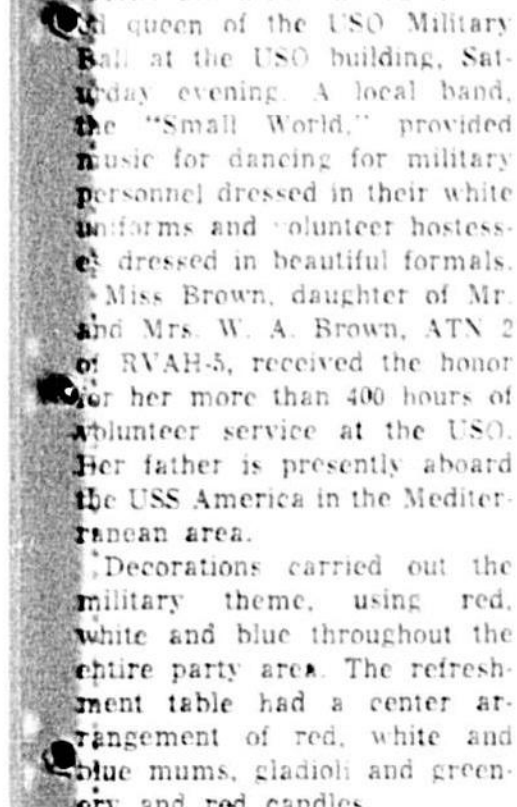

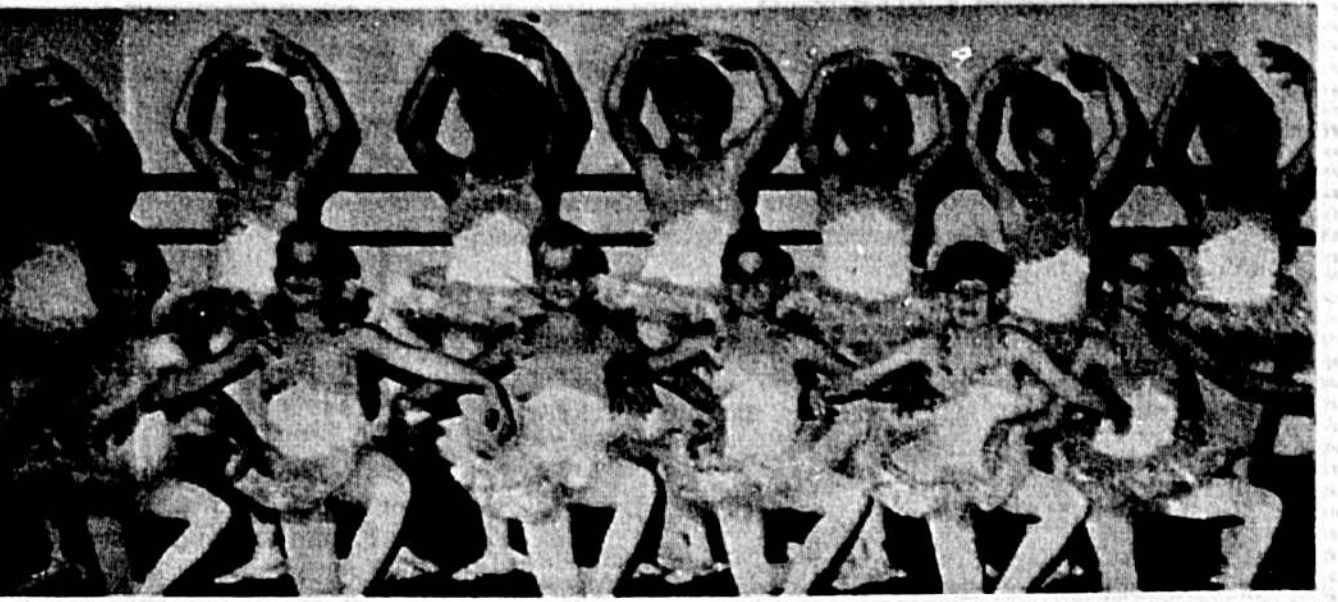

## GI Group Cut Up In Ambush

SAIGON (AP) — A company of about 150 American soldiers was badly cut up today fighting off an ambush by North Vietnamese soldiers wearing flashy berets and Communist suicide snipers lashed in trees. The U. S. Command in Saigon said five of the American troops were killed and 46 wounded, but a report from the battlefield said about half of the company was killed or wounded. The U. S. Command said 71 North Vietnamese were killed.

AP Correspondent John Wheeler reported from the central highlands that the 4th Division company was hit while searching the jungle for two Red regiments. The company commander was cut down in the first volley of coordinated sniping and mortar fire. The Communists attacked a few hours after daybreak in an area where the 4th Division men have fought six stiff fights in the past eight days. The battlefield was just over three miles from the Cambodian border on the western border of Pleiku Province.

The assault was made by about 50 North Vietnamese who were in accurate supporting air and artillery fire. The Communists snipers were lashed high in the dense foliage and their fire caused many of the American casualties. During the battle, one platoon from a nearby company managed to fight its way through to join the embattled company. Holding their ground determinedly, the Americans formed a perimeter and found what they could against the raking fire of Red mortars and machine guns. AK-47 sub-machine guns carried by the North Vietnamese troops were used to snipe at the Americans.

## Big Snow, Gales Hit N. England

Heavy rain, snow and gales swept wide areas in New England today as a damaging late spring storm caused flooding from Cape Cod, Mass., to Portland, Maine. Gales warned were posted along coastal areas of Massachusetts, Rhode Island and New Hampshire.

High tides, swept by the gusty winds, were 2 to 3 feet above normal from Cape Cod to Portland. Communities along the coast reported street flooding up to 3 feet. Some families were evacuated. There were power failures in many communities, including several sections of Boston.

The high winds toppled utility poles, uprooted trees and smashed windows. The storms caused extensive damage to crops. Damage was estimated at \$1 million to poles and nets used to protect the Connecticut River valley tobacco crop. The weight of the snow collapsed the equipment, mostly in the northern valley areas. Rain and snow also caused damage to other crops in New England.

Rangers at the Cape Cod National Seashore said winds of 75 m.p.h. Thursday lashed Provincetown, on the tip of Cape Cod. Winds were clocked at more than 50 m.p.h. along the New England coast and they were more than 60 m.p.h. east of the Rhode Island coast and along the Cape Cod. Eight inches of snow was reported at East Burke, Vt., with 7 inches in mountain areas of New Hampshire. Six inches of snow fell in less than five hours Thursday at Montpelier, Vt. Snow mixed with rain in the cold air in Boston were the mercury dropped to 40 degrees, a record low mark for May 25.

## LBJ Proposes Peace Confab

OTTAWA (AP) — President Johnson told Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson he may propose a Big Four summit conference if the United Nations fails to cool off the Middle East crisis. Johnson said the talks covered "problems of peace in the world today," including the Middle East situation and the Vietnam war. Pearson said they discussed "the very dangerous and difficult international situation."

Neither gave any details. France earlier this week proposed the Big Four join in a concerted effort for peace in the Middle East but made no mention of a summit conference. U.S. Ambassador Arthur J. Goldberg seconded the French proposal at the Security Council meeting Wednesday but got a cool reception from Soviet Delegate Nikolai T. Fedorenko. Fedorenko did not reject the proposal outright but said if the United States and Britain really want to relax tensions, they should withdraw their Navy ships from the Mediterranean.

Sen. Joseph McClellan, R-Tampa, voted the bill with Democrats and explained later that "I cannot conscientiously fail to support what I feel to be a big step forward for education." The former law school dean said he had pledged his support to "quality education."

## Darden Guilty Of Larceny

ROCKLEDGE (AP) — Prominent educator Woodrow J. Darden has been found guilty of using a boiler, purchased by the Brevard County school system, to heat the swimming pool at his home.

The grand larceny conviction is punishable by a \$1,000 fine or five years in prison. Judge Cecil Rosser said he would pass sentence June 3. Darden, who headed the \$33 million a year school system for 14 years, was acquitted on charges that he also did not pay for light fixtures, a washer-dryer and an intercom system. Darden was indicted after an investigation by Gov. Claude Kirk's crime unit. Darden's attorney, Edward Kunkin, called the organization's jury verdict a compromise and said it would be appealed. If Darden was guilty of one charge, he was guilty of all four, the attorney said.

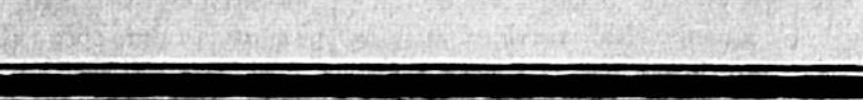

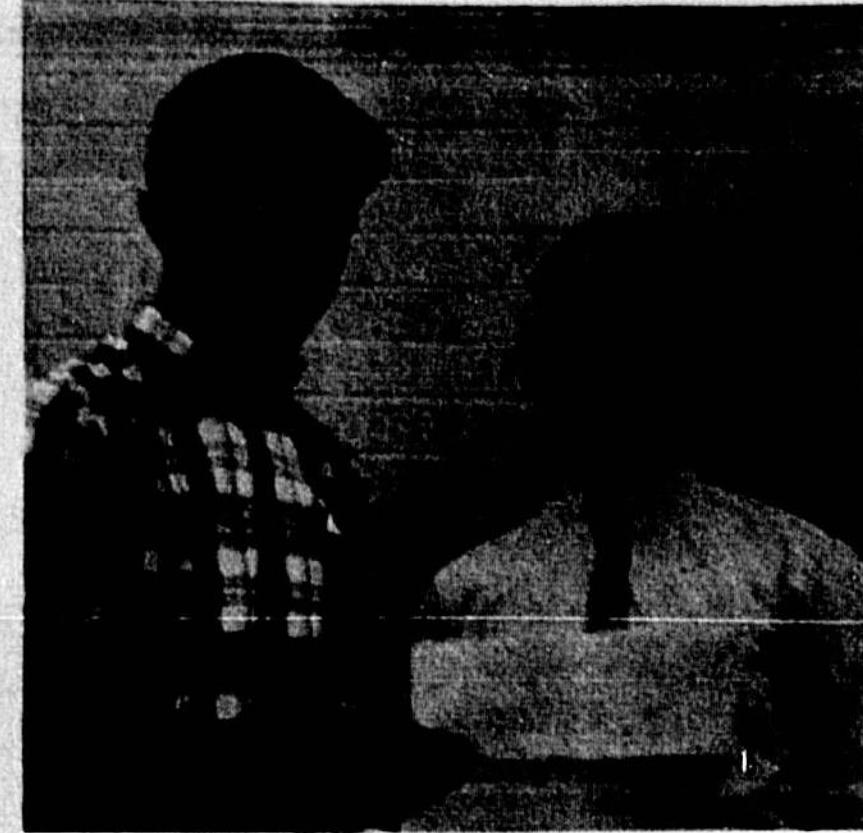
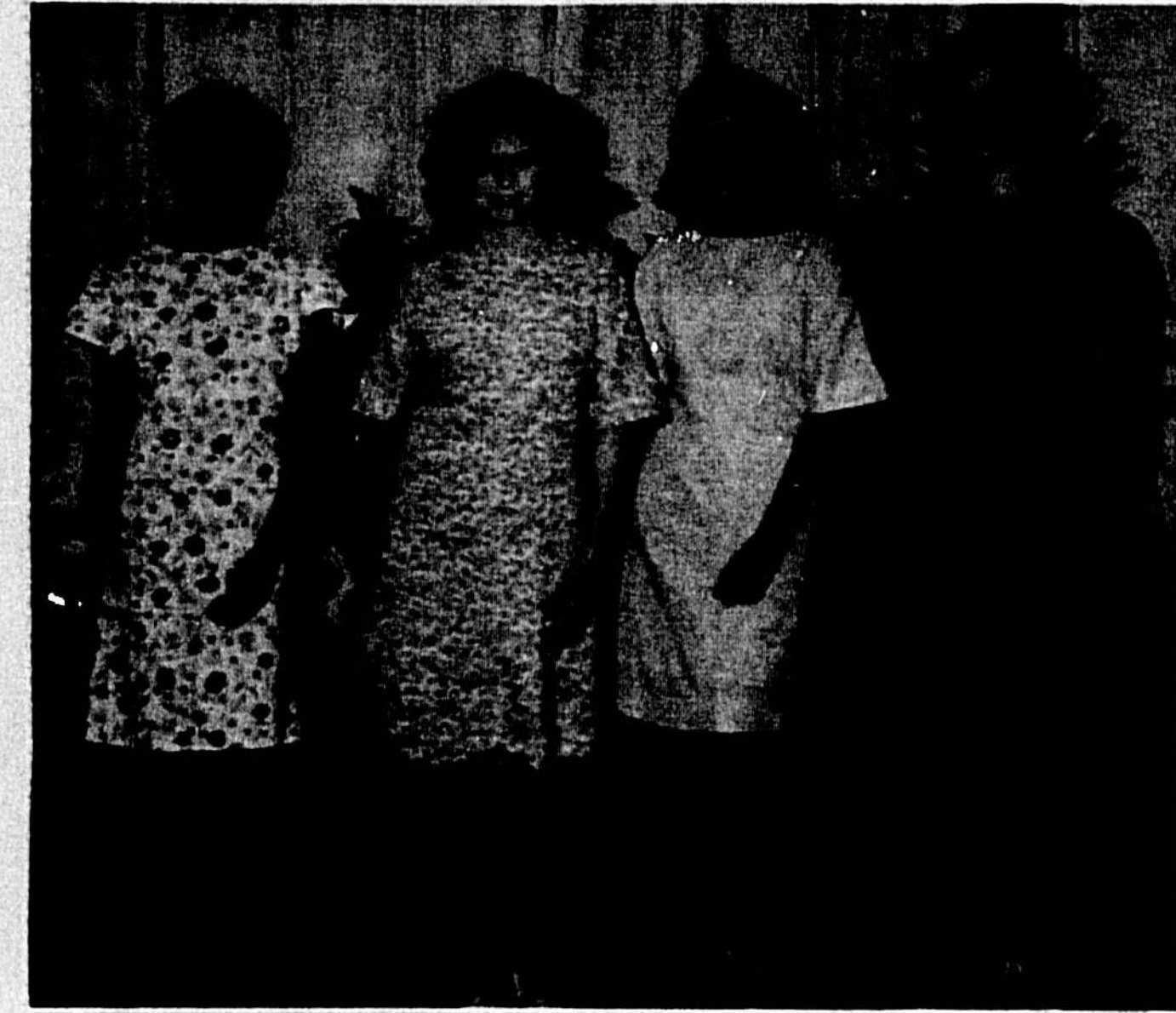
