James Lowe, a spokesman for the U.S. Department of Labor, has announced that Seminole County will receive sufficient federal funds next year to save jobs of 118 workers and hire an ad-

Lowe came here from Atlanta Tuesday to inform county commissioners that an additional \$1,122,974 has been approved to restock the depleted Title 6 program of the Comprehensive Education and Training Act (CETA).

Last Wednesday, Seminole County officials said they expected from \$700,000 to \$1-million. But with Lowe's announcement, CETA Director Jim Bedsole predicted an additional 60 workers can be hired for

County Commission Chairman Dick Williams said the announcement was a pleasant surprise. Williams said county officials will begin gearing up soon to introduce new programs that will benefit Seminole County and utilize the new workers.

"It is good news," Williams said. "We can use some of that money to pick up current employes whose jobs were slated to expire. The balance of it we can use in self-contained projects." About 118 CETA workers' jobs were to end by Jan.

Earlier this year, Bedsole was notified by Department of Labor Officials that CETA's Title 6 was being phased out. But on Oct. 1, the U.S. Congress appropriated additional funds. And Bedsole was told in Atlanta around the first of this month that Seminole would get either \$1-million, or \$700,000 - depending on whether federal officials used June 30 or Oct. 30 as the date for allocation of Title 6 dollars. On June 30 — the date used by Labor Department officials - more CETA workers were employed under Title 6 than on the Oct. 30 date.

The resignation Tuesday of Public Safety Director Douglas Keller came as a complete surprise to Mayor-elect Gerard Connell.

"I have been considering, since the election, how Chief Keller and I could work

together," said Connell, a councilman now

and elected only a week ago to the chief executive's office. Keller's resignation is to become effective

Jan. 5, 1977, two days after Connell and other officials take office. "I have neither talked to Keller directly or ndirectly nor about him except to my wife and children since the election," Connell said, adding that despite differences with the 50year-old Keller, who took office June 1, 1975, he has not attempted to "harness, muzzle or

In addition, Connell said he has not been in the police station since his arrest by city officers last February. The Connell-Keller relationship has been a

A plea of no contest usually is made to avoid any civil liability but is considered by the courts as a guilty plea.

OPEC Meetings Start, Hike Or Not Big Issue

DOHA, Qatar (AP) — The Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries opened a price-fixing meeting today with only conservative Saudi Arabia, the cartel's biggest producer, opposed to an increase in the price of crude oil.

The Saudi oil minister, Sheik Ahmed Zaki Yamani, said on his arrival in Doha that his country favors postponing the increase for six more months because the world economy is still too shaky. The Saudis previously said they would agree to a "reasonable increase" of less than 10 per cent in the price of \$11.51 for a barrel of benchmark crude.

Glass Found In Cola Bottles

TORONTO (AP) - The federal health ministry says CocaCola probably will have to recall more of its products following new developments at a Thorncliffe bottling plant where glass was found in bottles.

A spokesman said the second recall in less than a week probably will cover all sizes of

Earlier this week, the company recalled 200,000 26-ounce bottles after glass particles were found in one batch.

Kidnap Death Date Set

MADRID, Spain (AP) - The radical left kidnapers of King Juan Carlos' advisor, Antonio Maria de Oriol, have threatened to kill him within a twoday deadline unless their ransom demands are met, a high police sources said today.

The demand, the first since the president of the state council and member of the king's advisory body was abducted four days ago, was made in a note to a Madrid newspaper, the source said. He said the 48-hour countdown begins at midnight.

Bills Filed To Change Florida Election Dates

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - A lot of people have been grumbling about the timing and cost of Florida's elections, and Senate Republican Leader Ken Plante is doing something about it.

Plante filed bills Tuesday to move the state primaries from September to May and the presidential primary from March to May. He said the state could save \$1.5 million by consolidating the presidential primary with the state primary.

Honky-Tonks, Billboards Hit

GAINESVILLE (AP) - Unless Florida takes action soon to preserve its natural beauty, a land planner says tourists will be asking themselves "Why drive down to Florida to see honky-tonks and billboards?" Carl Feiss, professor of urban and regional planning at the University of Florida, said that particular action is needed to preserve the scenic coastal areas.

He foresees land grabbers destroying Florida's natural beauty and threatening its important tourist industry.

"Florida either has to purchase outright its beautiful coastal areas for the scenic value or permit limited but not destructive construction of these naturally beautiful sites, the 69-year-old professor said.

Reubin Askew and, in turn, the legislature to put together next year's budget. If the estimated increase is low, Askew and the legislature must face the dilemma of either cutting back on services or increasing

District Challenge Hinted

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Republican Rep. Curtis Kiser says a court suit will be filed early next year challenging the constitutionality of Florida's multi-member legislative districts.

The suit, which would be filed directly with the Florida Supreme Court in January or eary February, will probably come from a coalition of Republicans and blacks, Kiser said Tuesday.

The two groups have a common interest because both would fare better with singlemember districts as opposed to the many urban multi-member districts now in Florida,


In Airport Explosion

LONDON (AP) - A massive explosion in the main terminal building at the Baghdad, Iraq, international airport reportedly killed six persons and injured between 300 and 400

Marines Losing Their Credibility

The credibility of the U.S. Marine Corps has not been strengthened by the handling of recent disorders at Camp Pendleton in Oceanside, Calif. On Nov. 13, a group of black Marines attacked seven white Marines in housing on the base, beat them with clubs and stabbed them with screwdrivers. Six of the victims were hospitalized. The attackers were arrested. Other Marines have been placed in protective custody, the presence of a

sferred to dilute the influence of the KKK cell. These are significant and potentially explosive events in our tempestuous society. They involve violence, have racial overtones and may raise constitutional questions about private rights. They also could inflict yet another deep wound on the troubled Marine Corps.

It would be totally unfair to suggest that the command at Camp Pendleton is in any way responsible for inviting the initial attack. But it is fair to say that the Marines have done a very poor job in telling us, the people, what happened and what it is all about

For example, it was not until three weeks after the attack occurred that the Marines conceded that the KKK was involved. And the admission did not come until a responsible black leader in San Diego charged in the press that the black Marine attackers had thought they were attacking a KKK meeting. That does not condone the attack, but it does put a different light on things. A prompt disclosure of the fact could have helped the community understand the problem better.

The Corps has been grudging indeed in its presentation of new facts and developments. As a result, the public is confused, suspicious and perhaps willing to suspect the worst. The credibility of the Marine Corps is being eroded with each passing day of metered news releases.

The overwhelming majority of men and women in the Marine Corps are a credit to the United States. The Corps has nothing to fear from an equally overwhelming majority of patriotic civilians. If the Marines at Camp Pendleton are straight-forward about problems, they will have support from the American people. If they are not, they will hurt themselves every time a significant incident occurs at any base.

The fedral government and business have learned the hard way that this is the age of candor. Nobody should have to tell it to the Marines.

A Familiar Story Jimmy Carter's pledge to reorganize government to make it more responsive, more efficient and presumably less costly is

laudable - but hauntingly familiar. We've heard it before. Our skepticism has nothing to do with the president-elect's

gave them life. Carter has indicated a commendable awareness of the Washington climate conducive to bureaucratic growth by laying down strict limits to the budget for the White House staff. He must remain alert to Congress' prediliction to create agencies that overlap or duplicate the work of existing agencies. He must

be wary of the bureaucratic tendency to devise make-work schemes to justify a bureaucratic unit's continued existence. The president-elect is being made aware of the pitfalls on the road to reorganization by his supporters and advisers in

If he is to be successful, he will act quickly during the anticipated honeymoon between a Democratic president and the Democratic majorities in Congress - and before powerful congressional leaders realize that his critical eye may be focused on some of their own pet programs.



Will Labor For Carter?

WASHINGTON (AP) - A heavy year of labor negotiations looms ahead, and forecasters say unions are likely to help President-elect Carter's anti-inflation efforts by keeping wage increases moderate.

The help is more likely to result from economic circumstances rather than any effort on labor's part to kowtow to the new ad-

About five million workers will be affected in major contract talks next year, about the same number as in 1976, which had the heaviest bargaining calendar in three years. A number of key industries will be affected: steel, coal, longshoring, telephone communications, aerospace manufacturing, railroading and

A sharp increase in wage settlements next year exceeding this year's average increases of 8 to 9 per cent in the first contract

year could contribute to worsening inflation. But labor experts say that the lower-than-expected inflation rates of 1976 and a continuation of a relatively high unem-

ployment rate will help keep wage increases moderate. "If the faucet is turned on and inflation heats up, unions will seek protection in the form of higher wages," says W.J. Usery Jr., the outgoing secretary of labor. But he notes that most contracts expiring in 1977 already have cost-of-living escalator clauses that nelp cushion against inflation, and he says this will remove some

Usery and other experts within the Ford administration predict 1977 settlements ranging around this year's 8 per cent level. In 1975, settlements averaged 10 per cent in the first contract year. Because of high unemployment and the threat of new layoffs, ob security is expected to be a major contract goal next year. Some unions are expected to follow the example set by the United Auto Workers this year in winning agreement toward a shorter

work week at full pay. While most forecasts call for generally smooth sailing next

year, there are some storm clouds. Political turbulence within the leadership of the United Mine Workers, mixed with the traditional militancy of the rank-and-file and a set of ambitious bargaining goals make a nationwide coal mine shutdown next December a possibility, according to the

Heavy bargaining in the construction industry begins in April, with talks peaking in June, when 315,000 workers will be under expiring contracts. The industry is still suffering the effects of the recession, with unemployment remaining near 15 per cent, factors that are expected to temper union demands.

\$850,000 Bond OK'd For New Sanford Business

County officials today gave final approval to an \$850,000 bond issue which will allow a telephone repair firm, Phoneserve, Inc., to locate in Sanford.

County officials said they will initially employ about 35 workers at a site in Industrial Park near Interstate 4 and SR 46. The industrial bonds were approved at a

Seminole County Industrial Development Authority (SCIDA) board meeting this morning at the Seminole County Courthouse. "We're pleased that we're going to get to do

Daniel said two California underwriters have agreed to purchase the bonds for re-sale. Also, Phoneserve's corporate officers have pledged \$255,000 in operating and start-up

The California-based underwriters are J. A. Overton and Co., and Eldridge and Co. In the event Phoneserve proved unsuccessful, the county would not be obligated to repay the bondholders, it was explained. The two underwriters would bear that burden.

SCIDA chairman Eugene Mooney said county officials have done all they can to insure the success of the new venture. Mooney

called the market for the Phoneserve product

Phoneserve secretary Frank Proctor said he anticipates handling one-half-milliondollars worth of business the first year. The firm is scheduled to begin operation in

The second year, Parker, said, Phoneserve plans to double the output. Phoneserve will use Sanford as its home base for operations in Florida, in Georgia, and Alabama. The firm repairs old telephones for independent phone companies and others.

Proctor and Daniel both said future plans include expansion of the present facilities to allow the manufacture of more sophisticated communications equipment.

Daniel said Phoneserve will not be exempt from county land taxes. However, the SCIDA director said the firm under federal law will be exempt from paying federal income tax on

SCIDA first announced the telephone's firm's intentions to start a business here in October. At that time, however, the SCIDA board held up operations until the underwriters agreed to purchase the bonds.
