### ·U. S. Jets Bomb Reds On Saigon Outskirts

SAIGON. South Viet Nav (AP) - U.S. fliers bombed and strafed an infiltrating guerrilla band practically on the outskirts of Saigon tonight. The dazzling yellow light of parachute flares outlined the city's buildings and reverberations from the explosions jolted the downtown area. Jets and helicopters joined the attack on the Viet Cong. who were reported probing along a canal which is the capital's southern boundary. The Communists want to wreck the election Sunday of a constituent assembly and their efforts have centered largely in the Saigon area, which has about a quarter of South Viet Nam's population. The strength of the attackers was not determined. But Vietnamese police sources said about 30 crossed the canal and went into hiding in the 4th Precinct - an area of houseboats, shanties and slum dwellings. South Vietnamese infantrymen reported they killed 150 main force Viet Cong troops in a fierce battle in the central low-
