Crew Is Taken Off Navy Ship By Helicopter

LEGHORN, Italy on—Four Navy Helleopters rescued the last crew man from the U. S. Navy ship Grommet Reefer today, 36 hours after she ran aground and broke to two off Leghorn.

The helicopters brought off 13 men. Previously 26 had been reported by breeches buoy and boat originally the Navy said 40 men were aboard, but this was revised today to 39.

The four windmill craft circled the stern of the wrecked refrigers for vessel. Then one after another

they hovered above the broken of section, lowered a sent, putled it up with a man aboard and flew to a Leghorn soccer field.

After helicopters were from the J. S. Aircraft carriers Midway and Levte. They landed briefly at Piss before starting the rescue operation.

Henry Saukant of Brooklyn, master of the Grommet Reefer, was the last member of the crew to leave her.

All 39 members of the erew were in good health, although they were kept in the U.S. Army Hospital here for examination and rest.
Four of the segmen allipsed into the sea from rope ladders and were picked up by a small Italian Navy boat.
