Rap Headstart For Sabotaging Schools

John Evans, school board vice chairman Thursday blamed federal education programs such as Headstart, Vista Job Corps and others for "sabotaging" the public school system by siphoning off 6-7 per cent of the country's qualified teachers.

Evans cited a report in the Wall Street Journal that some schools in certain parts of the nation have had to be closed and pupils transported elsewhere because "teachers' salaries were not available."

It was noted that more than 100,000 teachers have gone into the federal programs, overseas programs and in the case of young male teachers, the draft.

Frank Gore, supervisor of the public school system, reported that as of Thursday the county is short seven instructors.

Two examples were given which showed conditions of \$7,500 federal teacher salaries compared to \$4,000 public school salary and a New York program where the federal salaried teacher made \$212 weekly compared to \$150 weekly for the public school teacher.
