## NATION **IN BRIEF**

#### **New York City Totters** On Brink Of Collapse

NEW YORK (AP) - New York City tottered on the brink of financial collapse today, its treasuries virtually empty and a rescue plan shattered by the last-minute refusal of a teachers' union to allow the use of pension

State and city officials worked frantically to get the union trustees of the pension funds to change their minds - or, failing that, to obtain more help from state pension monies or a loan from the Federal Reserve system.

But they appeared pessimistic about their chances of success. And the city, which had staved off default over six hectic months of financial maneuvering, faced a 3 p.m. deadline for \$453 million in debt obligations for which it has almost no cash.

#### **Economy Showing Progress**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Government figures show that the nation's industry marched solidly away from recession in September but that welfare costs rose 20 per cent during the last fiscal year because of the recession. The Federal Reserve Board said Thursday that the output of mines, factories and utilities increased 1.9 per cent in September, the fifth consecutive monthly increase and the largest gain since November 1964, when the advance was 2.8 per cent. The September increase was the biggest one-month jump in production in nearly 11 years. More production by industry means more jobs for Americans, and the production report released Thursday clearly was part of the "very encouraging" economic news predicted Wednesday by President Ford.

#### Privacy Fears Kill Purchase

WASHINGTON (AP) - A \$62-million deal to buy computers for the Agriculture Department has been killed after congressional criticism that it might lead to federal snooping into the private lives of farmers and other citizens.

The computer plan was scuttled after Congress a week ago approved a \$10.8 billion department appropriations bill, but reduced a "working capital" fund intended to help pay for the computers.

Joseph R. Wright Jr., assistant secretary of agriculture for administration, said Thursday that he had notified three computer companies - final bidders on the contract - that the project was canceled. Delivery of the computers was to have begun in December.

#### **Blue Cross Rates To Rise**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Blue Cross-Blue Shield says rates charged to some six million federal workers, who make up the largest single employe group covered by the plan, will spiral by about 35 per cent Jan. 1. The increase will mean that a federal employe now paying an average of \$154 per year for comprehensive coverage of his family will find his premiums increased to

"The use has been very high in the past year and costs continue to rise," Blue Cross spokesman J. S. Nagelschmidt said Thursday night in explaining the sharp boost in rates to federal workers and dependents.

#### Merchant Marine Backed

FORT LAUDERDALE (AP) - The chairman of a House subcommittee on oceanography says Congress must take aition to strengthen the U.S. Merchant Marine. Rep. Thomas N. Downing, DVa., warned Thursday that the number of U.S. merchant ships would be only marginally adequate in an emergency.

"We would not have sufficient U.S.-flag ships to provide direct support to the military, much less strategic raw materials on the commerce required during periods of national emergency," Downing said in a speech to the annual convention of the Propeller Club of the United States. The club supports waterborne commerce.

#### **Probers: Mafia Nixed Kill**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The CIA was prepared to pay the Mafia as much as \$100,000 to kill Cuban premier Fidel Castro at the time of the 1961 Bay of Pigs invasion, according to informed investigators.

However, the money was turned down by underworld figures Sam Giancana and John Rosselli, who agreed to undertake the mission for free, investigative sources said

As a result of the proposal, the CIA paid out "less than \$10,000, perhaps less than \$5,000" in expense money in the scheme to poison Castro, sources said.

#### Former Sexton Tells Of Deaths

WALLACE, Idaho (AP) — A former sexton at an Episcopalian church on trial for two murders sat calmly on the witness stand, smiling occasionally, as he described the deaths of 42 persons he claims to have killed in satanic worship and drug dealing.

Thomas Eugene Creech, 25, of Portland, Ore., spent a full day Thursday on the witness stand, denying that he was guilty of the two murders for which he is on trial. If his bizarre account of the other murders is true, it would become the largest mass murder case in U.S.







## Ford Ideas Merit **Look In Congress**

The crash program proposed by President Ford to attain independence from foreign sources of energy has stirred more doubt, perhaps, than

But it holds more promise than the discernible

alternative - no program at all.

Mr. Ford envisions creation of an Energy Independence Authority, which would generate the capital — which private industry cannot or will not provide — to develop and construct more nuclear and coal-fired electrical plants, to exploit the potential of solar and geothermal power generation and to speed the development of synthetic fuels from coal and shale.

The goal is a reasonable degree of energy independence by 1985. The federal investment over the next decade would be \$106 billion.

Skeptics say that although Mr. Ford's plan would lean heavily on initiative and investment from the private sector, it would, in effect, put the government in competition with industry. They fear the temptation to corruption of members of an authority that would have control of huge amounts of money. The power to determine companies worthy of federal subsidy lends itself to political favoritism and other forms of scalawaggery.

The more severe of presidential critics hint that the program is a political gimmick with its supplementary promise of more jobs to pump new life into the national economy.

There can be no quarrel, however, with the argument used by Mr. Ford to support his demand

"Last year," he said, "about three-fourths of all planned nuclear plants, and over one-fourth of all coal plants scheduled to be built in the next 10 years were postponed or canceled. Domestic oil production . . . has fallen by 11 per cent since early 1973. Natural gas production has declined so seriously that thousands of jobs are threatened this very winter."

And Congress continues to dawdle over the President's earlier recommendations - and its own counter-proposals. There is no reason, of course, to believe that

Congress will respond with any more alacrity to Mr. Ford's more grandiose suggestion. But the concept of a massive effort such as those that release the energy of the atom and put

men on the moon captures the imagination of proud and self-reliant Americans. Mr. Ford's vision merits the close consideration

and healthy debate of Congress on its methods. There is no question of the validity of its objectives.

## Fair, Not Equal

The Federal Communications Commission has put a good end to a bad rule — the long-standing "equal time" regulation. The rule required broadcasters to give equal time for responses from all legally qualified candidates whenever they covered radio and television news conferences and debates of any political candidates.

The rule was bad for broadcasters because it struck down the prime function of a newsman's editorial freedom and responsibility - that is, deciding the news value of various people and events. A rigid legalistic rule was imposed on a matter that should only be decided by the careful exercise of professional judgment.

The rule was bad for the general listening and viewing

public. It often meant an electronic news blackout on significant events involving major candidates because covering them would have required giving equal time for all candidates, no matter how marginal.

The rule was bad for politics because it attracted minor condidates to make races they had no hope of winning. It attracted losers who sought only the attention paid to them by the

Now that the rule has been repealed, broadcasters can demonstrate that it was a bad one by increasing their coverige of news events involving candidates for public office and by giving fair - not necessarily equal - coverage to all can Bevill: Private Gain From Public Service

## President Can't Match Bureaucrats

presidency" and the abuse of executive power, the fact of the matter is that a president is to a startling degree at the mercy not only of Congress but of a horde of invisible bureaucrats who are virtually immune to executive

So says university professor and columnist John P. Roche, who bases the statement on his experience as a speech writer and advisor to Lyndon B. Johnson.

Harry Truman was right when he said "the buck stops bere." That is, it is the president's obligation to settle policy. From inside, however says Roche, "you rapidly learn that the real problem is to get important decisions where they belong: on the desk in the Oval Office."

Stopping the buck at the top "does not call for displays of courage as much as it does for an efficient espionage apparatus to guarantee that key decisions are not being made by invisible bureaucrats, to make sure the buck does not stop

The armor of this bureaucracy is civil service tenure, provided by Congress to about 98 per cent of the administrative establishment and originally considered a great reform designed to eliminate the spoils system. Roche discovered that he was one of only about 700 members of the housands in the Johnson administration whom the President could summarily fire.

The real hattle in Washington, he claims, is not between the administration and Congress. "It is between the president and a secret alliance of Bill Opposed he legislature and the bureaucracy, who share the common objective of cutting the president

It is almost impossible to exaggerate the ngenuity displayed by the bureaucracy in stonewalling a presidential policy, he says. Take the example of the supply of deadly poisons retained by the CIA in defiance of a presidential

How could the president have found out about it? The CIA director didn't tell him. By getting one of the invisible men down about five layers to squeal on another?

Actually, says Roche, most episodes of this sort surface because of a personal grudge leading to an anonymous tip to a congressman or is expected to be presented in early November.
