

















# Orlando Mental Hospital Closing Urged By Doctors

MIAMI (AP) - An investigating team has "strongly recommended closing Fiorida's largest mental retardation hospital, the Orlando Sunland Center, because of major uncorrected deficiences.

Another review team member reported that inadequate medical care could endanger patient's lives at the Miami Sunland Center.

The reports, made by two special physician teams in March, have not been released by the state, but the Miami Hearald reported on the doctors' findings in today's editions. The Herald said it obtained copies of the reports from an unidentified source The team investigating the Orlando

facility found that 400 patients were

still being served a cereal-like gruel

another investigation team had urged the meals be upgraded

The team also said "multiple fire hazards" existed at the Orlando center and criticized certain orders issued by

doctors as "frankly hazardous." "I think our recommendation that the facility be closed reflected our feelings of frustration the second time around," said Dr. Herbert Grossman, one of the members of the review

Both reports were made as followups to highly critical investigations of the two institutions last year.

The report on the Miami Sunland Center said "less than adequate" medical care was being provided at the facility. One doctor on the

vestigation team said this "could contribute to needless loss of lives."

The Miami center was critized for possible drug abuse by doctors who prescribed tranquilzers to control patients. The report also critized medical records at the facility as 'wholly inadequate."

The reports did cite some im provement at the institutions.

The committee studying the Orlando facility noted a sharp reduction in the number of controversial gastronomy operations, where a tube is implanted n a patient's stomach for feeding. The committee said only three new operations were performed last year and said some of the 200 gastronomy patients are again taking food orally




NEW YORK (AP) — A majority of Americans questioned by Time magazine think President Nixon knew about efforts to cover up the Watergate scandal, and 41 per cent figure Nixon approved the break-in plot.

The telephone poll of 1,037 voters last week by Crossley Surveys, Inc., for Time was almost finished before Nixon's latest denial on Friday of such participation in the political espionage case

Time added that 62 per cent of those questioned said they voted for Nixon's re-election last



PRINCETON, N.J. (AP) — Americans have become more concerned with the high cost of living than with the war in Southeast Asia, according to the Gallup Poll.

The poll also reported that the issue of corruption in government, specifically the Watergate affair, has become a matter of concern to 16 per cent of those polled, compared to one per cent in mid-February. The 1,531 adults interviewed May 4-6 were asked to name the nation's two most im-

portant problems. Sixty-two per cent named the high cost of living, with crime the second choice at 17 per cent. Governmental corruption and drugs followed with 16 per cent each.

Only seven per cent of those surveyed named the "Southeast Asia situation" as the major concern. According to a Gallup poll conducted in late January, the war was considered the major concern by 35 per cent of





Others remember the Nixon "kitchen debate" in Moscow in the 1950s when Mr. Nixon, then vice president, got lots of good press for snapping back at then Soviet Premier

#### Let's Get Away, Sir

President Nixon's homefront difficulties, not the least of which are skyrocketing food prices and the dreary Watergate affair, may increase his anticipation of his tall trip to European capitals as a means "to get away from it all." U.S. foreign relations continue to be the brightest feature of the Nixon record as the President settles into his second term.

And some of the most cheering news came out of the recent political gathering in Bonn of Willy Brandt's Social Democrat Party.

While Brandt's early overtures to the Soviet Union and its satellites in Eastern Europe may have caused some uneasy moments in Washington, his firm pro-American stand has never wavered.

The solid party endorsement given to Brandt's policies as chancellor assured Mr. committed support in West Germany.

Since the death of Charles de Gaulle, Brandt has stepped into the role of Europe's most influential leader. His close relations with the Committees nations neep to bridge the narrowing gap between East and West and could in time ease the U.S. burden of maintaining security in Western Europe.

Brandt's warning to America haters within his party was blunt: "We ... have no use for primitive 'anti' attitudes and especially not for anti-Americanism. Brandt was in Washington May 1 for talks

on trade, disarmament, security and the presence of U.S. troops in Germany And he assured Mr. Nixon undoubtedly

that the President's desire for global peace will overshadow such matters as domestic inflation and political shenanigans in dealing with his European hosts during his fall tour.

Laqueur warned that high defense costs, an upcoming energy crisis and other internal problem will limit considerably Russia's ability to meet payments on any U.S. trade pact.

"Why should Russia repay 10 or 20 years hence for U. S. products delivered now?" he asks. "A great deal may happen between now and 1985. American and Soviet trade shouls not be a one-

These few warnings seem to tell Mr. Nixon that he should forget his "kitchen debate" victory and be wary of any new "grain bargain" Mr. Brezhnev might offer.

# Military Retains Argentine Power

BUENOS AIRES-Now that Argentina's generals have been told to go back to the barracks, the questions is, how long will they stay there?

Though Argentina's recent presidential and congressional elections represented a nationwide repudiation of the sevenyear military dictatorship, the armed forces have never in the past been intimidated by what the civilians think. Indeed, the generals long have believed that the politicians are incapable of governing this well-fed, potentially rich South

Military sources privately concede that the only reason the armed forces agreed to hold presidential elections in the first place was because the high command believed it could outfox that aging, apparently impotent politician, Juan Domingo

A Charles De Gaulie-style "ballotage," or runoff, had been established by the military in the belief that the Peronists would never win the necessary 51 per cent majority in the first round of the nine-man presidential race. The theory was that all the anti-Peronists would join forces in the runoff to trounce the Peronist candidate.

In fact, Campora won nearly 50 per cent of the votes and the runoff plan was abandoned. His nearest competitor, the Radical Party's candidate, won only 21 per cent. Argentina's generals have never been very good at grasping realities.

For most of the country's history, they have insisted on playing king-maker, failing totally to understand that what the literate, sophisticated Argentines want is a stable democracy. Only two presidents have finished their term in office since 1928. One was Peron. The rest of the time, the generals

played musical chairs with the politicians. Few averaged even two years in office. Even such brilliant administrators as ex-President Arturo Frondizi were marched out of the presidential Pink House for failing to obey military orders.

# Space Walkers Envy Skylab 3

SPACE CENTER, Houston, Tex. (AP) The job of fixing America's overheated space station may call for the most ambitious spacewalk yet, but two astronauts who made previous spacewalks envy the Skylab 1 crew's

Astronauts Ken Mattingly and Ron Evans, who work at the Manned Space Center here, say men are well equipped to do space repairs The space station, Skylab, developed an

overheating problem after a heat shield burned away during the May 14 launch of the \$294 million orbiting laboratory from Cape Kennedy, Fla. The National Aeronautics and Space Ad-

ministration plans to launch astronauts Charles Conrad Jr., Paul J. Weitz and Dr. Joseph P. Kerwin in an Apollo spacecraft next Friday to do inspace repairs.

NASA officials say the astronauts will try to deploy a big parasol from Skylab's scientific air lock. If that cannot be done, they will attempt to deploy another canopy either by flying it into place with the Apollo ship or shoving it out from an airlock on a long pole. Soviet cosmonauts reportedly became exhausted while doing spacewalk tasks, but Mattingly and Evans say Americans can do

Mattingly refused to speculate on the feasibility of installing the sunshade, saying, "It's best not to promise we can do something unless we know it can be done.'

But he added, "We've got a tried and proven system there (the Apollo craft) and we know we can work in space."

Mattingly made a deep space excursion to retrieve some film cans during the Apollo 16 moon flight in 1972.





DEAR POLLY-I have so much leftover needlepoint yarn and would like to find a way to use it Does anyone know of a pattern that would be good to use for this? I might like to do a footstool top. Also, I have thought of a stained glass window effect that would use many colors and wonder if there are such patterns.-LORRAINE

DEAR POLLY-Please tell Mrs. R. L. M. how we solved the problem of a ceiling tile which was damaged while we were removing an unwanted ceiling fixture. Our tiles are stapled up and have narrow margins on the edges for that purpose. Find a matching tile and, with a knife or exacto cutter, cut off the edges. Be very careful when cutting down the damaged tile so as to only cut slightly in on it and not mess up the edges of the surrounding tiles. Glue the edges at contact points on the furring strips that are under the tile. We used a special adhesive for this and let it become very "tacky" before actually putting the new tile up. The tile did not have to be braced, which might have made a dent. This worked super and I cannot tell which tile is the new one.

DEAR POLLY-I have three suggestions for Mrs. R. L. M. who wants to repair a damaged ceiling tile. If a new tile is available, cut the old one out very carefully. Trim the grooves on the new one and then glue two very light, thin pieces of board across the back so that they extend 11/2 or 2 inches out from the edges. Insert this tile, with the boards on the back, into the hole and the boards will leave it suspended from the adjoining tiles. If the hole in the damaged tile is not too big, it

can be rounded and smoothed with a very sharp blade and a trimmed cork very gently pushed up into the hole, just a little past the surface of the tile. Use a plaster mix to level the surface. I had a model car paint that matched the used this to paint the plas-

tered cork. With patience any color can be matched. This is tedious but fun. The other way is to buy a ceiling plate that caps up electric outlets and it will not look too bad when put over the hole.-RUTH







# Draft Raid Squad Gets Acquittal

By EWART ROUSE

Associated Press Writer CAMDEN, N.J. (AP) - A jury has acquitted 17 persons of charges stemming from a raid on a draft board even though the defendants admitted participating and FBI agents caught many of them at the office.

Members of the federal court jury were not immediately available for comment on the verdict. But it was believed that testimony from an FBI informer and the trial judge's comments about "over-reaching participation by goverment agents" were major factors in the decision. The seven men and five women returned the innocent ver-

dicts in U.S. District Court on Sunday, the fourth day of their deliberations in the case of the "Camden 28." The acquittal was greeted by shouts of joy and applause from friends and relatives of the 17 Vietnam war protesters. who had been on trial since Feb. 5. One defendant, Joan Reilly of Brightwaters, N.Y., said

"It was 12 ordinary people like ourselves who took a stand and said, 'Government has gone too far - too far in Vietnam and the way it has tried to stop dissent in this country." The 17 were accused of conspiracy in connection with an abortive raid Aug. 22, 1971, on the Selective Service local of board here. Fifteen also were charged with breaking and entering and destroying draft records.

Twenty-eight persons originally were indicted. Ten of those were severed at the start of the trial, which took place in the Federal Building here, two floors below the scene of the raid. Another defendant pleaded guilty to a

Carl Broege of Newark, one of three defense attorneys. said he would seek dismissal of charges against the 10 remaining defendants. Asst. U.S. Atty. John Barry said he expected the charges would be dropped.

A key defense witness was FBI informer Robert W. Hardy. The 33-year-old self-employed contractor acknowledged that he had helped plan the raid and that he paid for equipment used during a laid with money furnished by the FBI. The defendants said they had dropped plans for the raid until Hardy revitalized them.

At one point in his testimoy, Hardy, who had infiltrated the group shortly before the raid, asserted that it never would have taken place "without the FBI and me." Judge Clarkson S. Fisher, in his charge, told the jury it must decide whether governmental participation in the raid went beyond the bounds of permissible law enforcement.




