

STORM WINDS RAGE TOWARD MAINE COAST

14 Persons Known To Be Dead In Carolina As Result Of Hurricane Destruction

A hurricane runaway, mad from the tropics, sent gales raging toward Maine's coast today after wreaking death and destruction on other parts of the Atlantic seaboard.

Fourteen persons were known to be dead in North Carolina where the storm struck a most vicious blow. Six persons were missing there. Property damage was above \$2,000,000.

NEW YORK, Sept. 18.—(AP)—Gales whipped the Massachusetts coast last night as the last of the tropical hurricane which damaged the Carolina coast, moved along the New England seaboard.

NEW YORK, Sept. 18.—(AP)—The casualty list in the hurricane which swept the North Carolina coast Friday and Saturday was 14 today as additional reports came in. Property damage is steadily mounting to over \$2,000,000. A terse message from a patrol boat at Morehead City to the coast guard here said four members of the family were drowned when the schooner Dale of Sea Level was wrecked. Several settlements still are isolated and no word is expected before tonight.

LAMSON CLINGS TO HOPE OF BEING SAVED BY APPEAL

SAN JOSE, Calif., Sept. 18.—(AP)—Convicted of wife-murder and facing death on the gallows, David Lamson, 31-year-old Stanford University publishing house executive yesterday clung to the hope of being saved by an appeal.

Late Saturday night Lamson walked into the courtroom of Superior Judge Robert B. Syer and heard a jury of seven men and five women decree him "guilty as charged" of being to death his pretty wife, Allene Therpe Lamson, in their cottage on the university campus last Memorial Day.
