

Jones Faces Tough Going In First Rounds Of Golf Tourney At Pebble Beach

PEBBLE BEACH, Delmont, Cal., Sept. 4.—Lead will fall in great profusion today under the pitiless guillotine that operates as an 18-hole match play round in the national amateur golf championship. They will be human heads, perhaps regret heads, for even Robert T. Jones Jr., the fool-proof golfer of the ages, is not immune to this galling consumption type of competition in the first two rounds of the championship and by nightfall, it is possible that Jones may be merely a name that you find in the city directory.

The 18-hole match is the only thing in its construction with human heads for which Jones has the slightest respect. He knows he will qualify. He is reasonably certain of winning any 36-hole match that when they play the thing on the basis of a 4 1/2 minute rest, the automation is revealed for what it really is: a human being (and all who is subject to the tears and feelings of ordinary men). Jones frankly looks upon those matches with distaste and if he wins the first of these the morning, he will face another, this afternoon.

In the former, he will play John Goodman, of Lincoln, former trans-Mississippi champion, and every inch a golfer. This match will begin at 10:30 a.m. and end about 12:30 and every minute of the event won't seem any longer than a week to the champion. And he returns by this morning, last year, in 1935, he only beat Dick Jones at the first round by a win on the final hole in 1927. Maurice McCarty had him 2 down with a few holes to go, leaving Jones to win the final green, last year, by a hole. R. H. Gordon edged the cup with what would have been the winning putt on the eighteenth, the pair playing an extra hole before Jones won.

The second round of 18 holes in the afternoon usually is a more complicated matter to the great one and this time it may have to be for if Jones, Lewis Goodman, will be matched by the winner of the 18-hole first round, and at least one of these, today, is one of the better players of the age.

Although the two rounds today figure to determine definitely whether this championship is to be another first day for Jones or not, the 18-hole first round is not usually found around the nineteenth hole. There were 22 left in the field after Edith Held has won a bye-off for the last quadruple flying place from Francis Brock, Don Armstrong and C. A. Gris, who had yesterday afternoon.

In considering the banking situation throughout the country, the fact should be kept in mind that while one bank in ten failed during the past eight years, it is far more important that nine banks out of ten, operating in the same general field, serving the same communities and meeting almost identically the same problems, weathered the economic storm of readjustment successfully. This achievement cannot be ascribed to any element of luck, but rather to consistent adherence to sound banking principles and profitable practices. Through worthy and efficient management they met the issues and problems confronting them, squarely and successfully.

Banking is regarded as the keystone of our entire business structure, hence bank failures are rightly and justly considered as calamities that most absolutely be prevented. The three major objectives of all inter-bank organizations, whether local, county, district, state or national, are to make banking safer for all concerned and, through increased efficiency in bank management and supervision, to lessen or eliminate all forms of losses so that greater rewards may accrue to banking and better service to the public. There is definite evidence throughout the country of a strong and growing spirit of cooperation among bankers and banking organizations, which is resulting more and more in strengthening the work of all.

Clearinghouse associations among banks in city, county or district groups undoubtedly constitute the chief line of defense against bad banking practices. They have demonstrated that they are the principal factor in bringing about reform in banking regulations, improvement in banking methods and the observance of sound banking principles.
