740 Cars Grapefruit Shipped In Past Week

New Comet Has Been Found By Scientists

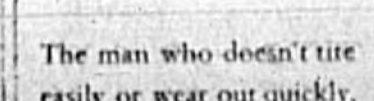
CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Mar. 15.—(INS)—A New Comet, of the tenth magnitude has been discovered near the star Beta in the Constellation Libra. It has a daily motion of 16 seconds west and 19 seconds north.

The Comet was reported today to Harvard College Observatory by Prof. Frederick Slocum of Wesleyan University, Director of the Van Vleck Observatory at Middletown, Conn. It was discovered by Prof. Stearns at the Van Vleck Observatory about 5 o'clock on the morning of March 10.

February Construction In Southeastern Area Totals \$46,118,500, Says Report

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Mar. 14.—(INS)—Construction started in February in the southeastern states totaled \$46,118,500, an increase of nine per cent over January, but 46 per cent under February of last year, according to a statement received here today from the F. W. Dodge Corporation.

Included in the month's construction record were the following important items, the statement said: \$12,586,900, or 26 per cent, for public works and buildings; \$11,985,000, or 14 per cent, for industrial buildings; and \$4,501,400, or 13 per cent, for commercial projects.

A total of \$88,456,900 was reached in the first two months of the year, being a decrease of 48 per cent for the first two months of 1926, the statement continued. "Contemplated New York to the amount of \$77,774,000 was reported in February. Decreases of 13 per cent from January, 56 per cent from February of last year are shown by last month's figures."

The southeastern states, in addition to Florida, included the Carolinas, Georgia, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas and Louisiana.

Building and engineering contracts awarded during February in the 37 states east of the Rocky Mountains totaled \$39,489,500, an increase of three per cent over January and a decrease of three per cent from February of last year, the statement said, adding that the territory covered by this record includes approximately 91 per cent of the total construction volume of the country.
