If the adjusted sales price was more than \$20,000, the part of the profit which would be tax free is the ratio between \$20,000 and the adjusted sales price. Assume your adjusted sales price was \$30,000 and your profit \$15,000. In this case, \$20,000 being two-thirds of \$30,000, two-thirds of your
