Iranians Deride U.S. For Jailing Countrymen

By United Press International Iran's President Abolhassan Bani-Sadr charged the United States with deliberately prolonging the ninemonth hostage crisis by jailing 192 Iranians and called on the prisoners to resist deportation to the point "that they have to drag you into the planes."

The speaker of Iran's parliament announced Monday that because of alleged mistreatment to the Iranians the assembly was postponing its debate on the fate of the 52 hostages. He said the Americans, held for 271 days, should be put on trial to show the United States

"we are not scared." Iran, charging the Iranians arrested during a violent July 27 demonstration in Washington were "subjected to the most brutal assaults," officially appealed to the United Nations to appoint a delegation to visit the

The 192 Iranians are now held in federal prisons in New York. Many of them are on a hunger strike and refuse to identify themselves.

U.S. and prison officials denied the Iranians were mistreated and State Department spokesman John Trattner said Washington welcomed a U.N. inquiry into the prisoners' treatment.

Italians Arrest Extremists

BOLOGNA, Italy (UPI) - Police rounded up rightwing extremists in 20 cities in a nationwide manhunt for the terrorists who bombed Bologna's railroad station, killing at least 77 people and injuring nearly

Scores of far-right activists and neo-Fascist sympathizers were arrested in the dragnet, but the Interior Ministry declined to disclose any details of the raids, which took place at dawn Monday.

Anti-terrorist police said they believed neo-Fascists were behind Saturday's attack, because the rightist neo-Fascist groups were responsible for similar bombing in the past and because Bologna is a stronghold of the Italian Inlet.

Rebels Report Kabul Attacks

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) - Hit-and-run attacks on Soviet and Afghan officials coupled with warring between rival factions of the ruling Communist Party have claimed nearly 100 lives in the past week in Kabul, reports from the city said today.

Shipyard Cancer Rate High JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (UPI)-A Florida study has corroborated the results of previous studies in Georgia and Virginia showing a higher-than-average lung cancer rate among shipyard workers, especially if employed during World War II.

The National Cancer Institute-sponsored study of Jacksonville shipyard workers also shows that smokers among the workers are most suceptible to cancer and spouses of workers experienced a surprisingly high lung cancer rate. Preliminary results of the study, which involved

interviews of 447 Jacksonville residents and research into the histories of 185 deceased cancer patients, were released Monday.

Documentary Dynamite

When seven law-enforcement officials invaded the news offices of Boise, Idaho, television station, KRCI-TV, and ransacked files and seized videotapes of a riot at Idaho State Penitentiary a few days earlier the station recorded it all on film.

That film is documentary dynamite.

The spectacle of the police plundering a newsroom for information is the most powerful kind of indictment of the U.S. Supreme Court's unconscionable decision in the Stanford case that legalized such surprise searches and seizures. The electronic immediacy of this desecration of First Amendment rights, heretofore inviolate until the Burger Court decree, smacks of state fertility front is that women are still having oppression ordinarily associated with totalitarian more bables than they want but birthrates are

All Americans who view the televised police raid in Boise are provided a warning more vivid than that sounded by any dissenting court, associate justice, or newspaper editorial. It proclaims that the confidential records of doctors, their child-bearing, marital status and lawyers, clergy, and average citizen are as vulnerable to snooping police officials as those of

What happened in Boise is the latest and most chilling example of how the U.S. Supreme Court, which has traditionally been the guardian of constitutional freedoms, has, through legal sophistry, become the most dangerous instrument for denying these rights.

Those who mistakenly argue that lawenforcement agencies need the new powers granted them by the Supreme Court because of an uncooperative citizenry forget the authorities have always had effective investigative authority

Inasmuch as the Boise TV station had a policy of complying with subpoenas, the question is why the prosecuting attorney didn't follow the subpoena route, why he obtained a search warrant and pounced less than 48 hours later, knowing this unusually swift action would deprive the station of time in which to mount a legal defense, as indeed


The answer is clear enough. A subpoena would have permitted the station its day in court to try and defend its unused video-tapes, which it argued contained confidential information. A judge, not a magistrate issuing a search warrant, would have decided the merits. The Boise prosecutor simply didn't want to bother with the niceties of the station's First and Fourth Amendment rights and, thanks to the Burger court, didn't have to. But in taking the short-cut route of search and seize, the prosecutor converted his police into storm troopers and, moreover, forced the TV station to become an

arm of his own law enforcement by sweeping

aside its rights under normal legal review. When the Burger court overturned the rulings of two lower courts in the now-famous Zurcher V. Stanford Daily case, and decided lawenforcement officers may search a newspaper office for information they think may be there, it compromised the confidentiality of media sources, laid open the files of the American people to surprise search and seizure, and, as well, made the reporter or average citizen an involuntary

It is true the Boise episode is believed to be only the second application of the Stanford decision to a news-related organization. One other during two years since the Stanford ruling was the police search last month of the Flint, Michigan, Voice, a small muckraking newspaper. This was done to obtain an advance copy of an article criticizing Flint's mayor. Moreover, last year — as proof the press' defeat in the Stanford case was everyone's defeat — agents of the California attorney general's office raided a Beverly Hills law firm to seize documents in a Medi-Cal investigation.

The quick, easy payoff for the Boise prosecutor may tempt other prosecutors around the country to follow suit. But we believe there's a good chance the Boise affair will strengthen rather than weaken defense of the First and Fourth

Auto-Train Gets Furniture, But Financial Woes Remain



Auto-Train offices in Sanford had their furniture back Tuesday, about 30 minutes after it was seized by court order to satisfy a \$20,000 personal injury judgment against the company, according to Auto-Train spokesmen in Washington.

Although the \$20,000 was paid almost immediately, the incident was only one of several recently that

brought attention to the financial difficulties of Auto-

Friday, Auto-Train employees protested they were having difficulty getting their paychecks cashed locally. Because checks from June 15 and July 1 payments until the checks clear, usually about 10 days. And in June, the company was forced to halt trading in its stock while arrangements were made to settle a lawsuit brought because it was behind in lease payments on locomotives. Stock trading has since been resumed, but the dispute has not been finally settled. Although an Auto-Train spokesman at the corporate headquarters in Washington D.C. said the problem with employee paychecks has been cleared up, he admitted

the company is heavily in debt. "But I see a bright future for Auto-Train," said the company's Senior Vice President and Chief of Operations Dick Goldstein. "It's been in existence nearly ten years and it's been a fairly good employer and I think it can be even a better employer." Goldstein mentioned two programs for financing and a stock sale that is expected to net the company almost

\$10 million to help pay off its debts and get back on its insequence of its deregulation.

The troubles lasted through March of 1979, Goldstein

added, but Auto-Train managed to reverse the trend by pricing themselves competitively with the airlines while the airlines felt the impact of fuel shortages and

"We made a profit of \$639,000 in the first quarter of 1980," Goldstein said, "but the company is still in a tight cash position. Current operating receipts are going both to cover arrearges and current operating expenditures.

Goldstein further explained that the company's tight cash position coupled with "unilateral changes in banking procedures without advance notice" resulted in the returned paychecks June 15 and July 1. Problems on those dates contributed to the problem

Continental charged that Auto-Train was behind on lease payments for locomotives and failed to maintain A spokesman for Auto-Train said trading resumed in

Auto-Train stock after the company offered Continental a \$400,000 irrevocable letter of credit which it can draw on to pay existing debts and future lease paymen But Goldstein said Continental has not yet accepted the letter of credit, although Auto-Train is negotiating with them and paying them on a continuing basis.


