

# House Rejects U.S. Bomb Spending

WASHINGTON (AP) — To a backdrop of cheers and chants, the House has turned against administration Indochina war policy for the first time by rejecting a presidential request for more funds for Cambodian bombing. The House rejected President Nixon's spending proposal 219 to 188 Thursday. Then, by a 224-172 vote, the House added a prohibition against using any of a \$2.8-

billion supplemental appropriation for bombing in Cambodia. "We've gotten out of Southeast Asia," said Rep.

Robert N. Giaimo, D-Conn. "Let's stay out." Secretary of Defense Elliot L. Richardson has said that Congress' rejection of the spending authority would not halt the Cambodia bombing because the

# Pastor's Corner Faithful

To The End

"For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith: henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but also to all them that have loved his appearing." (2

Recently I read a novel which had a terrible ending: everyone in the world was killed. Years ago, all books, movies, or plays had a "happy ending," but now we are told that such things lean toward "realism," which according to the apparent definition, equals "tragedy.

Anyone who is mature, however, knows that life is like that: cruel and hard. Many stories and lives end in tragedy. I've heard people naively say, "Well, all things work out for good." But this is not true, for to this statement we must add. as does the Bible, "to them who love God" (Romans 8:28). Being a Christian guarantees us that the story of our lives will have a happy ending -- no one but Christ can guarantee

In the book of II Timothy, as noted above, the apostle Paul said, "the time of my departure is at hand." The conclusion to Paul's life is thus recorded here. Does this sound like a happy ending? He is a convict, awaiting execution. When the world wants to give someone an "unhappy ending," they use death: they killed Christ thinking it would do so, then others, and now Paul. To the world, death is the end - the unhappy end; but not to those in Christ. By studying this conclusion to Paul's life, we can learn how our lives may

In verses 6 and 7 Paul said that he was ready to die! Historical legend says that Paul was beheaded. It's hard to imagine being ready for such an ordeal! What kind of society would waste such a man as Paul - a man who had given away a fortune, forscok his home, and sacrificed much for the sake of his fellow man. I can just see this grand old champion of Christ, fearless and forgiving, one martyr

This martyr had "fought a good fight." He had not been a coward or ashamed to fight for his Lord; he had made a good impression for Christ and had won the victory! The Christian life is a battle; every day we meet in hand to hand combat with the forces of Satan, and we must even defeat our own selfish nature before the victory can be declared. The wayside is filled with those who did not fight a good fight they quit, defeated. Christianity was just too much for them. But the victorious Christian, like Paul, must "finish the

course." When I was in high school I had a good friend who led by a big margin during the first three and one-half laps of a mile race; but on the last stretch, he fell and dropped out. Even though he was undoubtedly the fastest runner in the race, he lost, because he did not "finish the course. tragic that many will not finish the course. The conquering Christian must also "keep the faith."

Before entering a contest, ancient athletes had to take an oath that they had trained 10 months, would use no trickery, and would obey the rules with honor. Have you been as faithful to Christ? This is how to be ready to die: to be a faithful

Paul said that his reward was waiting: a "crown of rightousness." This "crown" is symbolic of all the great promises that the Bible makes to the Christian, and it is offered to all who are ready. Will you be ready?

# Space Age Report Survey Fails To Muffle Space Criticism

Ever since the Apollo 11 astronauts landed on the moon there has been a constant give-andtake among Americans over whether we should go on spending so much money on space projects whose benefits on earth are debatable to say the

Before Astronauts Neil Armstrong and Edwin (Buzz) Aldrin set foot on the lunar surface it had been almost unpatriotic to criticize the Apollo program, or what was to follow it. The late President John F. Kennedy had sent America on a sort of crusade early in the 1960s The Holy Grail was to be manned moon landings in the decade of the 1960s.

Once the achievement came to pass in mid-1969 and proved out the success that comes when a nation unifies behind a single project enhanced because for a time we thought it was a space race with Russia - adventures beyond the earth lost their luster for a lot of people especially taxpayers and some members of Congress. Then the federal space agency was hard put to show the public that technological spin-offs from Mercury, Gemini, Apollo and other space projects had paid off handsomely in earthly benefits.

Now Midwest Research Institute (MRI) has produced a 340-page study for the space agency which concludes that about \$29 billion spent on civilian space research and development between 1959 and 1969 brought a \$56 billion return to the U.S. economy through 1970. By 1987 space know-how and what it has developed in earthly benefits will have returned a \$207 billion economic dividend, the MRI study adds.

The analysis was aimed at measuring "technology's contribution to the nation's wealth

# Exile Doctors Training At UofM

MIAMI - A unique medical program offered by the University of Miami has enabled more than 2,000 Cuban exile physicians to set up practice in the United States.

When Premier Fidel Castro came to power in 1959, there were approximately 6,600 physicians in Cuba. Over 2,200 have fied Cuba during the last 14 years, many of them to the In the states, however, the doctors were unable to con-

tinue with their profession. Rigid state laws prohibit foreigners from practicing medicine unless they have medical degrees issued by American universities. No matter how good a doctor the Cuban physician might be, he could not practice in the United States. Unable to earn

livings as doctors, the Cuban physicians had to accept whatever work might be available, some of it menial. At the same time, Miami was faced with a rapidly swelling Cuban exile population as refugees poured out of Cuba. There was a growing need for more physicians. Recognizing that to qualify the exile physicians for practice in the United States would solve their problem as well as ease the community's need for more doctors, the University of Miami set up a Post-Graduate Medical Program for Cuban refugees. This would be made up of 12-

The courses consisted of refresher material in basic medical-related sciences and a review of the fields of medicine, preventive medicine, surgery, pediatrics, and obstetrics and gynecology. In addition, the courses included study of the English medical vocabulary and of pronunciation and grammar. This language teaching was particularly important in enabling the doctors to pass their state exams as well as to keep up with medical literature.

Examinations were and are administered by the Educational Council for Foreign Medical Graduates. Passing of the exams permits a Cuban doctor to work as an intern or resident physician. Those states that do not have a citizenship requirement permit doctors to apply for full medical licenses after they pass the ECFMG tests. To date, 2,166 Cuban physicians have gone through the program. Approximately 400 now practice medicine in the



Finally, they don't understand or won't face the extent of political scandal in virtually every nation with which we deal.

President Truman, who began as a vigorous president, was not noticeably hampered by the suspicions which surrounded him from the beginning of his term because of his longtime friendship with crooked party bosses, his close alliance with friends and hangers-on who used White House influence for favors, or finally by the multitude of scandals which enveloped his administration toward the end of his presidency.

It will be recalled that some of the scandals which developed during the Truman administration actually led, after Mr. Truman's term was ended, to the conviction and imprisonmen of Assistant Attorney General Lamar Caudle, and Matthew Connelly, who had been in the White House as Mr. Truman's appointments secretary. Mr. Truman, too, defended his old friends.

One can argue that Watergate was different in that it affected, or was meant to affect, the political process. But there are few countries in the world where this will come as a surprise-or where election scandals are more shocking than large-scale fraud and influence buying.

As secretary of State, Dean Acheson did not lose his effectiveness as a result of his close personal friendship with a protege accused of having engaged in espionage for the Soviet Union and sent to prison for perjury in the matter. Achesen was not noticeably touched even after telling reporters in a dramatic meeting that "I will not turn my back on Alger Hiss.

A reading of history tells us those American presidents who have been strong in foreign policy have pursued negotiations with forcefulness and imagination, regardless of their position at home and without relationship to the prestige of the United States at the time. with the same of t

furning from scandals. President Johnson was viewed with high disfavor in a number of foreign nations for his part in the Vietnam war. Yet on matters in which he took an active interest, Nrc. Johnson was powerful in his dealings abroad.

It must not be forgotten that a considerable number of the key countries with which Mr. Nixon will deal in the years just ahead are accustomed to major scandals in high government places. These nations are not likely to let a White House scandal interfere with their national interests. Certainly some will attempt to use Watergate politically as leverage to embarrass Mr. Nixon in order to get a better deal. But it seems unlikely Watergate will affect the outcome unless the President's blood turns to water, which is improbable.

With some countries there will be a positive spin-off. As one African newspaper put it it is easy to talk these days of corruption in the United States, but in how many other countries could newspapers so openly criticize the That is, in some countries there now may be a clearer

understanding of the deep strengths of a democracy.

Davidson, is an American, the association was launched and has its headquarters in London. One way APHIA proposes to live up to its name is by awarding a Noble Prize (as distinguished from Nobel Prize) each year to candidates who have contributed to humor-er, humour





# Skylab Astronauts Ready For Flight

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) - The Skylab 1 astronauts conclude training and receive final major preflight physical examinations today as a dual countdown moves smoothly toward next week's doubleheader launching of America's first space station mission.

Space agency doctors will examine Charles Conrad Jr., Paul J. Weitz and Dr. Joseph P. Kerwin for several hours to determine their fitness for the mission and to gather medical data for

inflight and postflight comparison. The physicals were scheduled for Houston's Johnson Space Center.

When 60 cars rolled off the grid for the start of the third annual Winston 500, THE SANFORD HERALD WAS

### Quote Of The Race

It had to come from Bloys Britt, Associated Press racing Writer. First let's set the scene. When the yellow flag comes out, most drivers steer their cars into the pits. Racing writers also make a pit stop of sorts, heading for the nearest rest room with the assurance that they probably won't miss anything because the caution flag is out. When they had that 19-car pile-up, there was enough

### Did Starting 60 Cars Cause Crash

You can't say the increased number of starters caused the big 19-car pile-up, but it certainly worsened the situation. Normally, 50 cars start at Talladega. Of the 19 in the wreck, six were from the bottom 10 qualifiers. There were five in the top 10, six if you count a 20th car, the STP Dodge driven by Richard Petty. Petty wasn't actually involed in the wreck, but hit a piece of metal from it that damaged the oil pan on his car and eventually caused him to drop out of the action. The bad thing about those 10 extra cars that started were

190 mph, that's quite a spread. David Pearson was the winner in the Wood Brothers Mercury, and although he wouldn't come out against the 60car field, he suggested that there might be a limit to the speed gap between the fastest and slowest drivers.

And Junior Johnson's Kare Kar team probably didn't have any trouble getting another car ready for Cale Yarborough. But what about the independents. Take for instance Ron Keselowski of Pontiac, Mich., who wrecked his 1972 Dodge in

He doesn't have the money poured into his operation like sponsored drivers, so he's suffering the loss alone. That car was his life. It represented a lot of money and months of

But Kesolowski is facing that fact that his racing career may be over. Without being on a team or having a nice sponsorship, he may never be able to put together a racing

Maybe you've never heard of Ron Kesolowski, but I'll bet there was a time that no one had heard of Buddy Baker, David Pearson, Bobby Isaac or any of the other key NASCAR competitors currently making their living from auto racing.

### It Seems Unfair

It really seems unfair that everything goes to a select few in auto racing. The ones that qualify fastest get money, and they're usually the ones that finish high for the best

And those same fast qualifiers get the free tires, while the slower cars whose drivers may never see the top ten and may win less in a season that some drivers make in one race, are the independents who must buy their own tires along with all the other expenses.

And when there was a tire shortage at Talladega prior to the Winston 500, you can bet your bottom dollar that these same independents were the only ones short. It was so bad, going into the race there were drivers with only the four tires on their car.

### Autographs At Motel

While in Alabama for the races, we staved at the same motel where several of the drivers were staying. It's really strange to see NASCAR greats such as Petty, Pearson or Bobby Isaac walking around without the dirty jump suits. I really don't know what it is, but the fans either just

don't recognize the drivers out of their racing attire or they're just afraid to go up and ask for autograph, because the drivers are able to enjoy a little peace and quiet.

In an interview Thursday night with the Senate investigators, Gray, according to some newspaper accounts, told Nixon in a telephone conversation July 6, 1972, there was "confusion" and apparent White House obstacles in the path of

the investigation. These accounts, however, said Gray mentioned no specifics to the President and gave investigators no evidence either

he or Nixon knew of a White House coverup.

But other accounts, including that of the New York Daily News, said Gray told investigators Ehrlichman "inhibited" the investigation from the start and that Gray followed Ehrlichman's instructions only after he was "satisfied" Nixon was aware of Ehrlichman's actions.

The News said Ehrlichman insisted on the morning of June 28 on canceling the meeting planned for that afternoon between FBI and CIA executives, even when Gray told him he suspected the CIA of involvement in Watergate. The News cited no sources for

Most accounts agreed that Gray told investigators he voiced his concerns on July 5, 1972, to Clark MacGregor, then director of the Committee for the Re-election of the President, and asked him to tell Nix-
