Poland, Vatican Now Quarreling

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Poland's Communist government and the Roman Catholic Church agreed nearly three years ago to improve relations. Now they're quarreling.

The Polish Primate, Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski, has been firing off salvoes this week calling on Poles to defend themselves against enforced atheism.

He is angry that government plans for educating Polish youth exclude any role for the church. He claims the education will be too "materialistic" and "atheistic."

Missing Records Snare 'Papers' Trial Snarls

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Pentagon papers trial moves into new legal entanglements today following disclosures that Daniel Ellsberg was overheard by federal wiretappers whose records have vanished.

The FBI revealed the government researcher was heard on a wiretap up to two years before he released the Pentagon papers to the news media.

U.S. District Court Judge Matt Byrne, demanding that the government answer to him today about the disappearance of 1969 and 1970 wiretap logs, also has told attorneys for both sides to be prepared for legal arguments on the wiretap issue.

WASHINGTON (AP) — James W. McCord Jr. has testified under oath that he never would have participated in the Watergate operation without assurance that Atty. Gen. John N. Mitchell had approved it.

McCord also swore that fellow convicted conspirator G. Robert Baker and another conversation while President Nixon's campaign chairman, after he quit as attorney general.

McCord said Liddy had told him Mitchell urged the wiretaps to be started in mid-April 1972, and later prodded the bug crew to make its second entry into Democratic headquarters on June 17, when five of them were arrested.

Public TV Declares New Independence

MIAMI (AP) — Condemning "government interference in programming," Miami's noncommercial television has declared its independence from federal funding.

"Any government that seeks to circumvent the right to free expression must be repudiated," said William S. Frates, chairman of the board of WPBT. "Public broadcasting cannot be the voice of government."

Frates said while the station would not refuse federal funding, it wanted to "make it clear to viewers that Channel 2 must be able to stand on its own — independent of federal monies."

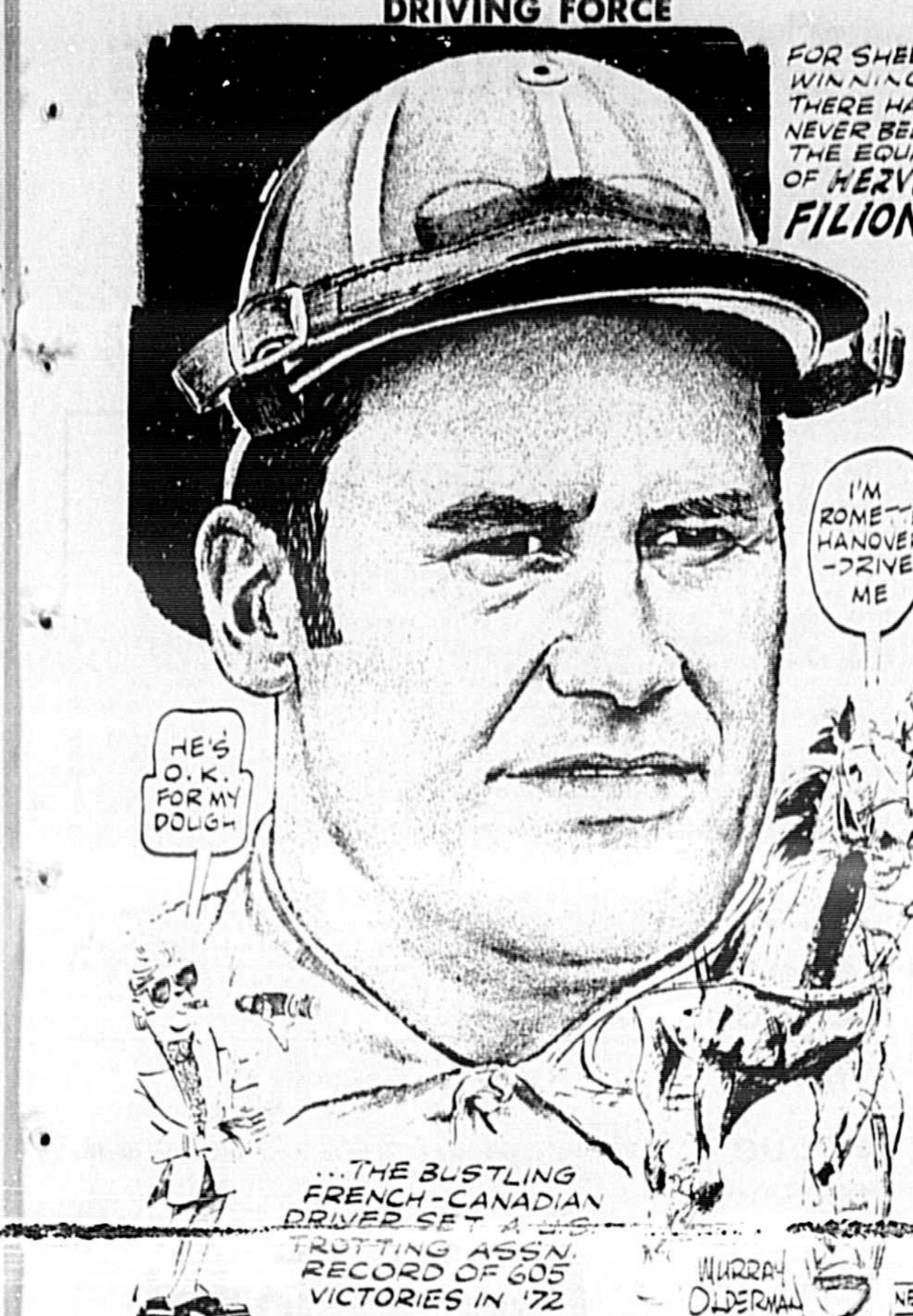

# Stanley Cup Champions Fail To 'Whoop It Up'

By JOE MOOSHIL Associated Press Sports Writer CHICAGO (AP)— Their objective achieved, the Montreal Canadiens took turns sipping champagne from the coveted Stanley Cup which they earned Thursday night with a hard-fought 6-4 victory over the Chicago Black Hawks.

Aside from a shout here and there, there was no whooping it up, no hollering and no spraying of champagne. They were tired, weary warriors. They had done their job. The Stanley Cup now goes back to Montreal where they feel it belongs following a one year absence in Boston.

The Stanley Cup is the only trophy, said Yvan Courveter, who set a playoff record of 15 goals when he hammered in the tie-breaking and winning goal at 8:13 of the third period.

Aside from Courveter's record, the 56 goals for two teams for a final series set a record for not only six games, with the Canadiens winning

four to two for Chicago, but it also set a record for seven games. Montreal's 33 goals was also a one-team record.

"Tough series," said Montreal goalie Ken Dryden. "It was real tough. But nothing we didn't expect."

The puck went over the net, hit the glass boards and bounced back in front of the Chicago goalie.

"It was still bouncing but I wanted to get the shot off as quickly as possible," said Courveter. "I think Esposito was off balance when it went by him."

Marc Tardif added a power play goal at 12:42 and that was the end of the scoring in the record shattering series.

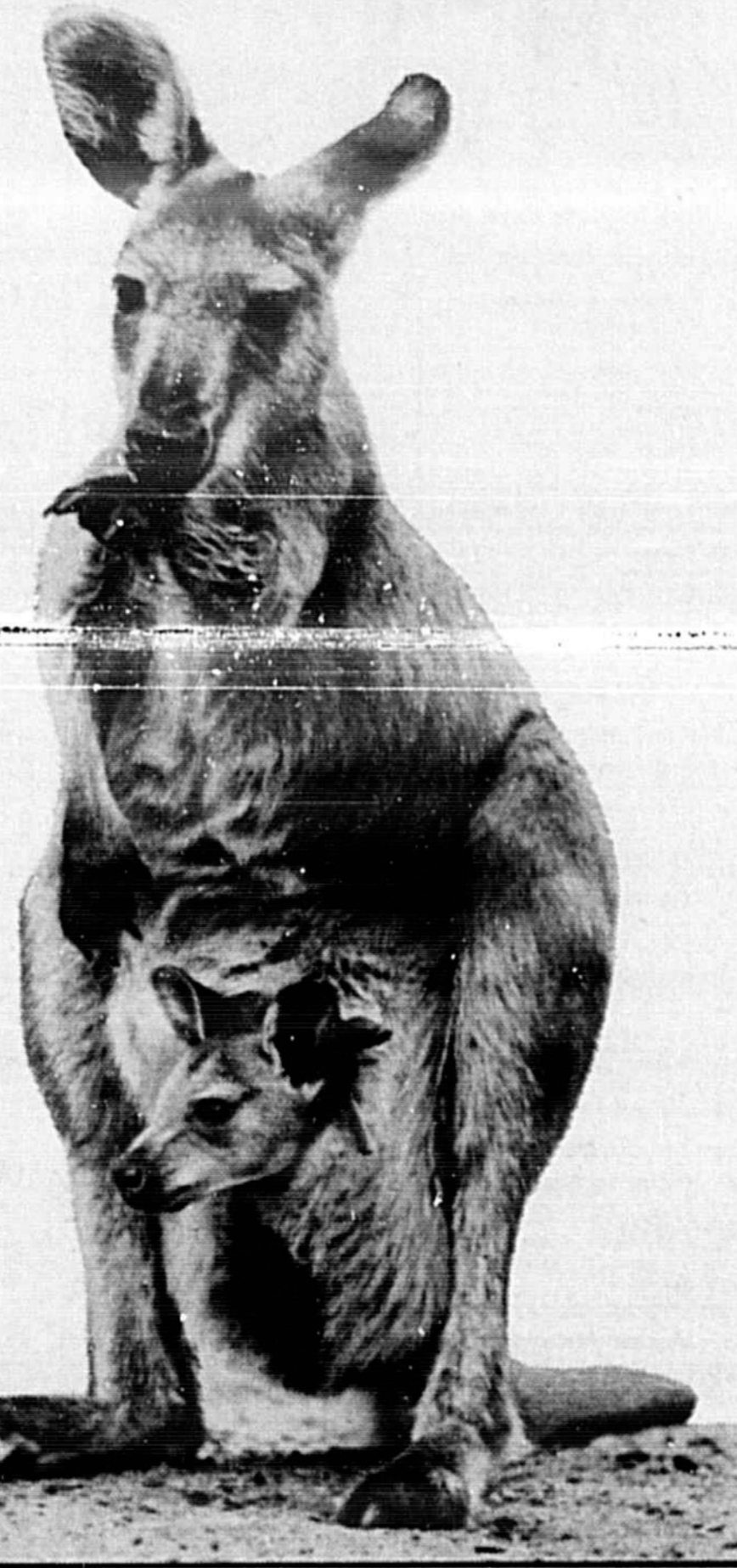
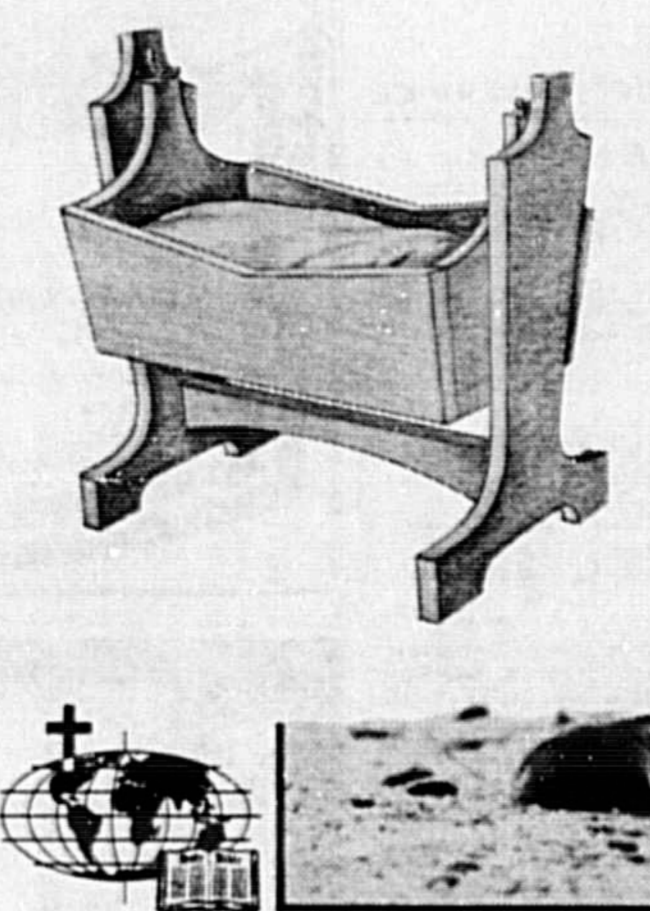

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Daniel Ellsberg and Anthony Russo, freed of charges in the Pentagon papers case because of government misconduct, say they will sue President Nixon for "conspiracy to deprive us of our civil liberties."

Ellsberg, calm and smiling, told newsmen the Watergate and White House involvement in his case reminded him of Mafia tactics. "I think of the code of the Mafia," he said. "Silence. That has been the code of the White House."

Russo said he believed the sudden disclosures of wiretaps, a break-in at the office of Ellsberg's psychiatrist and an undercover White House investigation of Ellsberg had shown that "our country has been run by criminals."

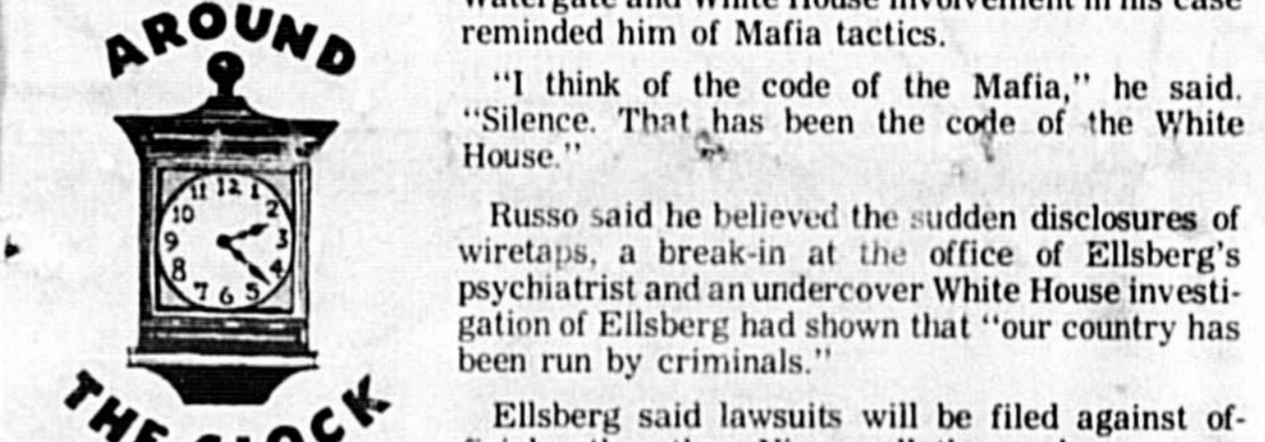
Aides Interfered, Gray Tells Nixon

WASHINGTON (AP) — L. Patrick Gray III told President Nixon 19 days after the Watergate arrests he was disturbed at the role White House aides appeared to be playing in the possibility the Central Intelligence Agency played a role in the Watergate bugging.
