

School Critic

A British teacher, in this country as part of an exchange program, was asked for a frank expression of her opinion of American schools. After years of experience teaching in England, India, and Australia, she says that American students are rude and undisciplined to a degree she would not have believed possible. She even likened a study hall in one school to an English pub.

Many critics of our schools will feel some sympathy for this British woman. Subservience to authority is a trait which is not cultivated here, and one who has been accustomed to it in other countries would be bound to feel a great lack. Then, too, the influence of the progressive school has made itself felt in the great freedom of action which American students take for granted.

There is, however, much to be said for the American system. It has bred a race of youngsters who are frank and open in their relations with each other and with their parents and teachers, who are candid in their disapproval of religious prejudices and kindred evils, and who are enterprising and even aggressive in their willingness to tackle problems which have been too much for their elders.

The purpose of a teacher exchange program will be well served if the British teacher is able to impose upon some of her American students at least a dim idea of the courtesy and conformity of the British school-child, and on the other hand if the American teachers in Great Britain can encourage English students in the direction of greater initiative.

At present 90 percent of the DPs, (displaced persons) are in the American zone of Germany. They include Latvians, Lithuanians, Ukranians, Poles Yugoslavs, Estonians, many of them Jewish, largely "slave" laborers" uprooted to work for the Nazis. Russia and Poland wanted their nationals forcibly returned. The UN voted this down.

The plan is to transport, settle and support the DP: for three months in their new homes. Traitors, war criminals, quislings and non-working able-bodied people will be barred. The cost will be more than 160 million dollars, half to be born by the United States. Australia, Brazil and Canada have indicated their desire to receive some of these refugees. Other nations, including probably, this one, will adjust immigration quotas to admit some. At best only 12,000 can be resettled in 1917.

Harriman "Talk;" Denied, Widens War-State Breach

Representative Dewey Next International Bank Chief?

· WASHINGTON-Efforts aimed at creating a better understanding of world affairs in both the war and state departments have run into trouble because of gossip.

A sharp fight is going on as result of the recent publication of a report that Commerce Secretary W. Averell Har-riman told a group at the Army War college that Moscow bigwigs believe war with the westernpowers is inevitable.

Harriman later denied the report, but its publication caused a furore in the war department. The report emanated from a state department employe who confessed that he had told it confidentially to a foreign press representative with the understanding it was not to be printed.

The Army was so incensed that it barred state department people for a time from War college briefings. Later they were allowed back in reduced numbers. Meantime, state department employes have

been tracking down published news stories involving state department policy which they say only could have come from war department sources.

. A GROUP OF GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL EXPERTS are booming former Congressman Charles Dewey (R) of Illinois to succeed Eugene Meyer as head of the International bank.

They feel that Dewey, a Republican, would have no trouble with






