



#### Social Security Numbers To Aid Search For Fathers

WASHINGTON (AP) - The secretary of Health Education and Welfare has ordered the release of Social Security numbers to help track down runaway welfare fathers who cost taxpayers more than \$1 billion annually. The decision by HEW Secretary David Mathews ends a running dispute between two agencies within the department and opens the way for confirmation to a high government post of a scion of the famous Taft family of

HEW's Social and Rehabilitation Service, which is responsible for administering the new "Federal Parent Locater Service" to help states track down fathers and collect child support payments, said it needed the Social Security numbers. The numbers would be given to the states for use in tracking missing parents through state records, such as motor vehicle registrations.

The rising cost of living means the federal government's definition of poverty will go up about \$500 to nearly \$5, 500 this year for a non-farm family of four, the Labor Department reported today.

The Labor Department said it will use the higher income levels in determining eligibility for its employment and job training programs, effective April 1. The \$5,500 figure is the same as a preliminary estimate of the Census Bureau, which will issue its own poverty



## The Social Security Crisis Is Growing

generally has been viewed in terms of what may happen in the future if the cost of paying benefits pulls too far ahead of the amount flowing into the trust fund. Now there are events occurring which could accelerate the day of reckoning, and it is doubtful Congress can get by with a patchwork job of reform that leaves the major headache for

For one thing, public employes who have the option of participating in Social Security are beginning to desert in significant numbers. Alaska nas become the first state whose employes want to bolt. New York City's 150,000 municipal employes also are opting out - the largest single group to defect so far. Altogether, more than 200,000 employes of state, county and city governments and school districts in 19 states have notified the federal government of their intention to withdraw.

The rule of compulsory participation which covers most other Americans is under attack in the courts, mainly by people who claim that it violates their religious principles. Sen. Richard S. Schweiker of Pennsylvania is pushing a bill that would liberalize the terms on which a person can claim

The legal and moral issue of whether it is right for Social Security to be voluntary for some Americans and compulsory for others is only part of the problem. Withdrawals from the system will only aggravate its underlying financial weakness, especially since a worker who has been par ticipating for 10 years is fully vested in the program and would not lose his right to benefits upon retirement if he withdraws.

Security is obvious. In the eyes of a growing number of citizens it simply takes too much out of today's paychecks in return for an uncertain prospect of benefits in the future. What began as a convenient and economical way to build up a supplemental retirement income is being regarded as an unsound investment, if not a "rip-off," in the eyes of many wage-earners.

Democrats in Congress are responding to this discontent in the worst possible way - sitting on President Ford's request for an increase in Social Security deductions to keep the program currently solvent, and moving instead to cover the deficit by drawing on the general fund. This would only paper over the need for basic reforms in the system, and further erode the principle that benefits being paid out are derived from the individual contributions of individual workers.

Inequities and fiscal mistakes which have overtaken Social Security need to be corrected if the system is to survive. They will not be corrected by transferring the cost of those inequities and mistakes to the income tax, which simply moves the "rip-off" to another column on the worker's list of payroll deductions.

peasants: "Let them eat cake." Perhaps that's the message some "hardliners" would deliver to all poverty-fighting programs, and more specifically, to Sanford's Seminole Economic Employment Development Corporation (SEED-

It is difficult, really, to understand some of the criticisms. Is the agency itself under fire? Or, is the criticism aimed at SEEDCO President Horace Orr? Or, as a county, are we simply saying to the agency and to the director and to all programs similar to SEEDCO, "Let them eat cake."

There are some basic truths involved SEEDCO's struggle for survival, the smallest of which is the struggle itself. The most important element here is will Seminole County eventually lose the \$4-million in federal dollars pumped i since the agency cranked up in 1970?

Here's how it could happen. Florida's

egislative Delegation, which is reportedly meeting this week to discuss criticisms of SEEDCO, could withdraw support from the agency. In effect just ask the federal government to move it out of Seminole County. Now, some say that would be an

The agency, one of three of its kind in the entire California, or one of a number of states with a less hostile atmosphere than exists here. What that would mean is your tax dollar would still support SEEDCO, but the agency would be employing Alaskans, or pumping millions into the economy of

The reasoning is simple. SEEDCO dollars are ederal dollars; dollars that are collected from each and every taxpayer who lives in every state in the

Of course there's still another option. Our delegation might convince other Congressmen to abolish the SEEDCO concept entirely. Then tax-

payers could finance the welfare system, or in short, pay in the money which is required to maintain a minimum standard of living for those persons unable to compete in the system as it

It's a philosophical question, really. Kind of similar to the famous maxim, "You pays your money; you takes your choice."

SEEDCO's concept, simply explained, is to place welfare recipients in paying jobs. If it isn't working then it should be made to work. How? By bringing in the necessary talent required to make all SEEDCO "ventures" productive and profitable. The fact is most of the corporations or "ventures" owned by the agency already are productive.

And if Orr, the agency's \$23,000-a-year director is not doing his job, toss the rascal out.

In the final analysis some "hardliners" argue welfare recipients must be told to "eat cake," there are laws which specifically prohibit that. Those laws are one of the reasons this nation is the finest and the most humane in the entire world.

Intervention Threat

Reappears In Lebanon

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - A new threat of Syrian military intervention in Lebanon's civil war was reported today as moderate political and military leaders tried to arrange a session of Parliament to replace Christian president Suleiman Franjieh.

Kamal Assad the Moslem speaker of Parliament, was reported trying to schedule a session of the 99-member legislature Thursday to vote a constitutional amendment ending Franjieh's term at once, six months before it expires. The legislators then could elect a new Christian president willing to accept the changes demanded by the

Raymond Edde, a 63-year-old political veteran, was considered the man most likely to be elected. Explosions and volleys of machine-gun fire were heard on the fifth day of the 10-day truce, but the level of fighting appeared to be somewhat lower. A police spokesman said 43 persons were reported killed and 53 wounded in Beirut and other parts of the country since midnight Monday.

ROME (AP) — The Socialists, stung by Roman Catholic refusal to ease opposition to legalized abortion, threatened today to topple Premier Aldo Moro's Christian Democrat minority government.

The Socialists demanded an emergency meeting with Moro and with Benigno Zaccagnini, secretary-general of the Christian Democrat party. They said they would force disbandment of parliament and have general elections a year ahead of schedule rather than give up on the abortion

Moro's 55-day-old government depends on the Socialists' benign attitude for survival. It won a vote of confidence in February thanks to Socialist abstention.

#### Soviets Train Rhodesians

WASHINGTON (AP) - Russian advisers are now in Mozambique where they are to train Rhodesian black nationalist guerrillas, U.S. intelligence sources report. The Russian contingent numbers only 18 military men. But intelligence analysts say the development is significant because it is the first firm sign that Russia intends to commit its personnel to preparing Rhodesian blacks to fight white Rhodesian forces.

Intelligence sources say the Russians were flown to Mozambique from Tanzania and reportedly will be stationed in centers set up to train and organize Rhodesian insurgents who use Mozambique as a base.

# -Vihlen Cleared; Mail Probe Pursued-

State Attorney Abbott Herring said Tuesday he is forwarding his investigation file to the Pinellas County state attorney's office for further investigation after he announced that charges against a Seminole County commissioner of using county postage and mailing supplies in a congressional campaign are "unfounded." Herring's office spent four days investigating a

complaint filed by George Saunders, campaign managerhusband of JoAnn Saunders, unannounced Democratic candidate for Florida's fifth congressional district, against an opponent in the party race for the nomination, Sid Vihlen Jr. Saunders said Vihlen had used a county envelope, the county postage meter and a county-paid secretary for campaign purposes.

Saunders in the complaint to Herring's office said campaign literature had been received by a Saunders postage-metered stamped county envelope. He said the documents were turned over to him for appropriate action and he forwarded them to Herring. Vihlen's immediate response last week was that it

was "a frame job" by the JoAnn Saunders campaign. Herring, after receiving sworn testimony of the incident from Akers, the Saunders, Vihlen, a Sanford printer and various county personnel, said Tuesday, "Our investigation exonerates Vihlen of the accusations." He said the investigation establishes that the material alleged to have been mailed in the (Jan. 29) postage

He said investigators have been able to turn up only the one envelope with the county postage meter stamp, adding that courthouse personnel testified that the county postage meter wasn't used in the Vihlen campaign.

"Our conclusion is that JoAnn Saunders received false information from her source and that she in good nothing but good faith on the part of Mr. and Mrs. Saunders. Based on our investigation, Vihlen is cleared."

Herring said that his office is forwarding the investigation file to the Pinellas County State Attorney's office for further investigation there because of "conflicts in sworn testimony . . . " the accusations vs. the findings and that any action now would come in Pinellas. Akers lives in Clearwater, Pinellas County

Herring said investigators checked typewriters in Vihlen's county office and the "envelope could have been typed on that typewriter... the type is similar. "We have no evidence that Vihlen or his secretary typed the envelope or put the 24 cents postage (with meter) on the envelope," said Herring.

Mrs. Saunders, meanwhile, on Tuesday filed a lawsuit seeking in excess of \$1 million in damages against Vihlen for "slander and libel" over his reported charge that the Saunders campaign had "framed him."

"I call on the Saunders to drop the suit and bury the hatchet. At this point, I find myself in a position should the Saunders not drop the suit of having to defend myself. In an orderly defense I predict the Saunders will be subjected to additional extreme embarrassment in this unpleasant situation," Vihlen said.

Mrs. Saunders said she is completely satisfied that Herring's office has totally vindicated both her and her

Mrs. Saunders said she still feels an apology is due to the JoAnn Saunders campaign by Vihlen. She declined to say whether the lawsuit against Vihlen will be pursued or dropped until she has additional information.
