COTTON MEET DECIDES UPON CUT IN ACREAGE

Adopted Plan Also Calls for Retirement of 4,000,000 Bales of This Year's Crop; Banks Asked to Co-Operate

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Oct. 14.-(AP)—A plan for meeting the cotton price emergency was adopted here today by the conference of representatives of cotton growing states which then adjourned, leaving the execution of the program to advisory councils and general committees in each state.

The approved plan calls for the retention of 4,000,000 bales of the current crop as the only practical means of handling this year's surplus. This withdrawal might be accomplished by a "reasonable reduction" in the crop for 1927.

POLICE BELIEVE MAN'S LONG FALL WAS ACCIDENTAL

H. H. Topakyun Is Thought to Have Lost His Balance In Trying to Recover Brief Case From Window Ledge

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.-(AP)—A 17-story fall from the Yale Club which killed H. H. Topakyun, wealthy importer, lavish entertainer and friend of presidents, was regarded by the police today as an accident.

A satchel and a brief case, which fell also, led to the belief that in trying to recover these articles from the window ledge, he lost his balance. No witnesses of the fall was found.

The window is in a hallway of the apartment of E. Dudley Kohler, Mr. Topakyun's attorney. All the other windows in the apartment were closed when he fell. Mr. Topakyun was waiting for Mr. Kohler, who had arrived at the street door of the club a few minutes after the accident yesterday and identified the body.

Mr. Topakyun's home in Morris Plains, N. J., his brother-in-law, Harvey Elder said that although Mr. Topakyun's health had not been good for about two years, there was no reason to believe that he had committed suicide.

JURY SPEEDS ITS INVESTIGATION OF POLITICAL GRAFT

INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 14.-(AP)—The Marion county grand jury today speeded up its investigation into charges of alleged political corruption in Indiana with a view to completing the taking of testimony within the next two or three days.

Thomas Adams, publisher of the Vincennes Indiana Commercial, who originally made the charges of alleged bartering of offices by public officials, and D. C. Stephenson, named by Adams as a source of confirmation of the charges, have both testified before the grand jury and apparently only the gathering up of loose ends of testimony remained before conclusion of the probe.

With Stephenson back in the Indiana state prison after his trip to Indianapolis, the grand jury session divided interest with the possibility of the corruption charges becoming the subject of a hearing by the Senatorial campaign funds investigating committee. St. Louis dispatches last night quoted a newspaper of that city as saying that United States Senator James A. Reed of Missouri, chairman of the Senate committee, had called a meeting of its members in Indianapolis.

Earl Klensch, former bodyguard of Stephenson, and who was acquitted last year when he was co-defendant with Stephenson on a charge of murdering Madge Oberholzer of Chicago, appearing in court yesterday for a hearing on a charge of conspiracy to obstruct justice.

Attorneys for Mrs. McPherson will then start the cross examination, in which it is expected the witness will be asked to explain a statement she admitted making to the effect her sister shared the cottage with Ormiston.

That the jury would investigate the new angle injected into the case yesterday by Lloyd Christian, Noblesville, attorney, appeared unlikely. Christian made a statement in which he said that he had while visiting Stephenson in the Hamilton county jail before the Oberholzer trial a check which he said was "payable to Ed Jackson (Governor of Indiana) for \$500," and signed by Stephenson. It was pointed out that the jury probably would not concern itself with this statement, inasmuch as Christian indicated that he did not now have possession of such a check.

Governor Jackson denied that he had received such a check from Stephenson. "D. C. Stephenson never at any time gave me a check for \$500 or any sum as a gift or for campaign purposes and any statement that he did is absolutely false," the Governor said.

The impression persisted here that Stephenson volunteered little if any information to the grand jury. It appeared to be based on the one thing, that duration of his session with the jurors which was considered too brief to permit the intricate revelations which Adams some time ago said would be forthcoming if Stephenson were called to testify.

Discarding the usual membership campaign, the Sanford Chamber of Commerce today mailed letters to all of the members, who subscribed to the trade body last year, and asked them to renew their subscription. The membership committee will continue the letter campaign for three weeks, according to E. J. Trotter, secretary of the chamber body. There will be no membership drive because it requires so much time of a campaign committee. Last year's members will be approached personally by the committee and they are not to be asked to renew.

State Industrial School For Girls At Ocala Has Met With Marked Success

OCALA, Fla., Oct. 13. (AP)—Succored in the building womanhood and the fitting of girls ranging in age from ten to eighteen years of age for the worthwhile pursuits of life has marked the operation of the Florida Industrial School for Girls, located in this city since its establishment in 1917.

Reports of the superintendent, Miss Bina Kite, show that the school which opened with 12 girls last year has 50 and during the past year has cared for approximately 400 ranging in age from eight to eighteen years and has sent them out into the world better prepared to care for themselves and to be of service to their community.

Miss Kite emphasized that the school is not a place for punishment but is a place for the training and educating of delinquent, dependent and unfortunate girls. She added that within the school were some very intelligent girls and that practically all took advantage of their opportunities gladly. At least 95 per cent of the girls are here because of poor home conditions, according to the superintendent, and they respond readily to good treatment. One of the first lessons necessary, continued Miss Kite, is that of obedience, a lesson which many of their parents have failed to teach.

The plan of operation of the school, which was established in 1917 through funds that had been appropriated by the state legislature at the 1915 session, as explained by the superintendent is one of studied system and one which has shown beneficial results. The appropriation was secured through the efforts of mostly women's civic organizations.

The girls are given a regular grammar school education through the eighth grade. Each girl at the school half a day and during the other half attends the regular sewing classes, domestic science classes and industrial work classes. All work except the farm work is done by the girls under the supervision of the teachers, matrons, and housemothers. In addition to their regular work, the girls last year picked 1,800 crates of tomatoes.

While the school is absolutely non-sectarian, religious services are held every Sunday by various ministers from the city. Chapel is held every evening during the week with the memorizing of Bible verses as a feature.

The general health of the girls at the school is considered good and of the 400 that have attended the school there has never been a death, according to the report.

The character standard of the girl who completes the course at the school is also very good, says the report, and many of those who were about to enter the track of wasted lives are now leading successful beneficial lives and the younger ones are growing into splendid womanhood.

Wife of Sir Robert Peel Is Unique Among Noblemen of England in That She is Only One in Films

NEW YORK, Oct. 13. (AP)—"Making faces" won fame and a perage for Beatrice Lillie, who as a little girl imitated people all day long. Today she is the only British peeress in motion pictures.

Miss Lillie, in private life is Lady Peel, wife of Sir Robert Peel, is unique among the noblemen of England. She has two identities—one as a society leader, wife and mother; the other as a stage and screen celebrity. She keeps the two distinctly apart.

Limited Neighbors Born in Toronto, the daughter of a musician, she was predestined for a musical career. But she liked to "make faces."

She imitated her family—she imitated the neighbors. She developed an ability at impersonation, and her mother, being wise, encouraged it. It did not help her eventually lead to fame on the stage. Her marriage to Sir Robert resulted from stage stardom, indirectly. And her debut in pictures, in the new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayor comedy, with Jack Pickford, resulted from her success in "Charles's Revue."

Comic Songs A Hit While in school, Miss Lillie worked out a series of comic songs "just for fun." She had played in New York and decided to essay London. She tried one of the "comic" songs. The effect was instantaneous. She was given a hearing by C. H. Buxton. The result was that London acclaimed her impersonation of the grand opera prima donna and the rest of her droll impersonations.

A Wife And Actress After her marriage she quit the stage for a time to rule over the Peel mansion. But as soon as her small son was able to accompany her, she and her husband worked out their present system. During the show season she's "Beatrice Lillie." Between seasons she's "Lady Peel."

Motion pictures are a new adventure to her but her talent for "making faces" will be re-employed in accurate portrayals of real types that are in themselves humorous. The studio lauds her as the discoverer on the screen of a comedienne.

German Woman Holding Doctor's Degree Enters Movies As Christa Tordy

BERLIN, Oct. 13. (AP)—From a philosophy with her major thesis the history of art, to a movie star is the career of Anne-Liese Ullhorn, of Wiesbaden. Her screen name is Christa Tordy.

Christa's cousin, Mady Christians is a popular film actress. Christa acted as Mady's secretary while she was a student at Berlin University. Christa after leaving Berlin University, attended Breslau University, where she passed her doctor's degree three months ago at the age of 22. When she returned to Berlin, Christa, through the efforts of Mady, was starred in "His Big Case," a detective story, the film of which was released in connection with the international police exposition now going on in Berlin. Christa's father is a wealthy manufacturer of chemical. Her late uncle, Rudolph Christians, was one of the leading actors in former Emperor Wilhelm's court theatre.

The German people are working today as never before. Approximately 2,000,000 more persons are earning their living than before the war, notwithstanding the fact that 1,500,000 unemployed are supported by doles, and despite the tremendous reductions in the standing army.

Where 50 per cent of the entire population was employed in gainful pursuits in 1913, government reports show more than 72 per cent so employed today. Yet the per capita income is only \$200 a year. The great middle class whose incomes from investments enabled it to live comfortably without working before the war, was virtually wiped out by the inflation of the mark. Daughters and sons of army officers, owners of landed estates and others who thought it beneath their dignity to work, have now been forced to help support their families. But even now there are 647 men for every new job open to men and 424 women for every job in which women are wanted.

When Shakespeare put the words, "a cup of sack" in the mouth of Falstaff in "Henry IV" he said something from which, according to a recent revelation, Germans derived their name for champagne.

Ludwig Derriert, noted German Shakespearean actor, it has been disclosed, originated the term back in 1880. Devriert dropped in on Lutter and Wagner's famous wine seller in Berlin with his author friend, E. T. A. Hoffman, using the original English for the

words he so often spoke from the stage in German, Devriert ordered "a cup of sack." The waiter misunderstood the English and brought champagne. Since then "sack" which Germans acquiring a knowledge of English would pronounce "sack" has designated champagne.

Red Cross Extended Medical Nursing Help To 113,000 Last Week

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13. (AP)—Red Cross relief forces operating in Florida extended medical nursing service to 113,000 persons last week, Harry M. Baker, director of district relief has reported. This figure includes inoculations against typhoid.

Food was distributed to 6,500 persons and clothing to 1,550 persons. Building and repair jobs were approved for 12,330 persons and fifty additional tents, to house 2,000 persons were provided. In the Miami area alone the missing persons bureau of the Red Cross handled 3,000 inquiries, making a grand total of 35,000 since the disaster.

Latest statistics show a total of 370 dead, 6,375 injured and 17,799 families urgently in need of Red Cross assistance.

A Lesson From the Cotton Farmers

Just why there should be such a feeding of after responsibility throughout the South in regard to the cotton situation is a wholly new development. Every thing seemed to be going all right with the farmers until the government estimated this year's crop at something over fifteen million bales. Then everybody got excited; a near panic ensued; and cotton dropped to less than twenty cents a pound.

As a matter of fact the world's consumption of American cotton amounted to 15,160,000 bales last year and while that figure may be somewhat reduced this year, there is little doubt that as much as twelve million bales could readily be disposed of at profitable figures. This would necessitate a storage of not more than three or four million bales of cotton on which the farmer can, or should be able to, borrow at very low interest rates.

The Wall Street Journal brings out the fact that South-ern banks should be able to take care of the farmers in the present situation and that it is their duty to do so. It justly ridicules the "buy a bale" movement and says, "A great opportunity rests with the bankers of the South today. On former similar occasions recourse was always had to New York to help the cotton farmer. But in recent years such a course has been unwise."

At the same time, a few years ago they were about 8 per cent, so they have more than kept pace with the banking expansion of the country.
