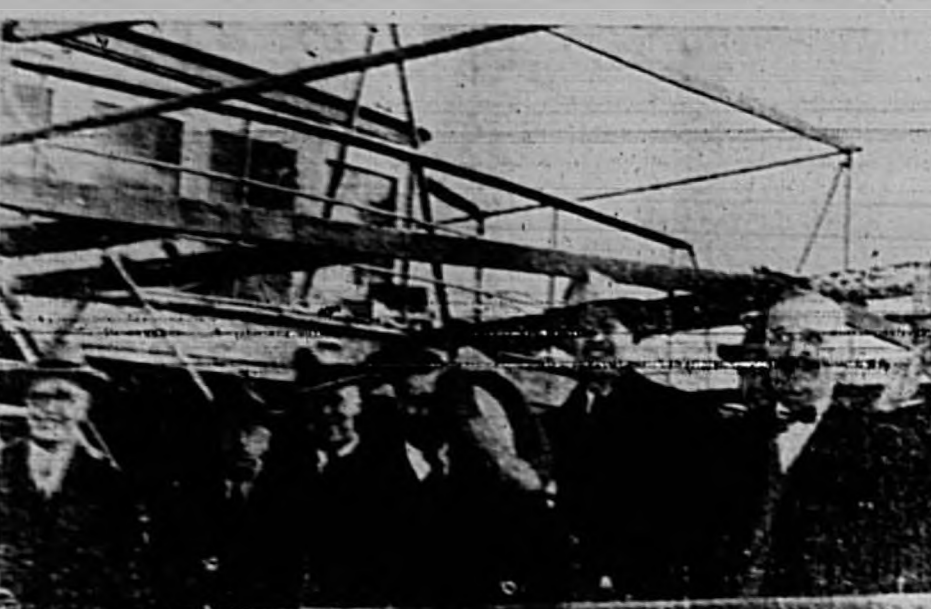

## Captain Cornell Is Home On Leave After 5 1/2 Years

Will Resume Duties With Florida Pre-cooling Company

Capt. Robert L. Cornell, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Cornell of 2018 Mellenville Avenue, is home on terminal leave after five years and six months in the Army Ordnance Department. He spent three and one-half years in the Caribbean, European and Pacific theaters of war. Capt. Cornell will return to inactive status in the ordnance reserve April 6, 1946, but in the meantime will resume his duties as Vice President of the Florida Pre-cooling Company where he will have charge of all plant operations beginning Jan. 1. After entering the Army Oct. 2, 1940, Capt. Cornell was assigned duty at the Charleston, S. C. Ammunition Depot for six months and then was transferred to Puerto Rico where he served for two and one-half years installing and maintaining the various nearby camps and bases in order to carry out his work.

He returned to the states December, 1942, to Jacksonville, Miss. where he became a member of an artillery and fire control company which was training for foreign duty. However, before leaving the states he attended the Ordnance School at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., in January, 1944. He went overseas in December, 1944, and was stationed with his company at Cheltenham, England, until June 1, 1945. During that time he was company commander in charge of an ordnance base shop where primary duty it was to assemble tanks and guns which were shipped to France. Capt. Cornell said that his work was mostly with the 150mm Howitzer, the 150mm gun which was commonly known as "Long Tom" and with the M4 tank which is a 40 ton tank, the heaviest the Americans put into combat.

From England Capt. Cornell's company was sent to Manila where he worked with general purpose vehicles. On Nov. 18, 1945 the company set sail for San Francisco on the Admiral Hughes, a Navy transport. It was sent to Camp Hurler where he began his terminal leave on Dec. 9. During the entry in the Army Capt. Cornell was graduated in 1939 from Georgia School of Technology in Atlanta, Ga. where he majored in mechanical engineering. He won the following ribbons: American Theater, European Theater, Asiatic Pacific, Philippine Liberation and Pre-Pearl Harbor.

## 44 Autos Involved In Motor Accident

## Pearl Harbor Group Leader May Resign

### Makes Announcement After Legal Staff Asks To Be Excused From Further Duties

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14, (AP)—Senate majority leader Alben Barkley has threatened to quit as chairman of the joint House and Senate committee investigating Pearl Harbor. The Kentucky Democrat made his intentions known this morning soon after the committee's entire legal staff asked to be excused from further duty.

Barkley said the decision by the legal staff was "of their development." He said it would be difficult to obtain new counsel, but the Senate chairman agreed with legal staff members that the hearings are being prolonged almost indefinitely. He pointed out that with such a wide field to be covered and so many witnesses to be questioned, the hearings may be expected to drag on for months.

Barkley explained that he had not wanted to serve on the Pearl Harbor committee in the first place, because of Senate majority leader's bad health falling as it was. And since the hearings began, he continued, he had practically been compelled to give up his work in the Senate.

It has now become apparent, Barkley went on, that the investigation cannot be concluded by Jan. 3—the date originally set by Congress.

Earlier today, Committee Counsel William T. Mitchell asserted that he and the members of his staff had agreed to serve on condition that they would not be held down for any considerable time after New Year's. He noted that although the hearings have been in progress since Nov. 16, only eight witnesses have been fully examined so far. He said at least 60 more witnesses still are to be questioned.

Mitchell's announcement came as a Republican Representative, Herbert G. O'Connell, of California sought to broaden the inquiry. O'Connell suggested that additional witnesses be called—including enlisted men who were on duty at Pearl Harbor when the Japanese attacked. Such testimony, said O'Connell, would develop what he called the real story.

In Pittsburgh, former soldier Stephen L. Carnall disclosed he has written Communist leader Earl Browder's personal experiences in Hawaii prior to and during the Jan. attack.

The ex-GI says he wrote to the California Republican that the Honolulu Air Field in Hawaii was under attack by the Japanese on Dec. 1 to Dec. 6, Carnall says, however, that the alert was lifted suddenly by the day before the Japs struck.

The former soldier says he wrote O'Connell because he feels the Congressional committee should have the enlisted men's story of Pearl Harbor.

The Pearl Harbor probe has brought a blast from tart-tongued Secretary of the Interior Harold Ickes. He has told a Political Action Committee meeting in Chicago that the current inquiry in Washington is what he believes a part of the Republican campaign preparation for 1948. Ickes also has placed in the Congressional Record a list of Major General Patrick Hurley's charges against State Department policies in China.

## Sebring Advocates Athletic Program On Academic Ideals

GAINESVILLE, Dec. 14, (AP)—Justice H. L. Sebring of the Florida Supreme Court said today the University of Florida has obligated itself to compete with other institutions of similar size and rank to establish a program of intercollegiate athletic competition on a large scale at the close of the war—or to renew its place in the field with schools of similar size and rank.

Justice Sebring added that in choosing to renew its place, Florida has obligated itself "to exhaust every means to get the essentials necessary to carry out a successful program of athletics but he warned, "we must not sacrifice our academic aims or our educational standards." Justice Sebring now is chairman of the Alumni Committee on Athletics.

## Fireman Search For Hotel Fire Victims

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo., Dec. 14, (AP)—Firemen searched through charred debris of a 59-year-old hotel today seeking victims who perished in a midnight fire which destroyed the hostelry.

Estimates of the number killed ranged from 4 to 15 and there was no immediate way to check because the hotel register was destroyed in the fire. Hotel Manager Charles McCarthy said at first he believed four persons might have died in the blaze, but Police Chief Charles Wolf said there might be 10 to 15 bodies in the ruins of the Glenwood Hotel.

### Dubious Reception Given Request From White House To Fix Ceilings

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14. (AP)—Ceiling prices on houses took more buffeting yesterday on Capital Hill. A dubious reception was given a White House request for authority to fix the ceilings. The problem's a tough one. There's no law which gives the Government or President Truman any authorized leeway in the matter. Mr. Truman proposes to put a ceiling on the price at which a new or old home can be sold. The recent comes on the word "proposes." He can't and evidently doesn't intend to do anything more than propose. The Chief Executive then suggests that Congress pass a law to create the authority needed, and have it referred either to him or to some other government agency.

The plan seems good to representative Dwight Patman of Texas. But some members of the House Banking Committee are bitterly opposed to the bill sponsored by Patman. One of its main parts would control prices this way: Suppose a house is built before the bill becomes a law. Nothing can be done until the first time that house is sold after the passage of the measure. Then the sale price becomes the ceiling price. After that, no one can resell the house at a higher price. And then there's part number two: Suppose a house is being built while the bill is becoming a law. If the bill passes before the job is complete, then the government would step in and would set a ceiling price on that house, and no matter how many times the house was re-sold, that would be its maximum price.

Well, it takes a long time for some bills to pass or be killed. Meanwhile, a home owner can sell a house at any price he wants. And the scarcity of housing needles sellers to make advantage of the situation and charge inflated prices.

What's the Government to do? The President's proposal, as sponsored by Patman is running into stiff opposition not only from certain House members, but also from real estates circles. Well, since the Government can't control ceiling prices on houses, it turns, in the meantime, to controlling the materials going into new housing. At least, it's a temporary aid. Builders agree to

at any price he can get. The only salvation seems to lie in the home buyer. He can do his part in keeping home prices in line by refusing to play outlandish prices to builders. But human nature being what it is, when people want shelter, they want it very much and the limits on what they'll pay, as a general rule are sky-high. What's best to do is quite a problem.

In the upper house, the Sena-

tors are impatient and arguments over the question of surplus ships. What's to be done with \$10,000,000,000 worth of such vessels? It had been proposed to charter some 620 of the war-built vessels to Russia, England, Norway and other allies who had operated them under lend-lease. A roll call vote yesterday turned thumbs down on that score. The proposal was knocked out by a 36 to 28

vote after Senator William Knowland of California said that now is the time to sell ships, not charter them. His consensus of the situation was that if we let foreign nations have the use of the vessels, they would build new, fast ships that would outstrip American-flag vessels, and we'd get our old ships back. The problem remaining now is, who's to buy the ships and what terms are to govern their sale?

### Alabama Is Rated Top Eleven During 13 Year History

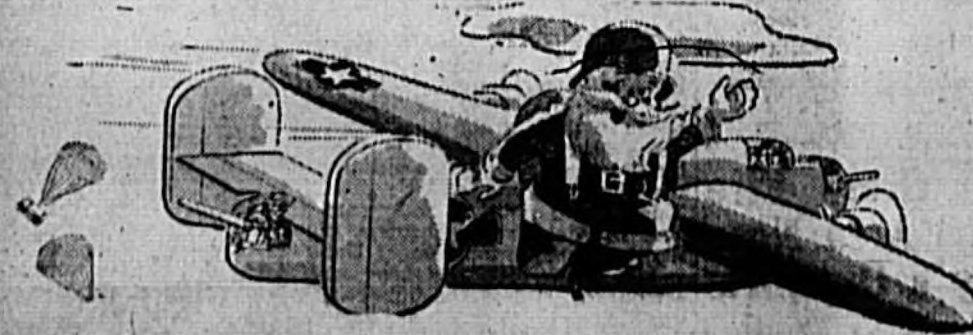
An Associated Press survey shows that University of Alabama football teams have compiled the best records of any college eleven over the last 13 years. The survey, covering the period from 1933 through 1945, shows that the Crimson Tide won 39 games, lost 17 and tied seven for a percentage of .840.

Although Army has won its last 18 games in a row, the Cadets rank only 12th in the nation. Tennessee is in second place with 94 wins, 21 losses and five ties, an average of .817. Duke is a percentage of .802, Fordham, .792 and Notre Dame, .781.

Other leaders over a 13-year period are Duquesne, Holy Cross, Santa Clara, Ohio State, Minnesota, Boston College, Army Tulsa, Louisiana State, Detroit, Michigan State, Colorado University, Georgia, Villanova, Navy, Mississippi State, Michigan, Utah, Texas Tech, and Texas Christian.

When Alabama takes the field for the Rose Bowl game on New Year's Day, the Crimson Tide will lay a formidable statistical record on the line.

In nine regular games this season, Alabama scored 396 points against 66 for the opposition -- made 24 first downs against 40 for the opposition -- and made 2,673 yards rushing against 305. Amazing Harry Gilmer attempted 88 passes and completed 57, or about 65 per cent. His passes were good for 995 yards and 13 touchdowns.

Navy Spoke In Crisis Terms Nov. 15, 1941

Keefe Asks If Group Is Investigating Pearl Harbor Or New York Governor

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17, AP.—The Pearl Harbor investigating committee heard the details today of how a death trap was set for Japanese Admiral Yamamoto.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17, AP.—The Pearl Harbor investigating committee learned today that as early as Nov. 15, 1941, the Navy was speaking of relations between the United States and Japan in terms of a crisis.

In an earlier issue of the review, a Navy Department spokesman wrote that the Japanese Navy appeared to be ready for any eventuality, with crews at full wartime strength.

Other documents placed before the investigating committee today disclosed that six days before Pearl Harbor, the Navy's intelligence service was predicting an early Japanese advance against Thailand.
