# Not Good Enough

If the overwhelming vote cast in Tuesday's election reveals a predominating sentiment that Sanford's present hospital is not good enough, it also shows that the election results themselves were not good enough. If Seminole County is to have the new hospital which a majority of at least four to one favors, it will have to do substan-tially better in the next election than it did this week.

Although returns from the county precincts are not yet available, unofficial results in the two Sanford pre-cincts show that 504 persons voted, with 417 in favor of the new hospital and only 87 against it. Incomplete re-turns from the county precincts show that the voting. while generally in favor of the hospital, was light, with seven procincts out of einteen casting 439 for and 113 against for a total vote of 606. Another election will now have to be called by the

County Commissioners at some time in the near future for the purpose of authorizing a bond issue to pay for the hospital. At this next election it will be necessary not only that a majority of the voters favor the hospital, but also that at least 51 percent of all the qualified freeholders
